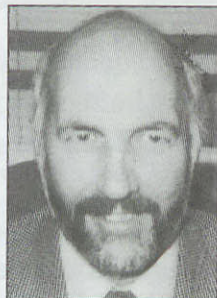

Europe the only way forward - by John Deakin

This outstanding fixture for Inter CableTel FC illustrates exactly what the League of Wales has done for Welsh domestic football. Just five years go, the pinnacle of ambition for a club like Inter, was a successful Welsh League season or Welsh Cup run, which would hopefully result in a tie with one of the so called 'big three' Football League clubs, one of whom almost invariably used to win that Competition and consequently become Wales' only representative in Europe.

That was the old system. What progress this season with four League of Wales clubs in Europe. As well as this tie against previous European Champions Glasgow Celtic, Barry Town take on another past winner of that trophy, Dynamo Kiev from the Ukraine, opposition that they could only have dreamt about prior to 1992.

This draw against the Scottish giants is just reward for all at Inter CableTel who have striven to bring success to the club over the past five years. Despite small attendances and resources that perhaps do not match those available to some other clubs in the League, Inter have consistently been one of its leading clubs, finishing runners up on three occasions and being rewarded by a UEFA Cup place against GKS Katowice (Poland) under the Management of Lynn Jones in 1994. Since then, Inter have made significant progress under George Wood, who is not just an outstanding ambassador for his club, but also the League and Welsh football. He has for the past two seasons been assistant manager for the League of Wales representative team, and has emerged as one of the most respected

figures in football in the Principality. A gentleman on and off the field, no one deserves this success more than George.

He has been at the forefront of Inter's football in the community scheme, and with the excellent sponsorship package from CableTel, the club is able to do so much for local youngsters, scores of whom attend holiday coaching sessions at Leckwith Stadium. This is surely the way forward for all our clubs, who must get involved in the local communities to make sure that young people get the chance to play our great game. There are still a number of our clubs who don't even have a youth side, which given the emphasis placed on youth development on the continent, is regrettable to say the least.

So on to this tie, in which Inter start favourites, which is one of my famous understatements. What an experience for Inter's players, though, and with nothing to lose, I'm sure that they will do their club and the League of Wales proud tonight. Last year our clubs put up some excellent performances in Europe, and it would certainly give us all a boost if Inter are able to achieve any sort of result in either of their games against one of the best teams in Britain.

Whatever the result, I'm sure we'll all have a great night out and look forward to future European Football in Wales, the emphasis on which is increasingly relevant to all domestic clubs throughout our continent. National competitions will continue to be vital, but only as the route to European qualification. That's why the League of Wales is and will increasingly be so important to all Welsh clubs in the future. Who wants to play Torquay or Blackpool, when you can play against Glasgow Celtic?

Our Friends in the North - by Alun Evans

It seems scarcely credible that only five years ago few Welshmen would have dared believe that European cup-ties would be the province of semi-professional clubs playing in a national championship. And yet for thirty years previously, such games were almost entirely within the privileged domain of the Football League clubs. True, the very first Welsh team to play in Europe were Bangor City, who took mighty Napoli to a third match before losing at Highbury. It is a sad footnote to history that under present day rules the match would not only have been superfluous, but the tie would have been awarded to Bangor on the away goal rule. True, too, that Borough United and Merthyr Tydfil both recorded wins which reflected well on Welsh soccer "below stairs", but the yearly glamour was by and large confined to the big clubs of Cardiff, Swansea and Wrexham, apart from one memorable sortie by the late and lamented Newport County.

How times have changed. Instead of that single annual bite at the Cup Winners' Cup cherry, there are, for the second year running and for the foreseeable future four League of Wales Clubs representing their nation in a full set of European competitions Ebbw Vale have already participated in the Intertoto Cup, and Barry and Cwmbran's home games are still to come. But tonight we all keenly anticipate the real 'plum' drawn from the hat in Geneva with the visit of Celtic - whose great history embraces the unique distinction of being the first British club to win the European Champions' Cup - to Ninian Park.

