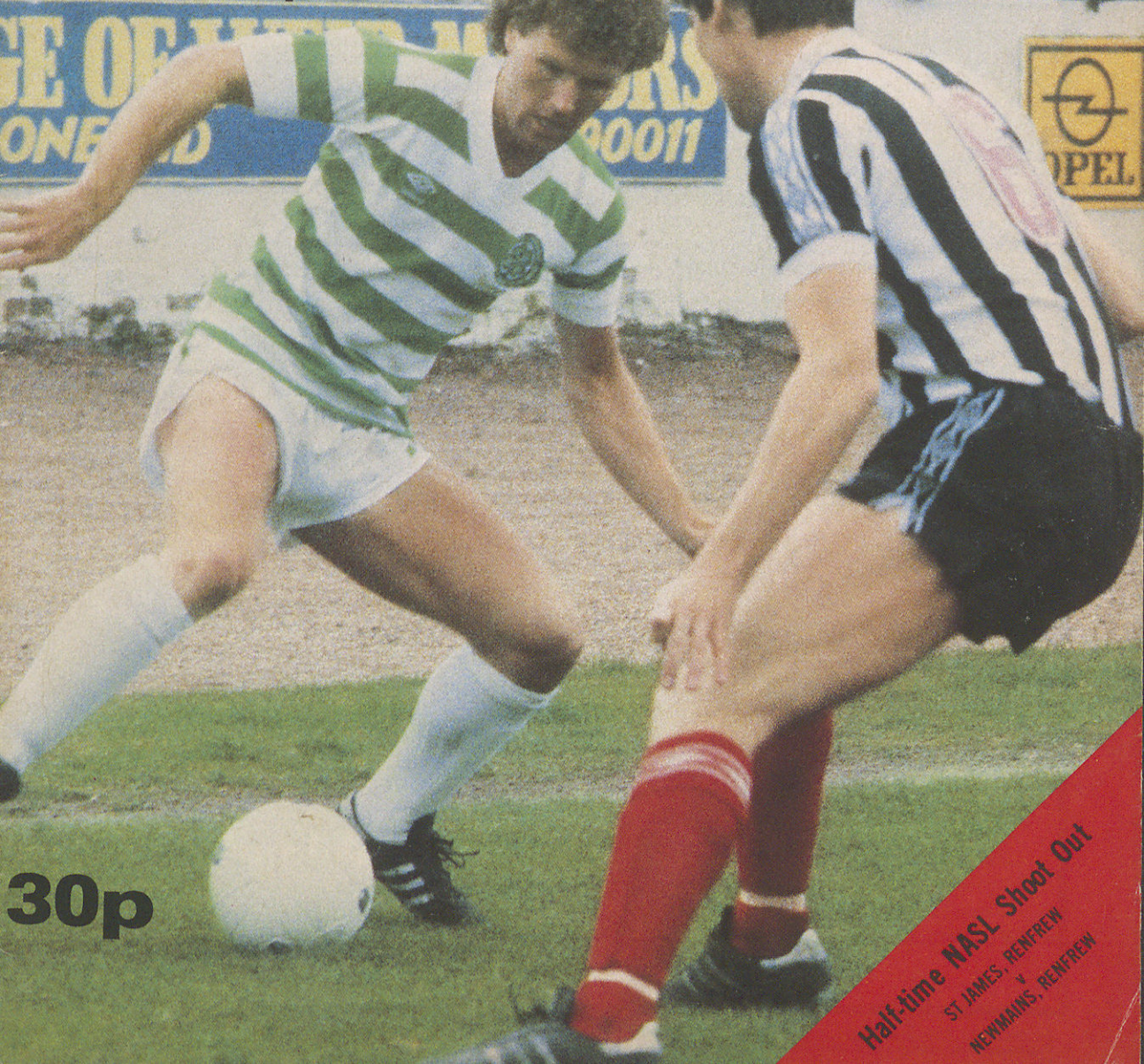

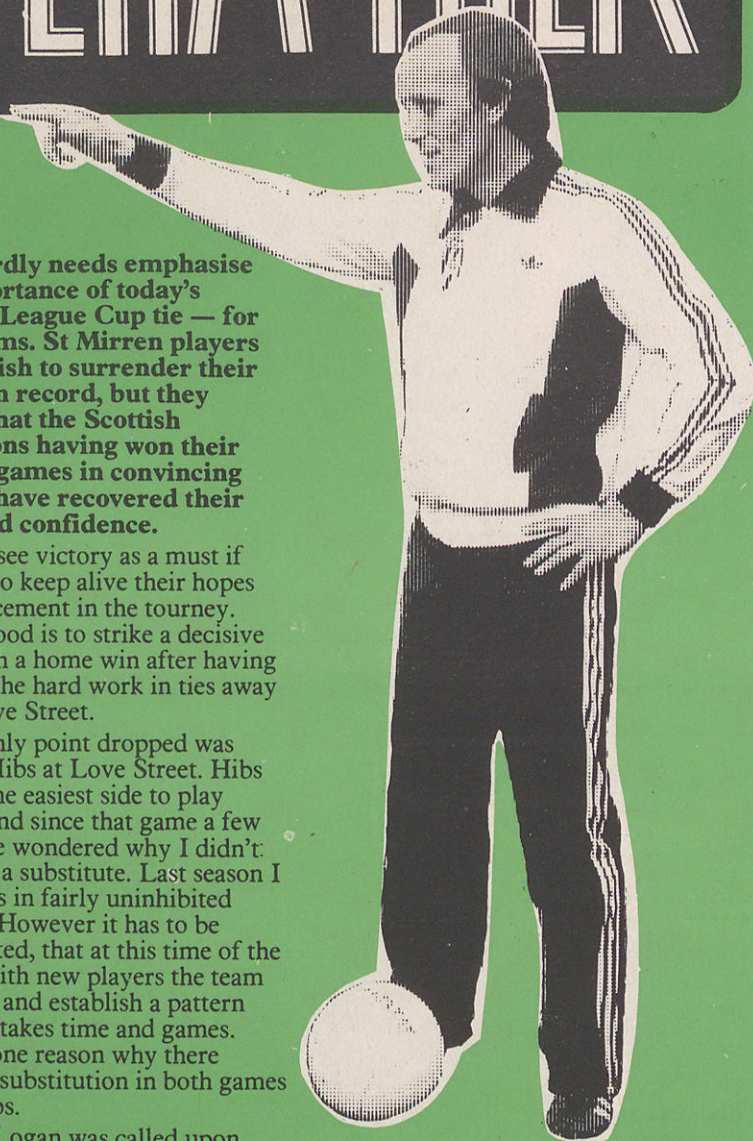

ONE hardly needs emphasise the importance of today's Scottish League Cup tie — for both teams. Love Street welcomes

CELTIC

CELTIC are never more dangerous than when the chips are down. A poor start to the League Cup campaign has left them with it all to do. They've got to win their last two qualifying games . . . and hope.

Certainly manager Billy McNeill will have them ready to go at jet pace for 90 minutes and the Paisley public could have their first look at 18-year-old Davie Moyes who stood in for the injured Tom McAdam in midweek.

Moyes, captain of Scotland's youth side is one of the many talented young men who are posed to break through to senior teams with several Premier League sides.

Roy Aitken — Roy now looks settled as a back four player after several seasons in midfield. A first team regular since making his debut as a 16-year-old schoolboy. Has Scottish caps from youth level, under-21 level and senior level.

Pat Bonner — Had a wonderful 1980-81 season playing in all Celtic's league matches and earning a place in the Republic of Ireland's World Cup squad and then in the summer won his first full cap. Undoubtedly a natural goalkeeper of great promise.

Tommy Burns — A Celtic Boys' Club player at one time he is an exceptionally skilled midfielder player. Had his best season last time round and got his first international cap against Northern Ireland as just reward.

Mike Conroy — Athletically built Mike is surpris-

ingly strong in the tackle as well as being fast. Can play equally well in midfield or as a sweeper. Signed from junior football and made his debut in 1977-78 season thus emulating his father who also played for Celtic.

