SOCIAL MISSION STATEMENT

Introduction

Celtic Football Club is legendary and as with most legends as much myth as fact surrounds its history and what the Club stands for today. The Social Mission Statement aims to simply define what the Club stands for and seeks to promote within society.

History

Celtic Football Club was founded in 1888. Its principal founder was a Marist Brother named Walfrid. The Club had two principal aims: The first aim was to raise funds to provide food for the poor of the East End of Glasgow, an area of the City that was greatly impoverished and had a high rate of infant mortality. Within the East End was a large Irish community and friction was growing between the native Glaswegians and the new influx of Irish. Brother Walfrid saw the need for social integration and his vision was a football club that Scottish and Irish, Protestants and Catholics alike could support. A new football club would be a vehicle to bring the communities together and this was the second aim. The Marist brother sought for the Club to have both a Scottish and Irish identity and hence, the Club's name "Celtic" came about, representing a bridge of cultures across the Irish Sea.

Current Positioning of Celtic Football Club

Celtic Football Club is a Scottish football club with proud Irish links. The primary business of Celtic is as a football club. It is run on a professional business basis with no political agenda. However, the Club has a wider role and the responsibility of being a major Scottish social institution promoting health, well-being and social integration.

Who is Celtic Football Club for?

Celtic Football Club is for people who want to support a football club that strives for excellence in Scotland and in Europe, is proud of its history, supportive of its local community and seeks to support the following aims: "To maximise all opportunities to disassociate the Club from sectarianism and bigotry of any kind. To promote Celtic as a Club for all people, regardless of gender, age, religion, race or ability."

Summary

Celtic is a club for everyone who believes in football as a medium for healthy pleasure, entertainment and social integration. The Club always has been and always will simply aim to be the team of the people.