It is remarkable, given their history and the level of support for the club in South Wales, that this will be the first appearance of Celtic in the Principality. It is even more remarkable when one considers the links between the two. No less than thirty Celtic players have also played for Welsh clubs, from Hugh Goldie, who joined Barry in 1899 through to Martin Hayes, a recent member of the Swansea staff. But one name shines out. Jock Stein would illuminate any company for his achievements as a player and manager. It tends to be forgotten that he only took up full-time football with Llanelli, from whom Celtic recruited him to become the glory of British soccer. We can never forget the tragic night, almost twelve years ago, when he died in this very stadium after overseeing a crucial Scottish World Cup victory, but Celtic's visit this evening will enable us to celebrate his life and not simply to commemorate its passing.

Mr. Stein would have been delighted by the fact that one of his Celtic staff., Brian Coyne, has brought the style of football he inspired into the League of Wales as manager of Newtown, whose skilful play has won admirers far and wide. Inter's manager, former Scottish keeper George Wood, will also have memories rekindled, but of the less welcome kind, for he made his professional debut against Celtic. His club East Sterling, lost 3-0. He will hope for better luck tonight, but more than that he will wish for a splendid game of football worthy of the two clubs.

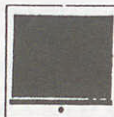

Celtic - History

Celtic Football Club was formed in the City of Glasgow in 1888, the reason for the Club's formation was principally to utilise a football club as a means of raising money for the poor of the City's East End.

In 1988, although Glasgow was the rich and prosperous second city of the British Empire, the city's east end was greatly impoverished with high rates of child mortality. The founder of the club was a local Marist Brother of Irish origin, who recognised the need for positive social integration between Scottish and Irish living in Glasgow and hence the name Celtic, emphasising a bridge of cultures across the Irish Sea.

Celtic Football Club is a major institution in Scottish life and has supporters from all over the world, mainly expatriates of Scotland and Ireland.

Over the last century Celtic Football Club has developed into a thriving business and has a proud name and heritage known throughout the world, regrettably over a number of years the club's initial charitable quest was all but forgotten. In 1994 the Club was taken over by new management who seek to maximise Celtic's potential as a football club and business, but also, importantly to recognise Celtic's social dimension with a return to supporting charitable causes in line with the founding principles of the Club.

In 1995, 'Celtic Charity Fund' was formed with the aim of revitalising Celtic's charitable traditions.

Aims:

Celtic Charity Fund has the following aims:

1. To raise funds and support specific areas of charity work selected each year by Celtic Football Club.
2. To uphold and promote the charitable principles and heritage of Celtic Football Club.

Celtic Charity Fund Areas of Support

Celtic has identified three principal areas of support and three subsidiary areas.

Principle Areas

1. Charities in support of children's needs.
2. Community action on drugs.
3. Projects that develop and promote religious and ethnic harmony.

Subsidiary Areas

- a. Supporting the homeless
- b. Helping the unemployed
- c. Supporting and research for projects aiding the afflictions of illness, famine and innocent families within the areas of war.

Official Recognition - Celtic Charity Fund

Celtic Charity Fund was officially registered as a recognised charity on 31st March 1996 (Official Scottish Charity Number SC024648) with the Inland Revenue in Scotland.

Trustees

The Board of Trustees currently numbers four and is selected by Celtic Football Club. The Trustees have the responsibility of ensuring the charitable traditions and values of Celtic are maintained while managing, agreeing and actioning the distribution of funds.

Celtic Charity Fund-raising Action Group

Celtic Charity Fund-raising Action Group was set up on the 27th February 1996 as the vehicle responsible for raising money solely for Celtic Charity Fund and promoting the traditions and values of Celtic Football Club.

The group consists of professional business people who share the values of Celtic's charitable traditions, the members of the group are selected by Celtic Football Club.

Summary

Celtic Charity Fund seeks to uphold the charitable traditions of Celtic Football Club in keeping with the Club's history and principles outlined in the Club's Social Mission Statement.

Celtic - Pen Pics

Gordon Marshall - Goalkeeper, born 19.04.64 in Edinburgh. Signed from Falkirk for £270,000, August 1991. Other League Clubs include Rangers, East Stirlingshire and East Fife. Played in every game last term after being handed the keeper's jersey at the start of the season. The previous term he also started as No. 1 but lost his place to Pat Bonner in December. Has one Scotland International Cap, won against the USA. Former Scottish youth internationalist whose father also kept goal for Celtic in the early 1970's.

Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 133, Goals: 0.

Stewart Kerr - Goalkeeper, born 13.11.74 in Lanark. Signed X-Form, April 1991. Promising talent for the future, Stewart is an established Scotland international at under-21 level. Has made no competitive first team appearances but tasted action against Manchester United in Paul McStay's testimonial played in December 1995.

Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 32, Goals: 0.

Jackie McNamara - Defender, born 24.10.73 in Glasgow. Signed From Dunfermline Athletic for £600,000, October 1995. Attacking right-back already touted as the new Danny McGrain this young man looks to have a great career ahead of him. Signed by Tommy Burns as a pool player but quickly made the right-back berth his own. Scotland under 21 star who is already being mentioned in dispatches for the nations' senior side.

Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 72, Goals: 2.

Tosh McKinlay - Defender, born 03.12.69 in Glasgow. Signed from Heart of Midlothian for £350,000, November '94. Other League Clubs include Dundee. Bargain buy Tosh McKinlay has proved to be one of Celtic's most consistent performers since he arrived from Hearts. Such was his impact that he soon became a regular in the dark blue of Scotland and was an important part of the build-up for Euro '96.

Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 103, Goals: 0.

Tom Boyd - Defender, born 24.11.65 in Glasgow. Signed from Chelsea, swap deal for Tony Cascarino, February 1992. Other League Clubs include Motherwell. Considering he cost Celtic nothing, this defender must be the cheapest internationalist of the lot. Can slot anywhere in defence, naturally right-footed he always favoured the left-back position and still plays there for his country. Tommy Burns first converted him to right-back but he has now settled in the centre of defence. Has 39 caps for Scotland.

Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 247, Goals: 2.

Alan Stubbs - Defender, born 06.10.71 in Kirkby, England. Signed from Bolton Wanderers in £5.5 Million deal, May 1996. An unexpected end of season signing who grabbed the headlines after turning down moves to top English Clubs to come to Celtic Park. Robust central defender with an eye for chances from set pieces at other end of the pitch who made his Bolton debut in season 1990/91 and it wasn't long before he was handed the captaincy at 21 years old, precisely the leadership qualities that made Tommy Burns engineer Celtic's record transfer deal. Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 26, Goals: 0.

Malky Mackay - Defender, born 19.02.72 in Bellshill. Signed from Queens Park on a free, August 1994. Tower of strength in the reserve side that captured the double in season 1994/95 and retained the League Cup for the third successive year last term. Made inroads to the first team last season by turning out 12 times as well as scoring his debut goal. That came against Partick Thistle, a club he turned down a move to earlier in the season.

Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 40, Goals: 14.

Phil O'Donnell - Midfielder, born 25.03.72, in Bellshill. Signed from Motherwell for £1.75 million, September 1994. Was the club's record buy when Tommy Burns paid £1.75 million for him in September 1994. Repaid a large chunk of that in his debut game, scoring both goals in a 2-1 win over Partick Thistle. Suffered last season with injury problems but when fit can show exactly the sort of form that Burns bought him for, with his foraging runs throughout the middle of the park.

Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 77, Goals: 14.

Paolo Di Canio - Midfielder, born 09.07.68 in Rome, Italy. Signed from AC Milan in £3 million deal, June 1996. Other league clubs include: Lazio, Ternana, Juventus, Napoli, Genoa. Another scoop signing at the end of last season which created a stir when he arrived after three months speculation. Man of many teams but his spells at Ternana, Napoli and Genoa were under loan deals making Celtic his third 'real' club. Healthy habit of helping team mates to lift trophies and Tommy Burns had this in mind when he signed this stylish wing player who likes to take people on.

Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 37, Goals: 15.

Simon Donnelly - Midfielder, born 01.12.74 in Glasgow. Signed from Queens Park BC, in July 1992. Made an instant impact when he was drafted in to the first team, scoring both goals on his home debut against Raith Rovers in a 2-1 win in March 1994. Tommy Burns handed him the wide-right role last season and like to get forward and links up well with Jackie McNamara, his Scotland under 21 team mate but also defends when he has to.

Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 118, Goals: 21.

