After extra time in our UEFA Cup tie, I was worried that there might be an adverse reaction for our last match, away to Dundee United.

Colin Meldrum had another good game, defensively we rarely let United in behind us, and with Ian Durrant rapidly regaining full match fitness we looked solid in midfield. The Reykjavik and Dundee United results are something that we'll be looking forward to building on over the next few weeks.

Our last gasp win over Reykjavik showed just what can be achieved if you fight on right to the final whistle. John has been a good squad player, but we couldn't guarantee him regular first team football, and he felt that he was at a stage in his career where he needed to be playing every week. He did well at Falkirk in his loan spell there last season, and I'm sure that he'll make a success of things at Brockville.

Unfortunately tonight's match means that I'll have to miss the chance of watching Kaiserslautern play Werder

Bremen this evening. I have, however, arranged for videos of their recent matches, and our contacts in Germany have been keeping us up to date on their current form.

All that, is for the future though, because tonight we face another big match. The visit of Celtic to Rugby Park means that we'll have to be at our best if we want a confidence boosting result. Bear with us, we're working hard to find the form that took us so high last season, but your continued support is vital!

The visitors to Kilmarnock for this evenings Bank of Scotland Scottish Premier League fixture are Celtic FC. We welcome the players, management, directors and supporters of the club from Glasgow's East End to Rugby Park. May we also welcome everyone connected with Sky TV, as the game this evening will be televised live by Sky.

Last season, Celtic finished runners-up to Rangers in the S.P.L. and Scottish F.A. Cup, as their city rivals went on to complete the domestic treble in Scotland for the sixth time. It was particularly annoying for the Celts, not just because of Rangers success, but mainly because, after a stuttering start to the campaign, Celtic went on to play just as well, if not better than they had in the 1997-98 season, when they won the Premier Division title and Coca Cola Scottish League Cup.

The new managing director of the club, Allan McDonald, was a busy man during the summer months. He appointed Kenny Dalglish to the post of director of football at the club. Former head coach, Dr Jozef

Venglos became the club's chief European scout, with his place being taken by John Barnes, the former Watford, Liverpool, Newcastle United, Charlton Athletic and England star. Eric Black remained as an assistant coach, whilst another ex-Liverpool and Newcastle United player, Terry McDermott, was brought in as an assistant coach as well.

These changes led to an inevitable influx of new signings. Olivier Tebily (from Sheffield United), Bobby Peta (Ipswich Town) and Dmitri Kharine (Chelsea) were brought from down South, as was Israeli international, Eyal Berkovic (West Ham United). The signing of Berkovic for £5.75 million created not only a club record but also a Scottish record for a transfer to a Scottish club. Another major signing was Bulgarian Stilian Petrov (C.S.K.A. Sofia), who had to wait over six weeks before being given a work permit.

The additions to a squad which already boasted players such as Henrik Larsson, Mark Viduka, Lubomir

Moravcik and established Scottish stars like Paul Lambert and Craig Burley has already shortened the odds on Celtic being able to prize the trophies from Rangers this season. The squad, made up from players from some 14 different countries have been impressive to date, apart from a 2-1 loss to Dundee United at Tannadice. Basic errors cost them dearly that Sunday afternoon, but coach John Barnes looks to have the makings of a squad capable of challenging Rangers all the way this season.

Games between Killie and Celtic at Rugby Park have been close fought affairs over the past few years. They have been highly exciting encounters, even though, on occasions, there have been a scarcity of goals. Both clubs will be looking to take the points at stake, and boost their League positions and their confidences for the midweek encounters they both fare in the U.E.F.A. Cup.

Killie travel to Germany to meet Kaiserslautern, whilst Celtic face Hapoel Tel-Aviv (Israel) at Celtic Park. We

wish them both well for the midweek games in Europe, and hopefully both Rangers (at Valencia) and St. Johnstone (in Monaco) will return with favourable scorelines.

