**A** WARM welcome to the first Old Firm game of the new season, a match everyone at Celtic Park has been anticipating keenly for the past few days.

It's come very early in the campaign but the players of both sides are always ready for an Old Firm encounter.

I'm sure the fans in the ground today are in for as dramatic and exciting a game as ever.

Meetings with Rangers in my time at Celtic Park have always been very sporting affairs played in exactly the right spirit, fiercely competitive but never out of order.

I fully expect that to be the case again today as we go all out to make up the two-point deficit we face going into the game.

That is the result of draws in both of our opening fixtures, away to Motherwell and at home to Hibernian.

I said in last week's column that aspects of the performance at Fir Park were a big disappointment to Joe Jordan and me but we were much happier with our showing against Hibs – although the outcome was the same.

We played some excellent football and our only failing was that we didn't kill the game off when we were in near total control.

## **Positive**

We were guilty of a brief lapse in concentration and were punished very severely for it. That is a warning to us for today.

We know any mistakes will be capitalised upon because that is what quality teams do. We must be positive, deny Walter Smith's side time on the ball and really go for it.

It's an approach which paid belated dividends last season when we won the final league meeting of the season, more convincingly than the 2-1 scoreline suggested after dominating the two previous matches but losing 1-0 each time.

The adrenalin and tension which Old Firm games generate mean that it's difficult to keep total concentration but that is what Joe and I will be demanding.

I need hardly remind you of the importance of good behaviour today. There hasn't been trouble at an Old Firm game in a long time – let's keep it that way.

NEIL MURRAY...Cup Final goal



DAVE McPHERSON...two spells at Ibrox

**RANGERS** come to Celtic Park this afternoon looking little like the side which played here in March.

Andy Goram, David Robertson, Stuart McCall and Ally McCoist are all definitely out through injury - and a string of other big names are struggling with knocks.

So there's a big chance for youngsters and fringe men as the Old Firm come head on in one of the most hotly-anticipated clashes in years.

Here's your rundown on today's opposition:



**ALLY MAXWELL** thought he would be a permanent standby when he signed for £300,000 as Goram's understudy.

But when the Scotland No.1 underwent a knee operation which was to require six months recuperation, the former Motherwell man grabbed his chance.

Makes his Old Firm debut today.

**BRAINBOX** of the side is **NEIL MURRAY**, who is training to be an accountant in between matches.

The shy youngster burst into the side thanks to injury problems last winter and has rarely been out since.

Scored the opener the last time Rangers played here ... in the Scottish Cup Final against Aberdeen in May.

**YOU** would have got long odds a few weeks ago on **FRASER WISHART** ever playing in an Old Firm match.

Yet today, the man freed by St Mirren and Falkirk in successive seasons is almost certain to replace the crooked Davie Robertson.

Wishart, 28, is on a two-month contract at Ibrox - but



has impressed and may be kept on for the whole season.

**SKIPPING** the Gers side as ever is **RICHARD GOUGH**, the one-time Dundee United and Spurs star who loves these occasions.

Has fought back from a string of injuries which have curtailed his appearances in their past two seasons.

Now aged 31, he is the backbone of the Ibrox side.

**DAVID McPHERSON** could well be fit to wear his No.5 jersey again ... but slot in at right-back.

Signed for £1.3 million from Hearts last summer, this is the Paisley-born defender's second spell at Ibrox. He was sold to Tynecastle for £400,000 in 1987.



IF one man typifies the never-say-die Rangers attitude, it's **JOHN BROWN**. At 31, he has a catalogue of injuries behind him but is in the form of his life.

Only Davie Robertson played more often last season as Walter Smith's side won the treble and came close to European glory.

Brown previously played for Dundee and Hamilton, where he earned the honour of being the last full-back to score a hat-trick - against Berwick in 1980.

WHAT an occasion this would be for **DUNCAN FERGUSON** to make his debut after a £4 million move from Dundee United.

He played 56 minutes of a closed door friendly at Love Street in midweek and is in line for at least part of today's game.

He became Britain's most expensive player after a tug-of-war with Leeds United.

**MARK HATELEY** missed last week's 2-1 win at St Johnstone with a niggling injury, but is desperate to play today.

Last season he moved to centre-back as Rangers won 1-0 here in November.

Tipped for an England recall.

**PIETER HUISTRA** could win the No.11 jersey ahead of **IAN DURRANT** today.

The Dutchman's crossing ability is something the Celts defence will have to watch closely.

**DURRANT** scored the winner

here last November as he bounced back from his 30-month lay-off thanks to a crippling knee injury.

**COLIN SCOTT** will be the replacement keeper today. Team-mates say that he is the man most likely to carry an extra piece of kit ... a hairdryer!

ALSO on the sidelines could be **STEVEN PRESSLEY**, the Elgin-born kid the experts tip as the new Richard Gough.

Elvis, as he's known, is an excellent young defender who has recovered well from the slip which cost a goal against Marseille last November.



**YOUNG** striker **DAVID HAGEN** is also knocking on the door for a place today.

He followed up a fine pre-season run with the first goal in the opening day win over Hearts.

AND finally, **ALEXEI MIKHAILICHENKO**. The laid-back Ukrainian is unlikely to start the game, but his best moments tend to come AFTER away games - team-mates tell us he's a card shark on the bus home!