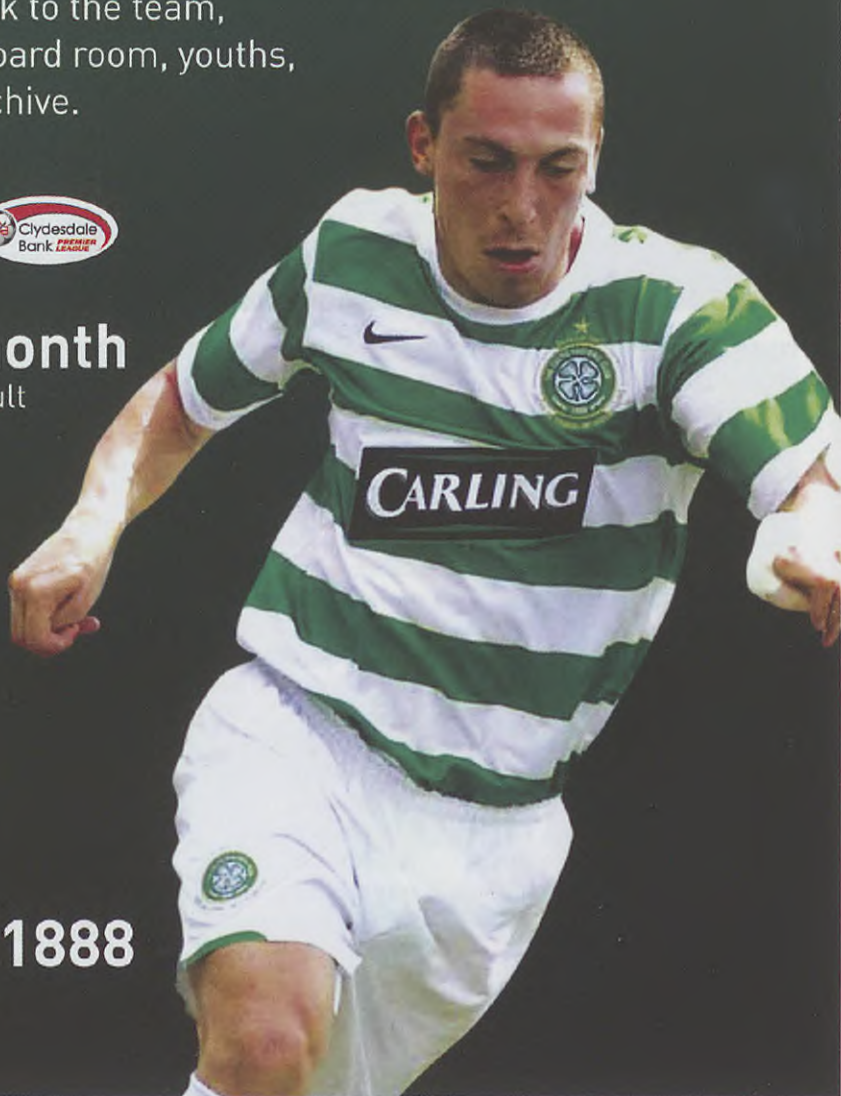

UNACCEPTABLE CONDUCT AT CELTIC PARK AND AWAY FOOTBALL STADIA

New rules have been introduced by the SFA and SPL in connection with "Unacceptable Conduct" at football stadia. The new rules form part of our Stadium Regulations. It is a condition of entry to stadia that the Stadium Regulations, including these new rules, are followed.

A summary of the new rules is set out below. Full details are available on the Celtic website at www.celticfc.net or by contacting the Customer Service Manager on 0871 226 1888.

CELTIC FOOTBALL CLUB WILL NOT TOLERATE UNACCEPTABLE CONDUCT AT CELTIC PARK OR AT AWAY FOOTBALL STADIA

- Unacceptable Conduct is conduct which is violent or disorderly
- Violent conduct includes any actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person, or intentional damage to property

Disorderly conduct includes:

- Conduct which stirs up or sustains, or is likely or is designed to stir up or sustain, hatred or ill will against or towards individuals or groups of people because of:
 - Gender
 - Colour, race, nationality (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin
 - Membership or presumed membership, of a religious group or of a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation
 - Sexual orientation
 - Transgender identity
 - Disability
- Using threatening, abusive or insulting words or conduct

- Displaying writing or any other thing which is threatening, abusive or insulting

This list is not exhaustive and must be read in conjunction with the Stadium Regulations.

ANY PERSON ENGAGING IN UNACCEPTABLE CONDUCT MAY BE SUBJECT TO ANY, OR A COMBINATION OF THE FOLLOWING:

- Removal from the Stadium
- Suspension from attending Official Matches involving Celtic Football Club
- Indefinite ban from attending Official Matches involving Celtic Football Club
- Report to the police and possible criminal proceedings

>> A WORD FROM THE CAPTAIN

BOTH sets of players this afternoon will be going all-out to win the game. We had to make a few chances because of injury, and it was good to see Mark Wilson play a full 90 minutes, when I thought he did very well.

Young Paul Caddis came on in the second-half and put in an excellent performance, while Massimo Donati slotted in well alongside Barry Robson in midfield. And it was great to see big Sami get another vital goal for us to win the game.

Finally, everyone here was delighted to see Aiden win the Scottish Professional Footballers' Association Player of the Year and Young Player of the Year

Awards. He has been outstanding for us all season and it is a terrific honour for him that his fellow professionals have voted to give him this award.

I hope you all enjoy today's game. Thanks again for your support and let's hope we can make it another memorable day for everyone.

>> TODAY'S VISITORS

THIS afternoon, Celtic face Rangers for the fourth time this season, with Celtic winning the last meeting 2-1, thanks to Jan Vennegoor of Hesselink's dramatic last-minute goal.

Ahead of the latest Glasgow derby, we take a look at some of the Rangers players who have featured for the Ibrox side over the course of the season.

ALLAN MCGREGOR

A product of the Rangers youth system, McGregor had to bide his time for a regular top-team place and had loan spells with St Johnstone and Dunfermline before finally becoming the club's No.1 goalkeeper last season. This term, McGregor has been one of Rangers' best performers and is now established in the Scotland squad. Is a major doubt for this match after picking up an injury in last week's 2-1 derby defeat.