Morten Weighorst - Midfielder, born 25.02.71 in Golstrup, Denmark. Signed from Dundee in £600,000 deal, December 1995. Other league clubs include: Lyngby. Danish internationalist who was brought in last December as a squad player and had to bide his time before being eased in gradually. Made his mark in coming from the bench and gave Tommy Burns problems of the right sort - mainly how to fit him in to an already winning team. Can also play in defence but scores goals as well and his influence helped Dundee reach the Coca Cola Cup final last term. Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 35, Goals: 3.

Brian McLaughlin - Midfielder, born 14.05.74 in Bellshill. Signed from Celtic Boys Club, July 1992. Tricky winger in the old fashioned mould and naturally left-sided player. Has flirted in and out of the first team set-up but is always on the fringes of the side. Won a Scottish Cup medal with the first team and was an integral part of the reserve side that won back-to-back league and cup doubles. Can irritate opponents by the way he runs at and jinks round them but admits he still has to work on his final ball into the box. Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 98, Goals: 5.

Stuart Gray - Midfielder, born 18.12.73 in Harrogate, England. Signed from Celtic Boys Club, July 1992. Left sided midfielder who can also operate in the full-back berth of the same flank but his adaptability has seen him take on roles in other areas of the pitch. Likes to get forward but in a reserve match at Tannadice he grabbed the opportunity to score from his own half of the pitch when he flighted the ball fully 55 yards in to the net. Born in Yorkshire but elected to play for Scotland and has earned seven under 21 caps.

Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 25, Goals: 1.

Andreas Thom - Midfield, born 07.09.65 in Rudersdorf, Germany. Signed from Bayer Leverkusen in £4 million deal, July 1995. Other League clubs include Dynamo Berlin, TSG Herzfelde. German internationalist for both the East and unified teams, the striker delighted Celtic fans last season with his creative play and great pace. Was the first East German to move to a West German club before re-unification when he joined Leverkusen in 1989 for £1.5 million from Berlin. Netted on his Celtic debut against Ayr United in the Coca-Cola. Links well with Pierre van Hooijdonk in the front line with a flair for setting up goals rather than scoring them.

Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 77, Goals: 20.

Jorge Cadete - Forward, born 27.08.68 in Porto Amelia, Mozambique. Signed from Sporting Lisbon, February 1996. Other league clubs include Vitoria Setubal, Brescia. Portuguese internationalist who set the heather on fire when he arrived at Celtic Park last season. Red tape delayed his registration and debut but he eventually burst onto the scene in dramatic style by scoring immediately after coming on as substitute against Aberdeen. Went on to maintain that goal threat in the remaining games with regular habit of finding the net and became an instant hit with the supporters.

Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 49, Goals: 38

David Hannah - Midfielder, born 08.08.73 in Airdrie. Signed from Dundee United in December 1996. Other league clubs include Hamilton Thistle. Made his first big move in September 1991 joining Dundee United from Hamilton Thistle. Made his first-team debut in a 4-0 win against Partick Thistle in February 1993 and starred in United's 1-0 win over Rangers in the Scottish Cup Final the following May. Was a virtual ever-present the following term but injuries wrecked his 1996/97 campaign. Returned to the United first-team earlier this season before making the £650,000 move to Celtic Park.

Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 23, Goals: 0.

Enrico Annoni - Defender, born 10.07.66 in Guissano, Milan. Signed from AS Roma, March 1997. Other clubs include Torino, Como, Sambenedettese, Seregno. Began his career in the Italian non-league before moving to Serie B side Como in 1983. Stayed with them until 1990 when he earned a lucrative move to Torino and was a member of the side which reached the UEFA Cup Final in 1992, only to lose to Ajax on the away goals rule. Moved to AS Roma in 1994 and was a regular in their first-team before joining Celtic.

Celtic record up to end of season 1996/97: Appearances: 5, Goals: 0.

Tommy Johnson - Forward, born 15.01.71 in Newcastle. Signed from Aston Villa, April 1997. Other clubs include Derby County, Notts County. The club's most recent signing. Began his career as a trainee at Notts County, making his debut in 1988/89. Played 149 games for the Meadow Lane club, scoring 57 goals in the process. Moved to Derby County in 1991/92 and while at the Baseball Ground found the net 41 times in 129 competitive appearances for the Rams. Joined Aston Villa during the 1994/95 term and scored 16 goals from 69 appearances for the Birmingham club.