Tom McAdam — Went off the boil a little after a fabulous 1979-80 season when he played a sweeper role. A very skilful player on the ground as well as his heading ability which helps Tom grab more than his fair share of goals as a defender.

George McCluskey — As one of three goalscorers he continually has to fight for his first team place. A naturally talented player who would walk into most other sides George has under-21 and under-23 caps. A Celtic Boys' Club protégé signed up in 1974.

Frank McGarvey — The most expensive 'Celt' signed from Liverpool in 1980. Started slowly at Parkhead but the confidence and form returned last season as Frank scored 29 goals. Must now look to win international recognition once again.

Danny McGrain — The captain of Celtic, he has been with the club since 1968. Probably Scotland's only genuine world class player at the moment, his career is even more remarkable due to two very serious injuries which Danny has had to overcome. Captained Scotland to victory at Wembley

Murdo MacLeod — The strong man of Celtic's midfield missed most of last season due to injury but started this one with a bang by giving Celtic victory over Dukla Prague with two goals in an invitation tournament. Bought in 1978 from Dumbarton Murdo has won under-21 caps.

Charlie Nicholas — Came from Celtic Boys' Club in 1979 and was voted Young Player of the Year last season after scoring 28 goals in his first full season. Still only 19 he is probably one of the most potentially complete players in British football.

Davie Provan — It doesn't seem like only three years since Provan came to Celtic from Kilmarnock. The scarcest of all footballers, a gifted winger and on his day as near as nigh unstoppable.

Mark Reid — Had his first full season in 1980-81 and earned a League winners' medal for his efforts. Not the fastest full-back he makes up with excellent reading of the game and the timing and strength of his tackles.

Dom Sullivan — Came to Celtic two years ago from Aberdeen but because of injury has only had one full season. A clever runner off the ball as well as on it and a pretty lethal shot has given Dom a few goals from the midfield.

Elsewhere...

WHEN we made our debut as forecasters we emphasised that it was a most difficult craft. Nevertheless we achieved a 50 per cent success then and that emboldens us to continue with our prognostications.

We are on a sure thing when we say with confidence that St Mirren will top Section 1 this evening and very possibly with a decisive margin of points. In the other game St Johnstone should win over Hibs.

Rangers and Morton decide Section 2 at Ibrox this afternoon. Both have seven points and Rangers have the advantage in goal difference should the game be drawn. Rangers get the vote.

Aberdeen can maintain their lead in Section 3 at Kilmarnock and Hearts can keep close to them by winning over Airdrie.



Dundee United can sew up Section 4 at Tannadice against Ayr United and take another step towards their ambition of three League Cup successes in a row.

Section 5 looks like going to the last game with Brechin, Cowdenbeath and Queen of the South all in with a chance.

Falkirk and Forfar are the favourites in Section 6 and Queen's Park look good as Section 7 winners.

Dunfermline and Hamilton have a decisive meeting at East End Park this afternoon and in the six-team Section 9 Arbroath are already through.

WRITE TO THE REF...

Jim Walker of Foxbar asks: *What procedure is carried out by a referee when a player is cautioned?*

Scottish team boss Jock Stein . . . must have been impressed by the sheer professionalism of Saints.