- 1. Johnathan Gould (GK)** - Born 18/7/69 Paddington. Signed in 1997 from Bradford City, this tall, well built keeper has held off the challenges to retain the first choice tag at the club. The son of former Welsh boss Bobby Gould is a regular squad member with Scotland. A Scottish "B" internationalist, he has also served Gillingham (on loan), Coventry City, WBA, Halifax Town and Clevedon Town.
- 2. Tom Boyd (Def)** - Born 24/11/65 Glasgow. Signed in '92 from Chelsea, he is the longest serving player at the club. The club captain, he is a composed defender who is comfortable in any position in the defence. Absent in recent games, this Scottish U21, "B" and full internationalist has previously served Well. Product of Celtic BC.
- 3. Stephane Mahe (Def)** - Born 23/9/68 Puteaux, France. Signed in 1997 from Rennes (France), this tall, long striding full back is a capable performer. His pacy, wide runs on the wing can cause problems, especially when he ventures close to the opposition penalty box. A French "B" internationalist, he has also served Paris St Germain and AJ Auxerre (France).
- 4. Jackie McNamara (Def/Mid)** - Born 24/10/73 Glasgow. Signed in 1995 from Dunfermline Athletic, he has returned to action recently after injury problems last season. Whether used at full back or in midfield, his tricky and fast raiding wide runs can create trouble to the opposition. A Scottish U21, "B" and full internationalist, his clever play made him an important member of the squad.
- 5. Marc Rieper (Def)** - Born 5/6/69 Copenhagen, Denmark. Signed in 1997 from West Ham United. A tall, commanding centre back, injury has threatened to end his career, but he has fought back bravely and is on the road to recovery. A Danish internationalist, he previously served IF Brøndby and AGF Aarhus (both Denmark).
- 6. Alan Stubbs (Def)** - Born 6/10/71 Kirkby. Signed in 1996 from Bolton Wanderers, he has bravely fought back from a serious illness which was detected during the summer. A steady, influential defender, his quick return to action after surgery was a bonus for the club. An English "B" internationalist he had been with Bolton since leaving school.
- 7. Henrik Larsson (Forward)** - Born 20/9/71 Helsingborg, Sweden. Signed in 1997 from Feyenoord (Holland), he was the SPL top scorer last season and was voted the Player of the Year in Scotland. A classy striker, his pacy, skillful play makes him a constant danger. A Swedish internationalist, he has also served Helsingborgs BK and Hogaburg BK (both Sweden).
- 8. Craig Burley (Mid)** - Born 24/9/71 Ayr. Signed in 1997 from Chelsea, this creative schemer missed a good part of last season through injury. A threat to defences with his late runs and powerful shooting, form midfielder. A Scottish U21 and full internationalist, he had been at Chelsea since leaving school.
- 9. Harald Brattbakk (Forward)** - Born 1/2/71 Trondheim, Norway. Signed in 1997 from Rosenborg BK (Norway), with whom he had been a prolific scorer. A sharp, pacy front runner, he has struggled to maintain that scoring form with Celtic. An U21 and full internationalist, he spent 7 years with his home town team Rosenborg, during which time he had a loan spell at Bodo Glimt (Norway).
- 10. Eyal Berkovic (Mid)** - Born 2/4/72 Haifa, Israel. Signed this summer from West Ham United, for a record Scottish fee of £5.75 million. A pacy, sharp schemer with excellent skills on the ball, he is also capable of scoring goals as well as creating them. An Israeli internationalist, he has also served Southampton and Maccabi Haifa (Israel).
- 11. Morten Wieghorst (Mid)** - Born 25/2/71 Glostrup, Denmark. Signed in 1995 from Dundee, he has returned to action after missing a great deal of last season through injury. A tall, deceptive midfielder, his strong runs at defences create chances. A Danish U21 and full internationalist, he previously served Lyngby BK (Denmark).
- 12. Tommy Johnson (Forward)** - Born 15/1/71 Newcastle. Signed in '97 from Aston Villa, he is now having his first lengthy, injury free spell since joining the club. Dogged by a injuries over the past two years, this quick front runner is a capable striker and chance taker. An England U21 internationalist, he previously served Derby County and Notts County.
- 14. Paul Lambert (Mid)** - Born 7/8/69 Glasgow. Signed in 1997 from Borussia Dortmund (Germany), with whom he won a European Champions Cup Winners medal. An anchor man in the midfield area, he possesses good vision and passes the ball with great precision. A Scottish U21, "B" and full internationalist he has also served Motherwell and St. Mirren, recently sidelined with a knee injury.