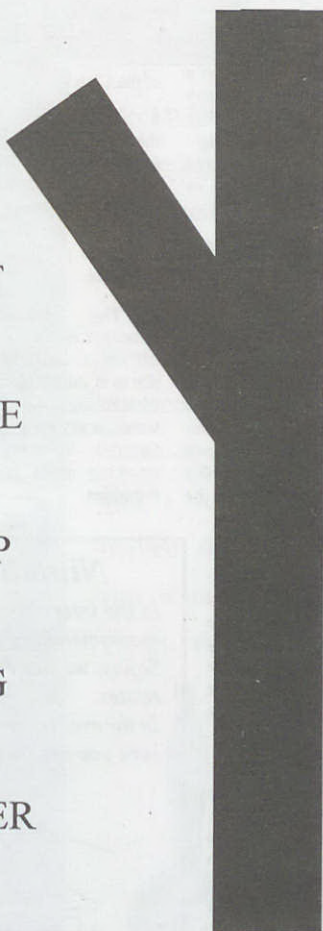

OFFICIAL NOTICE ~ GROUND REGULATIONS

1 The Club management reserves the right of admission to the Ground. On no account will admission be granted to a person who is the subject of a current exclusion order.

2 Play cannot be guaranteed to take place on a particular day or at any particular time, and the Club management reserves the right to change the advertised fixtures without notice or liability.

3 In the event of the match being postponed or abandoned, any refund of the admission charge will be at the sole discretion of the Club management, this is subject to a time limitation, the details of which are obtainable from the Club Ticket Office. Persons entering the ground are advised to retain their ticket, as this may be required to be produced at a later date.

4 The Club management reserves the right to refuse admission to the Ground to, or to eject from the Ground, any person who refuses to be searched by any servant or agent of the Club or Police Officer.

5 Fireworks, flares, smoke canisters, air horns, knives, bottles, glasses, cans, poles and any articles that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety are not permitted within the Ground.

6 The following are offences under the Football (Offences) Act 11991, and are strictly forbidden:-

- * the throwing of any object within the ground
- * the use of foul and abusive language, obscene chanting or racial abuse towards any person.
- * unauthorised entry onto

the Field of Play or the surrounding track, except in an emergency.

7 The moving from one area of the ground to another without permission of a Steward, Police Officer or other authorised agent of the Club is strictly forbidden.

8 Persons issued with a ticket for a specific seat must occupy that seat unless instructed otherwise by a steward or other authorised agent of the Club. Standing in seated areas whilst play is in progress is strictly forbidden.

9 The obstruction of gangways, access ways, exits and entrances, stairways and like places is strictly forbidden, as is the climbing of floodlight pylons, stands, or any structure within the Ground. Smoking in non-smoking areas is similarly forbidden.

16 Persons failing to comply with instructions from a Steward, Police Officer or other authorised agent of the Club will be ejected from the Ground.

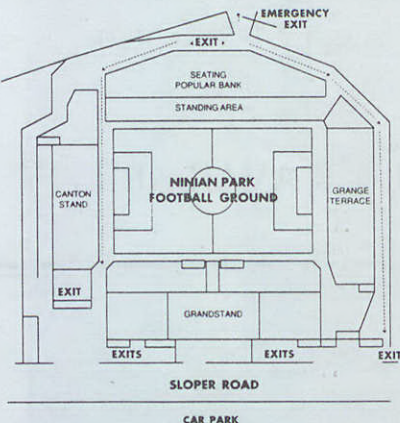

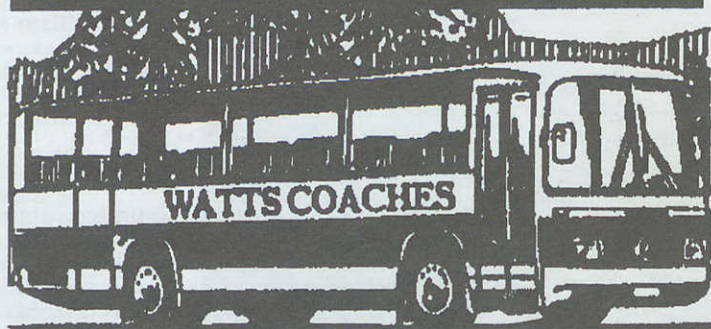

Inter CableTel - A Brief History

The club was originally known as Sully A.F.C. and enjoyed considerable success, rising through the local Barry and District, South Wales Amateur and Welsh Football Leagues. The poor facilities at their Burnham Avenue ground prevented them from being promoted to the Welsh League National Division despite being champions or runners-up several times in the 1980's.

