WELCOME to CELTIC

We have still to take a League point off Celtic this season and hope tonight's match will give us the opportunity.

We beat them 2-0 in the League Cup but on December 6 a goal by Dixie Deans in the 78th minute was enough to beat us.

Celtic are out of the honours this season but no one can doubt that they are still one of the most attractive sides in Scotland and always welcome visitors to Tynecastle.

As usual we look for the exciting touches of Kenny Dalglish who can set any game alight with his devastating runs. More's the pity there are not more players of his ability about.

Johnny Doyle is expected to make his first appearance at the ground since being transferred from Ayr United. We know him as a dangerous winger in his Somerset days and I am sure the green and white jersey will only add to his touch.

And with those two veterans Bobby Lennox and Deans about and always on the prowl for goals it isn't going to be an easy stroll for Hearts defence.

Jacky McNamara, Pat McCluskey and Tommy Burns are three young players who are proving to be in the Parkhead mould and we can expect greater things from them in the following seasons.

At the back is Danny McGrain reckoned one of the best defenders in Britain at the moment. Swift into the tackle he can set up attacks and is always prepared to back them up.

Johannes Edvaldsson and Roy Aitken have set up a fine understanding in the centre-back area. Edvaldsson is big and strong—a great player in any position and we are sure to see plenty of him in the seasons to come. Aitken has been a real find this term and with great years ahead of him we welcome him to Tynecastle.

On the other flank is Andy Lynch, remember for his seasons on the left wing at Tynecastle before his transfer west. Like McGrain he likes to get in right behind his attack.

And, of course, if our attack gets through there is always Peter Latchford in goal and not one of the easiest of goalkeepers to beat.

With players like George McCluskey, Tommy Callachan, Ronnie Glavin and Paul Wilson to call upon Celtic appear to be well covered with riches.

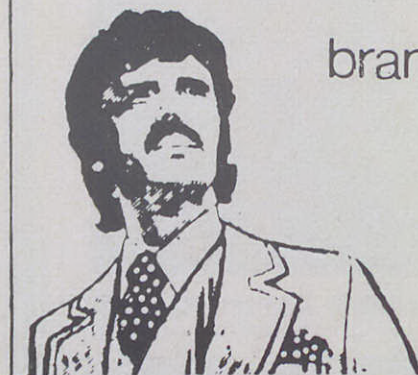

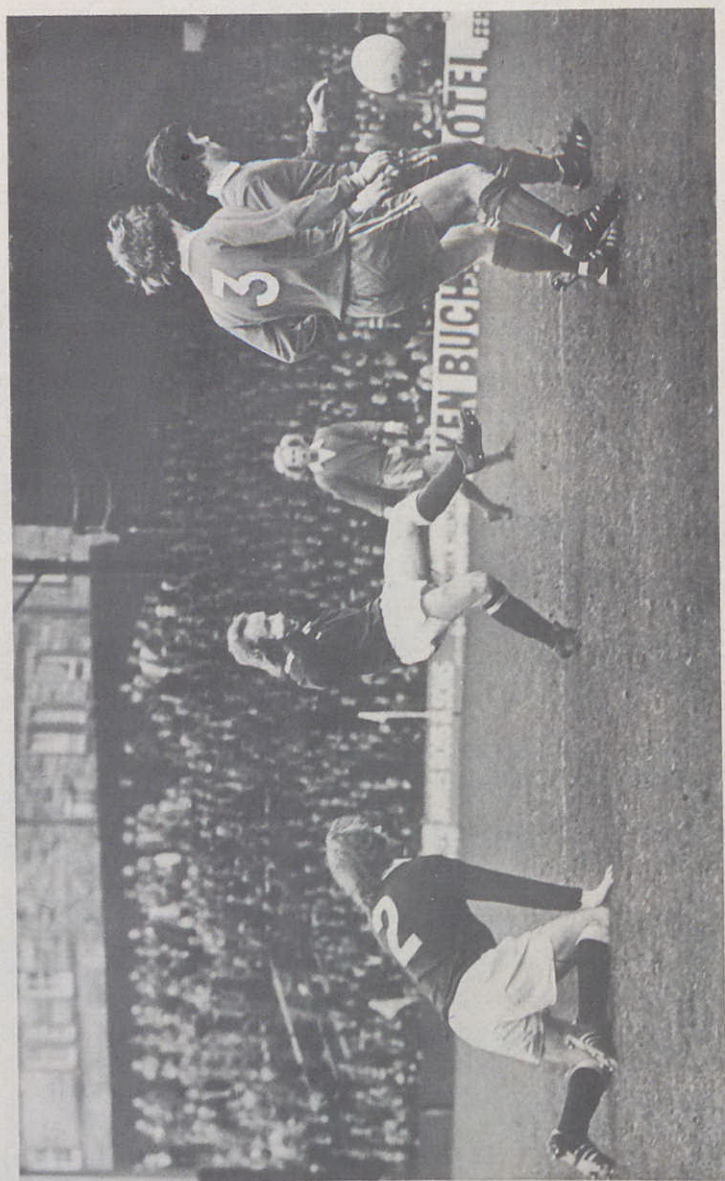