- 15. Bobby Petta (Mid)** - Born 6/8/74 Rotterdam, Holland. Signed this summer from Ipswich Town, this clever performer is another player with good pace and fine skills in the midfield area. Capable of playing in wide or central roles, he can run at defences from deep positions, creating chances for strikers. Previously with Feyenoord (Holland).
- 16. Olivier Tebily (Def)** - Born 19/12/75 Abidjan, Ivory Coast. Signed this summer from Sheffield United, whom had only joined in March this year. The Yorkshire club snapped up the tall, mobile centre back for a £300,000 fee from Chateauroux (France), but Celts have reportedly signed him for a fee which will eventually accumulate to almost £1.3 million. Good in the air and strong in the air, this fleet-footed centre back is a French U21 internationalist.
- 18. Tom McKinlay (Def)** - Born 3/12/64 Glasgow. Signed in 1994 from Hearts, "Tosh" is a useful full back who is at his best in the modern, attacking, wing-back role. An equally sound defender, this Scottish U21, "B" and full internationalist had a loan spell with Stoke City whilst out of favour in season 1997-98. Previously with Dundee, he is a product of Celtic BC.
- 19. Stilian Petrov (Mid)** - Born 5/7/79 Sofia, Bulgaria. Signed this summer from CSKA Sofia, having had to wait a couple of months almost until a work permit was eventually made available for him. A tall, graceful player, whose fine skills on the ball make him a constant threat. Fast and direct, he can create great problems with his pacy runs from wide or deep positions. A Bulgarian U21 and full internationalist, he starred v England during the summer.
- 20. Regi Blinker (Forward)** - Born 2/6/69 Surinam. Signed in 1997 from Sheffield Wednesday, this fast raiding winger is capable of upsetting defences with his elusive running and dribbling skills. A Dutch U21 and full internationalist, he previously served Feyenoord (Holland), with whom he had two spells, spending a season with FC Den Bosch (Holland) in between.
- 21. Stewart Kerr (GK)** - Born 13/11/74 Bellshill. Signed in 1993 from Celtic BC, he is the youngest of the trio of top class keepers at Celtic Park. Tall and a safe handler, he has won and lost the first team spot on several occasions over the past couple of years, losing it mostly due to injuries. A Scottish U21 internationalist, he had a spell on loan to Bolton Wanderers several years ago.
- 23. Dmitri Kharine (GK)** - Born 16/8/68 Moscow, Russia. Signed this summer from Chelsea, with whom he had an unfortunate time with injuries in the past couple of seasons. An agile keeper, with fine reflexes, he has been a full internationalist with the USSR, CIS and Russia. Previously served CSKA Moscow, Dynamo Moscow and Torpedo Moscow (all Russia).
- 24. Colin Healy (Def/Mid)** - Born 14/3/80 Cork, Republic of Ireland. Signed in 1998 from Wiltton United, this promising teenager can be used in defence or in a defensive
- midfield role. A clever performer, he uses the ball well and is capable of winning it in the vital midfield area. An Irish U21 internationalist.
- 25. Lubomir Moravcik (Mid)** - Born 22/6/65 Slovakia. Signed in 1998 from MSV Duisburg (Germany), he has proved to be an excellent capture by former boss Jozef Venglos. A creative schemer, he has great skills on the ball, being equally adept at free kicks and corner kick set pieces. A Slovakian internationalist, he also won U21 and full caps with the former Czechoslovakia. Previously saw service with SC Bastia and St Etienne (both France) and Plastika Nitra (Czechoslovakia).
- 27. Mark Burchill (Forward)** - Born 18/8/80 Broxburn. Signed in 1997 from Celtic BC, this exciting teenage striker is another fine product of the famed Celtic Youth set-up. A pacy, restless front runner, he has a good goalscoring record in youth and reserve football. A constant threat to defences, he is a Scottish U21 internationalist.
- 30. Vidar Riseth (Def/Mid)** - Born 21/4/72 Levanger, Norway. Signed in 1998 from LASK Linz (Austria), this tall, slim built player can be used in wide or defensive midfield roles, as well as central defence. A Norwegian internationalist, he has also served Luton Town (England) and Kongsberg (Norway).
- 35. Johan Mjalby (Def/Mid)** - Born 9/2/71 Sweden. Signed in 1998 from AIK Stockholm (Sweden), this solid, well built player can be used at centre back or in a ball winning midfield role. A strong tackler, he is a formidable character to oppose whether he is in defence or midfield. A Swedish internationalist, he spent 14 years at AIK Stockholm.
- 36. Mark Viduka (Forward)** - Born 9/10/75 Melbourne, Australia. Signed in 1998 from Croatia Zagreb (Croatia), this tall, mobile striker has a proven goalscoring record. Tall and well built, he has good pace and a deceptive style which makes him a real danger whenever he is in possession near goal. An Australian internationalist, he has also served Melbourne Knights (Australia).