Their ambition to progress into top flight football in South Wales was achieved during the summer of 1990 when the Chairman of Sully purchased the Cwrt-yr-Ala ground of neighbours A.F.C. Cardiff who had been forced into liquidation, and the improved facilities enabled them to compete in the National Division of the Abacus Welsh League. The name was changed to Inter Cardiff Football Club and finished the first season in sixth place but had slipped to twelfth by the following season.

In season 1992-93 the club became one of the founder members of the League of Wales but because the facilities at Cwrt-yr-Ala were not adequate they were able to obtain the use of the Leckwith Athletic Stadium for their home games through a lucrative sponsorship deal

with Aspro Travel and Inter European Airways. Lyn Jones and Phil Holme were appointed as manager and coach respectively and they led the League for all but three to four weeks of the season only to be pipped at the post by Cwmbran Town. They were disappointed not to be allowed to enter the UEFA Cup and the withdrawal of their sponsors led to Max James taking over the reins, along with Cardiff City supremo Rick Wright, securing the use of Ninian Park for their home fixtures.

They were runners-up once again in the 1993/94 season and were granted a place in the UEFA Cup, losing in the preliminary round to crack Polish side, GKS Katowice.

With the return of Lyn Jones to Merthyr, George Wood was appointed to replace him and the success story of the club has continued, albeit under a different name and home - a sponsorship deal leading to the name Inter CableTel, now playing at Cardiff Stadium. The end of the 1996/97 season saw them as runners-up once again and a UEFA Cup place gives Inter the chance to play one of the most famous clubs in the world tonight.

Inter CableTel - Pen Pictures

Steve Morris ~ Goalkeeper of considerable experience. Won a Welsh Cup Winners medal playing for Barry Town and has also played for English Football League Club Torquay United.

Marty Ellacott ~ Like Steve has also been with Torquay United. Signed at the beginning of last season from Ton Pentre.

Richard Williams ~ Signed last season from Millwall. A talented young midfield player who is also very keen on the coaching side of the game.

Richard David ~ Young centre back signed from Cardiff University last season. Won last season's young player of the year award.

Dean Philpot ~ Third season with the club Dean is a strong centre half and comes from the South Wales valley town of Wattstown. Chosen to play for the League of Wales representative team last season but missed out because of injury.

Micky Copeman ~ New signing from Cwmbran Town. Won a League Championship medal with his former club and played in the European Cup the following season. Micky is a quick and pacy defender.

Anthony Jenkins ~ New signing from Merthyr Tydfil, Anthony is an attacking right full back of exceptional speed.

Kevin Richards ~ Aggressive midfield player who has represented the league side. Just signed from Ton Pentre for whom he played in the Intertoto Cup 2 years ago.

Brian Gibson ~ Another midfield player from Ton Pentre who has also played in Europe for his former club.

Neil Davies ~ Midfield player signed from Welsh League Club Penrhwiwceiber.

Wayne Hewitt ~ Experienced left back who likes to come forward. Signed from Cwmbran Town, represented the Football League of Wales.

John Wile ~ Ex Cardiff City and Ton Pentre player who can play in any position on the field. Even deputised in goal last season for Ton Pentre when their keeper was sent off.

Andy Rickard ~ Signed pre-season from Afan Lido, has great experience after taking part in Lido's European adventure and played for League of Wales in their famous win in Ireland last season.

George Wood ~ Football League clubs include Blackpool, Everton, Arsenal, Crystal Palace, Cardiff City, Hereford. Was in Scotland's World Cup Squad in finals in Spain 1982.

Paul Burrows ~ Quality striker from Briton Ferry. Ex Swansea City striker who regularly scores goals. Quick in the box area Paul has also represented the League of Wales.

Morrys Scott ~ Tall 6ft defender or attacker who has played English League Football for Cardiff City. Considerable experience, has played for a number of LoW clubs including Barry Town.

Richard Haig ~ Striker in his second season with the club and also played for the League of Wales. Played for Ton Pentre for six years before joining Inter midway through last season.

