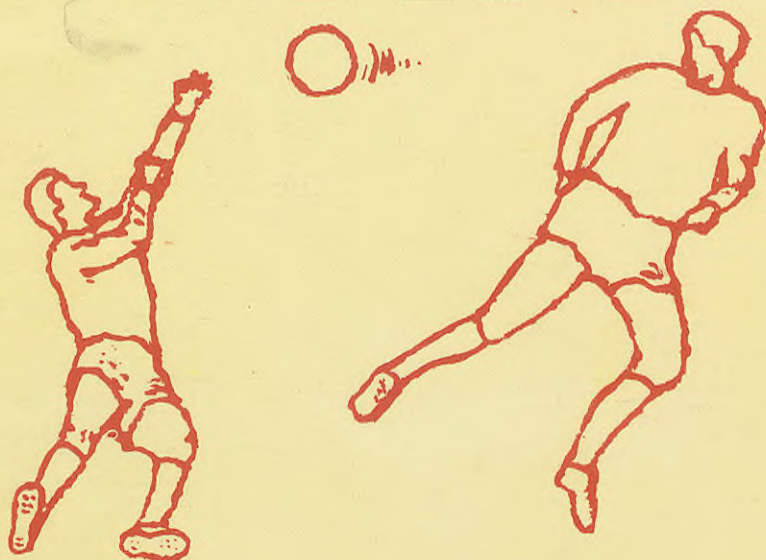

MANAGER'S VIEW»»



WELL, here it is at last — my first all-ticket match as Manager of Motherwell. And although Jack McGraw, the club secretary, and his industrious assistant, Mrs. Janet Renny, have been run off their feet attending to all the administrative details which are inevitable on occasions such as this, there is no denying that this is the way we like it at Fir Park.

I said before our last meeting with Celtic a fortnight ago that no two matches are alike and, even if we had won that game, our preparation would have been no different for today's encounter. Although Bobby Watson suffered a slight groin strain and Vic Davidson sustained an ankle knock at Tannadice, I'm confident that we shall have a full pool of players available for selection this afternoon. This being the case we have no reason to fear anyone, not even cup holders, Celtic. Naturally, we will treat Celtic with the respect which they deserve, but we shall be having a real go in an attempt to capitalise on ground advantage. My biggest disappointment so far at Motherwell has been to lose in last season's cup semi-final. We are a much improved side since then and I would dearly love to see our lads run out at Hampden on May 1st. Today's game is the first, and possibly the most difficult, hurdle on the way to the final.

It was surprising after last week's victory at Tannadice to read reports which said, "Motherwell Return to Form". As far as I'm concerned, we have never lost form! The only difference from the previous week's game against Celtic was that we took our chances in Dundee. It was great to see Willie Pettigrew back on the goal trail after three games without finding the net, and equally pleasing to see Peter Marinello get his first goal for the club. Regulars at our matches will know how close Peter has come to scoring on numerous occasions since his arrival here. Yes, there are others here who can score goals and we hope that Celtic find that out today!

I welcome Sean Fallon, his players and the large Celtic support to Fir Park this afternoon. Groundsman Andy Russell has been preparing the playing surface after the 'beating' it took a couple of weeks ago. We have a world class referee for the match. We have two full strength squads. The television cameras are here . . . all the ingredients for a great match.

With respect to the other sides in the competition, this is THE tie of the round. I hope it lives up to expectations and that Motherwell is the better side on the day.

RESERVE REVIEW

OUR Reserves have played two matches since the last edition of The Fir Park News. At Celtic Park on Wednesday, 7th January, they went down by 3-0 to a strong Parkhead side, and the following week they played a 1-1 draw with Dundee United at home.

Against Celtic we had several first half chances before Steve MURRAY scored, but they fell to the trialist centre-forward whose eye wasn't in near goal. Celtic's one goal interval lead was stretched to two when big Andy RITCHIE worked his way through our stumbling defence to score a fine solo second for John Clark's men. Alistair HUNTER continued to defy our forwards before Harry HOOD scored a final goal for the Celtic Colts. The 3-0 margin tended to flatter the homesters but there was no doubt that Celtic, with Hunter, Aitken, Casey, Murray, Hood and Ritchie outstanding, were the better side. Although our youngsters didn't play well in the match against Dundee United, they might well have won the game had Ian Taylor scored with a penalty 3 minutes from the end. United 'keeper, Cooper, brought off a fine save from Taylor's spot kick to keep the scoreline level at 1-1. Our lads took the lead early in the second half when Colin McAdam nodded down a Willie McVie free kick to Bobby HAMILTON, who cracked a smart left footer in at the near post. COPLAND equalised for the Tangadice men with 15 minutes remaining and, at the end of the day, a draw was just about right. Willie McVie made a sound recovery from the injury which kept him out of the team against Celtic and he was ably supported by Isaac Farrell and Ian Kennedy at the back.