1. FC Kaiserslautern

This Thursday Killie face German cracks 1. FC Kaiserslautern in the 1st Leg of the UEFA Cup 1st Round.

Founded in 1900, Kaiserslautern have won the Bundesliga on four occasions, the latest in 1997/98, and the German Cup twice. Last season, they topped their Champions' League Group (which included PSV Eindhoven, Benfica and HJK Helsinki) before going out 6-0 on aggregate to eventual runners-up Bayern Munich in the quarter-finals.

They didn't play in European competition until season 1972/73, but

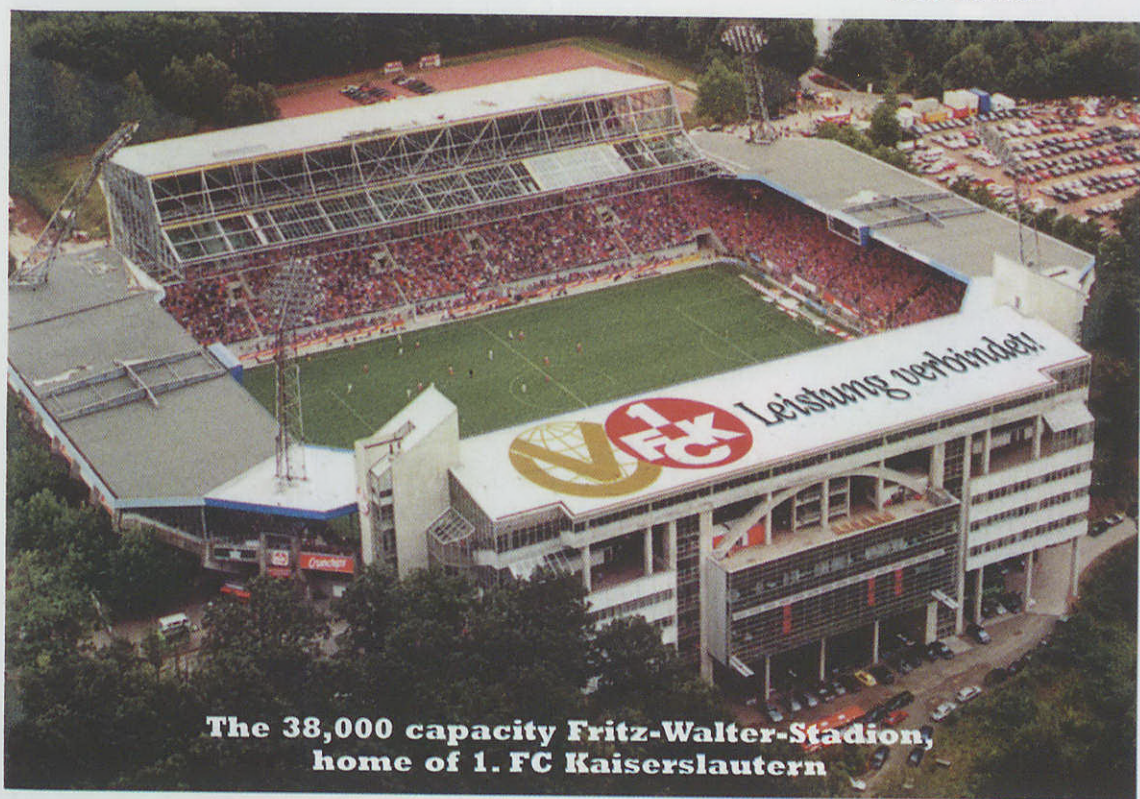
since then have been regular entrants, reaching the semi-finals of the UEFA Cup in 1981/82. Despite having played over 70 matches in the three European competitions, they've never played a Scottish club in a competitive match before, although they have met English opposition on three occasions - Stoke City, Watford and Sheffield Wednesday.

They will provide formidable opposition indeed, but our trip to western Germany is eagerly awaited by everyone connected to the club, with their visit to Rugby Park a fortnight later sure to attract a big crowd.