Jamie Murray ~ Midfield player signed from Cardiff Civil Service 2 years ago.

Sean Wharton ~ Signed from Cwmbran Town at the beginning of last season, experienced European Cup campaigner with Cwmbran and represented League of Wales side in Ireland.

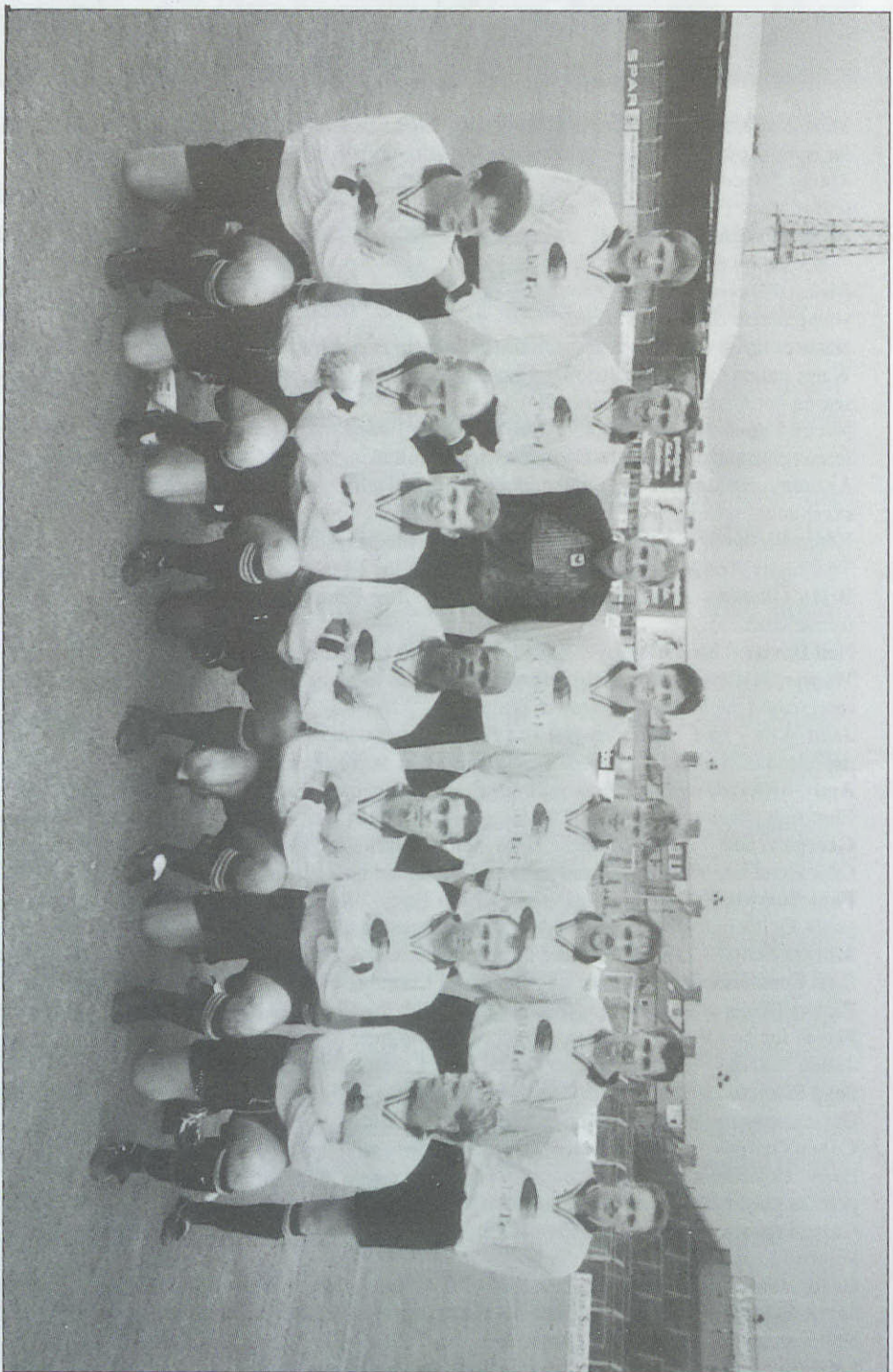