His consistently high standard of performance has meant that he has played from the start in 30 matches this season and has been substitute on 6 occasions. He is second top club scorer with 12 goals in all matches played. Until recently Vic, because of his ready smile and impressive dental features, was nicknamed "Nasher" or "Ivory" by the Motherwell players. However, after a visit to a well known film in Aberdeen prior to the league match at Pittodrie, the likeable nashgab was renamed "Jaws" by his team-mates.

TODAY we welcome Cup Holders, Celtic, to Fir Park for the third time this season. The first meeting on 13th September ended in a 1-1 draw with former Celt, Vic Davidson, scoring for Motherwell and Kenny Dalglish getting Celtic's goal. A fortnight ago in an evenly contested match, Celtic won by 3-1 with Deans (2), Dalglish and Davidson scoring.

In between these two matches, on November 15th, Motherwell went to Parkhead and recorded a fine 2-0 victory with Willie Pettigrew scoring both goals.

However, today's match is a sudden death affair and, with Celtic's tremendous cup fighting tradition, we can be sure that Sean Fallon's men will not be influenced by the results of previous Premier League encounters.

Celtic have won the Scottish Cup more times than any other club, last season's victory over Airdrie being their 24th success in the competition. Arch rivals, Rangers, have won the Cup 20 times. The last time Celtic met Motherwell in the "Scottish" was in season 1973-4 when, after a 2-2 draw, Celtic won the replay 1-0.

We are pleased to note the Celtic manager, Jock Stein, is almost back to "match fitness" but, under the charge of Assistant Manager, Sean Fallon, the following players are likely to represent Celtic in today's match:

PETER LATCHFORD (Goalkeeper)

Height 6'0", weight 12st.

Came to Parkhead on loan from West

Brom. last season and, having played consistently well, Celtic obtained his outright transfer in the close season. His two brothers play in English First Division football - Dave with Birmingham and Bob with Everton. A close friend of our own Stewart MacLaren, with whom Peter attended the Motherwell F.C. Dance last month.

DANNY McGRAIN (Full-back)

Height 5'9", weight 10st. 12lb.

Signed from Maryhill Juniors in 1968 and served a full apprenticeship in the reserves before breaking through to the league side. Made an impressive European debut against Uzpest Doza in Hungary when regular full-back Jim Craig called off and has acquired a great deal of European experience at club and international level since then. His young brother, similar in style, is also on the Celtic staff.

ANDY "KIPPER" LYNCH (Left back)

Height 5'10", weight 10st. 12lb.

Having failed to hit it off on the left wing after being signed in 1973 from Hearts, Andy was put up for transfer last season along with Vic Davidson, Jimmy Bone and Jimmy Quinn. Whereas the other three eventually left Parkhead, Andy took a step backwards to left back and has been an outstanding success. Won a cup medal last season.

PADDY McCLUSKEY (Sweeper)

Height 5'9", weight 11st. 3lb.

Another product of Maryhill Juniors who joined Celtic in 1969. Paddy is full of "patter" and is always ready with a dressing room joke. But on the field his earnest, uncompromising approach has won him a regular place in the side. Married last year and now lives in Airdrie.

RODDY McDONALD (Centre back)

Height 6'1", weight 12st. 6 lb.

Came to Parkhead from Brora Rangers in 1972 and has been groomed as successor to the legendary Billy McNeill. Billy, in fact, used to coach him in afternoons during the past couple of seasons. The advice of his former skipper has stood Roddy in

good stead as he has produced many impressive performances this season.

JOHANNES EDVALDSSON (Midfield)

Height 6'1", weight 12st. 8lb.

"Shuggie" has been an unqualified success since he signed from the Icelandic side, Valur, last August. This Iceland international has emerged as one of the outstanding players in the Premier League. An experienced campaigner who has also played in Denmark, he makes his Scottish Cup debut today. Stays in "digs" in Newton Mearns.