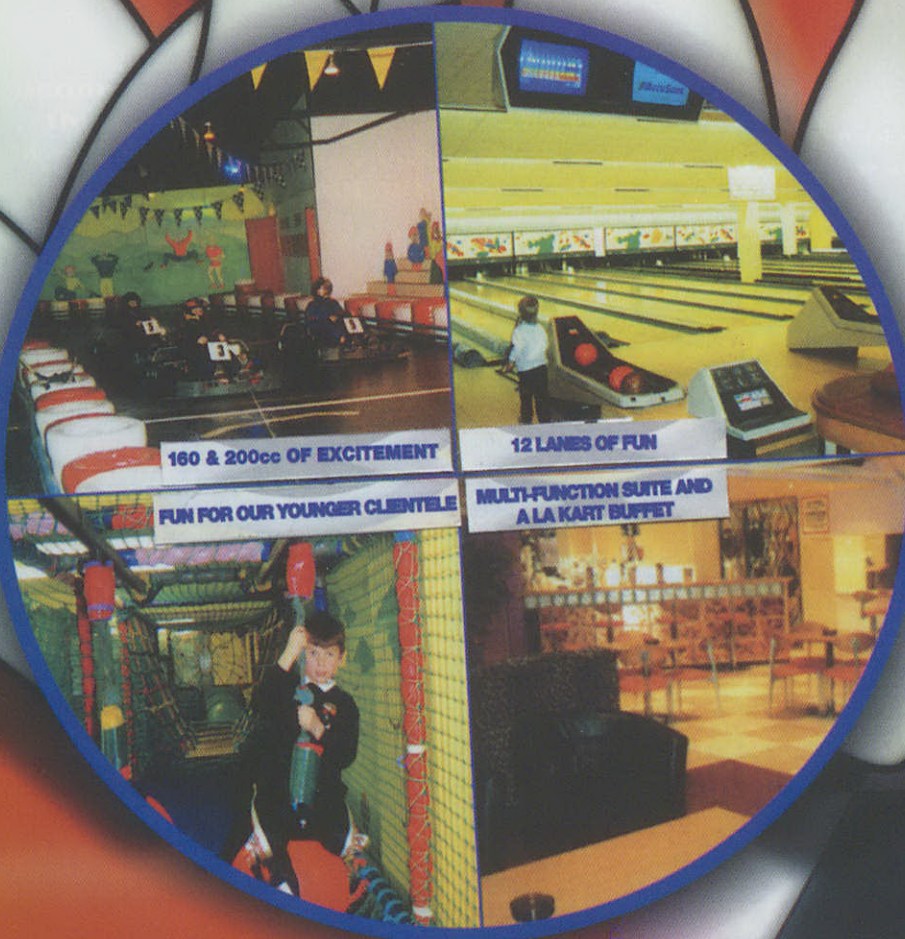

Looking Back

In 71 officially completed Scottish League/S.P.L. seasons, Kilmarnock and Celtic have met on 162 occasions for League points. Here is Killie's record in the meetings:

Fact 1

The first wins for both clubs in their League encounters were in the 1900-01 season. They each won at home, Celtic by 1-0 on 27/10/1900, and only a week later, on 3/11/1900, Killie won 2-1 at Rugby Park. The previous season, 1899-1900, they met for the first ever time in the Scottish League, and drew both games. Rugby Park, on its present site, was used for the first ever time on 26/8/1899, and Killie drew 2-2 with Celtic. This was also Killie's first home game in Division 1. In the return game at Celtic Park, on 16/12/1899, the game ended 3-3.

Fact 2

Kilmarnock's biggest defeats in League meetings with Celtic have both been by 8 goal margins. On 25/12/1937, Jimmy McGro-

ry's opening game as Killie manager ended in an 8-0 defeat at Celtic Park. The following season, on the opening day of 13/8/1938, Killie were again badly beaten at Celtic Park. Despite taking a third minute lead, they lost 9-1, yet eleven days later, they drew 0-0 at Rugby Park in the return encounter. Killie's biggest win in the meetings has been 6-0, at Rugby Park in Division 1 on 27/3/1963.

Fact 3

Celtic's 1-0 win at Celtic Park on 17/2/1999 in the S.P.L. was their 100th success over Killie in official League meetings. Only 5 of Killie's 24 wins have been at Celtic Park. The very first of those, on 21/4/1917 brought to an end the longest unbeaten run in British League football. Celtic had been unbeaten in 62 League games before Killie recorded that first ever win at Celtic Park. Their other wins at Celtic Park have been by 3-2 (1917/18), 2-1 (1922/23), 4-2 (1936/37) and 2-0 (1955/56).

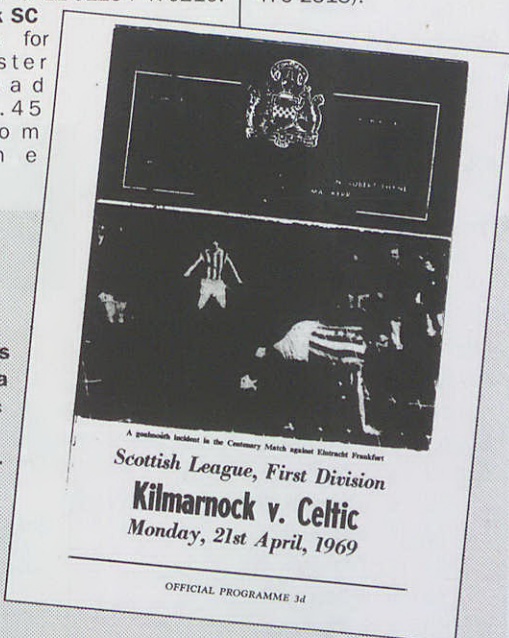

Police Message