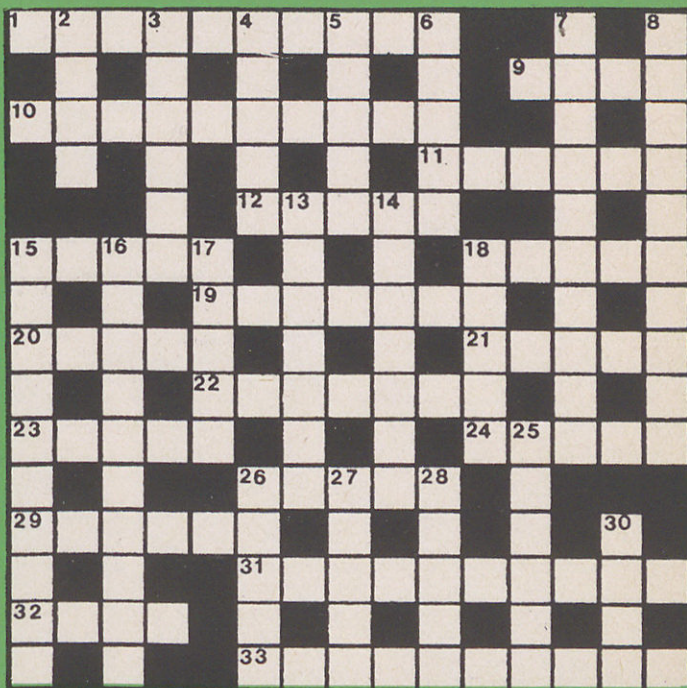

IAN ARCHER'S World Cup Memories

A 26-part serialisation of Ian's memories of Munich '74.

PART 2

TWO years later, on the attainment of my majority and through the courtesy of an Uncle's five-pound note, that interest hardened to addiction. I reached Wembley sober, the last time the nerve has permitted such a luxury, and Scotland beat England 2-1.

They, the people who decant on to overnight trains, wobble to Wembley, throw whisky into empty stomachs and fall down six of those steep terracing steps at a time, continue to say it was Jim Baxter's match.

He shuffled past Armfield for the first and soft-footed a penalty for the second goal but for all



that, it wasn't his game. It was Davie Wilson's. Pressed into full back service after Smith's tackle had broken Eric Caldow's leg, he was magnificent. (Years later, I gave him a lift from Edinburgh to Glasgow

and was too shy to ask about it — and why, when grown men meet a footballer do they gaze in awe, stammer with embarrassment and then steal off to share with others the secret of close, real, proximity to a hero?)

So I was 21 and nowhere to go, except Ibrox the occasional Saturday to watch Baxter, who could dance on eggshells and make the ball laugh, tease like a toreador and who once, in his early Rangers days, caused the subway to be stopped outside Copland Road. 'That yin couldnae tackle a plate of mince and tatties' said one who had not been initiated into the mysteries of Baxter's vision of his craft.

It was 1959, I had just turned 19, and I was about to face what many think was the best forward line the world has ever seen.

Denmark were playing the reigning World Champions, Brazil. The silky smooth seniors from Rio had lifted the original cup, the Jules Rimet Trophy, the previous year, defeating host nation Sweden in the final.

The Copenhagen crowd had plenty to shout about by the end of the game but perhaps the biggest roar of the night went up when we had the nerve to open the scoring.

Although we lost 4-3 in the end, we were the first side in a long time to get that close to this 'wonder team'. Pele (2), Didi and Vava all scored against me that night but at the end I really felt I had done well to keep it to four . . . they were so very, very good.

Their team that night was: Gilmar; Nelson Santos and Jalma Santos; Zito, Belini and Orlando; Garrincha and Didi; Vava; Pele and Mario Zagalo.

Zagalo later became team manager and Garrincha, nicknamed "The Little Bird", was famous for wearing two right boots every time he played.

Such was the magic of that Brazilian team that while I can name them all, and recall their faces, I don't think I could tell you who else played for Denmark that night.

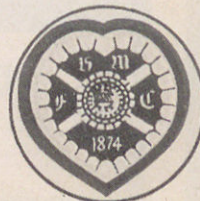

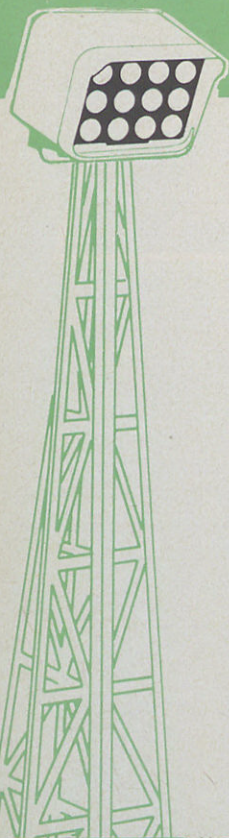
THIS TIME LAST YEAR