JACKIE McNAMARA (Midfield)

Height 5'9", weight 11st. 4lb.

Signed from Cumbernauld in 1970, and has now broken through to become a regular member of the first team pool. Has made steady progress since signing for Celtic and has scored several fine goals from midfield. Married with 2 children, he is a neighbour of Paul Wilson in Cumbernauld.

KENNY DALGLISH (Forward)

Height 5'8½", weight 10st. 10lb.

The mainspring of the Celtic side. Came to Parkhead in 1967 from Cumbernauld and is already one of the all-time "greats" in Scottish football. Club skipper who has been a regular member of Willie Ormrod's International Team over the past few seasons. An 8 handicap golfer who lives in Newton Mearns with his wife, Marina, and young daughter, Kelly. Born 4.3.51.

STEVE MURRAY (Midfield)

Height 5'8", weight 11st.

Recommended to Dundee manager, Bob Shankly, by present Motherwell chief scout, Hugh Brown. Went from Dumbarton St. Pat's school to Dens Park in 1963 where, wearing white boots, he was a "wow" in the public trial. Transferred to Aberdeen for around £50,000 and then from the Dons to Celtic in 1973 for a similar fee. Has recovered from a foot injury which forced him to give up the game for 6 months, and is now back to full match fitness.

DIXIE DEANS (Striker)

Height 5'8", weight 10st. 11lb.

Played for us at Fir Park before being transferred four years ago to Celtic for around £20,000. His bustling style is difficult to contain and he has scored a lot of goals, making him a big favourite with the Celtic fans. A chirpy practical joker. Scored 2 at Fir Park a fortnight ago.

BOBBY LENNOX (Winger)

Height 5'6", weight 10st. 10lb.

It's incredible to think that the "Buzz Bomb" made his debut for Celtic in March 1962 at inside right before a 39,000 crowd in a league match against Dundee where his immediate opponent was Craig Brown, the present Motherwell Assistant Manager. The evergreen veteran from Saltcoats is still as fast as ever and is the sole survivor of the famous Lisbon Lions.

RONNIE GLAVIN (Midfield)

Height 5'9½", weight 10st. 11lb.

Celtic's costliest ever signing. Hasn't quite recaptured the form he displayed with his former club, Partick Thistle, for whom he starred in their 4-1 League Cup victory over his present club. Took a shin knock in Celtic Reserves' 2-1 victory over Rangers a couple of weeks ago. Scored the goal against Dundee which took Celtic to the final of last season's Scottish Cup.

ANDY RITCHIE (Forward)

Height 6'0", weight 11st. 9lb.

A strong lad with a tremendous shot in his right foot. Still to claim a regular place in the first team pool, but he has tremendous potential and is one for the future at Celtic Park. Hails from Bellshill and as a pupil at Belvidere Primary and Bellshill Academy he played in school teams coached by Well Assistant Manager, Craig Brown. Married last year and has joined the Celtic colony in Cumbernauld.

On the CELTIC bench today beside Sean Fallon will be that dapper trainer, Neil MOCHAN, and highly skilled physio-therapist, Bob ROONEY.

GOLDIE GOES TO CAPIELOW

THE last transfer of 1975 was conducted on Hogmanay by boss, Willie McLean, when long-serving centre-forward John Goldthorp joined Morton for a moderate fee. 'Goldie', who had been 8½ years at Fir Park, had a lump in his throat as he said 'goodbye' to the players and trainer, Willie McKenzie. He said, "I'm extremely sorry to be leaving Motherwell but, with Willie Pettigrew doing so well, it didn't seem that I was ever going to regain my first team place. It's also a time when I must look to the future and I have reverted to part-time football to further my career as a safety officer in local steel works."

Manager, Willie McLean, was lavish in his praise of the lanky striker. "In all my years in the game I've seldom met a more genuine guy than John. He was an honest professional who worked hard and never complained when he wasn't selected for my team. I wish him well at Greenock." Craig Brown endorsed the Manager's viewpoint, "Goldie was a man of real integrity. He gave 100% effort in the reserves and was an inspiration and example to our young players, both on and off the field."

MOTHERWELL STARS GO BACK TO SCHOOL

ALTHOUGH the Fir Park gates are improving at the moment, Manager Willie McLean is by no means complacent.