NEIL ALEXANDER

The experienced goalkeeper joined Rangers in January to provide competition for McGregor after the departure of Roy Carroll to Derby. Alexander has played for Scotland in the past and has waited for a chance to show what he can do at Ibrox. That looks likely to come today, with McGregor expected to be missing.

KIRK BROADFOOT

Signed from St Mirren on a Bosman last summer, Broadfoot had to bide his time for a regular game with Rangers. However, the January departure of Alan Hutton opened up a gap and Broadfoot has become Rangers' first-choice right-back in recent months.

CARLOS CUELLAR

The Spanish central defender joined Rangers from Osasuna in the summer after impressing in a UEFA Cup tie between the clubs last season. Quick and solid in the air, Cuellar has had an outstanding season and joined Aiden McGeady, Barry Robson and Scott McDonald on the shortlist for the SPFA Player of the Year award, which was won by McGeady. Cuellar will miss this game through suspension after being sent off in the last derby.

DAVIE WEIR

After completing a football scholarship in America, Weir began his senior career with Falkirk and had a successful spell at Hearts before moving to Everton. He was a mainstay for the Goodison Park side for nearly eight years, before he joined Rangers in January 2007. The veteran partners Celtic captain Stephen McManus in the Scotland defence.

SASA PAPAC

Versatile Bosnian defender Papac joined Rangers from Austria Vienna in the summer of 2006 as one of Paul Le Guen's first signings. Since the start of the season, Papac has made the left-back position his own and has been a regular in the Rangers defence.

STEVEN WHITTAKER

A product of the Hibernian youth system, Whittaker is comfortable on either side of defence and midfield and has settled in well since making the summer move to Rangers. Athletic and composed on the ball, he played right-back in the second half of last week's derby at Celtic Park.

CHRISTIAN DAILLY

Man of many clubs, Dailly started his career with Dundee United and has since played with Blackburn, Derby, Southampton, West Ham and now Rangers. Versatile and experienced, Dailly once played, and scored, for Celtic in the Ronnie Moran Testimonial against Liverpool in 2000. Is expected to partner Davie Weir in central defence today.

BRAHIM HEMDANI

Formerly of Strasbourg and Marseilles, the cultured French-Algerian midfielder joined Rangers in the summer of 2005. Comfortable in defence and midfield, Hemdani has been used sparingly in the SPL this season, although he has played in almost every one of the club's European games.

BARRY FERGUSON

The Rangers captain made his debut for the club back in 1997 and became a regular in the side 12 months later ▶

when Dick Advocaat took over from Walter Smith. After establishing himself at Ibrox and enjoying success, Ferguson moved to Blackburn Rovers in 2003, before returning north 18 months later. He remains an influential player for Rangers.

KEVIN THOMSON

After a short spell at Coventry as a youngster, Thomson played with Hibernian for six years, before joining Rangers at the start of 2007. This season, he has been a virtual ever-present - teaming up with Barry Ferguson in central midfield. Missed last week's derby and is again suspended for today's match.

LEE McCULLOCH

McCulloch started his senior career at Motherwell and made his name as a target-man, before swapping the Steelmen for rising English side Wigan - who he helped reach the Premiership. McCulloch returned to Scotland with Rangers last summer and has become a key player in the wide midfield areas. The midfielder is expected to miss today's match through injury.

CHARLIE ADAM

After coming through the ranks at Rangers, Adam moved to St Mirren on loan in 2005, after a similar spell at Ross County. He returned to play a major role under Paul Le Guen and has continued to feature under Walter Smith. Adam is a real danger at set-pieces. Adam looks likely to miss the remainder of the season through injury.

STEVE DAVIS

The midfielder started his career at Aston Villa, where he broke into the Premiership side's first-team and earned rave reviews in his early days. From Villa Park, he moved to Fulham, before joining Rangers on loan in January. He has made an immediate impact at Ibrox.

NACHO NOVO

The Spanish striker joined Rangers in 2004 and initially formed a productive partnership with Dado Prso in his first season. Since then, Novo has been used in a number of positions, most recently on the

right side of midfield. He started his career in Scotland with Raith Rovers and Dundee.

JEAN-CLAUDE DARCHEVILLE

The French striker joined Rangers last summer and has become a fans' favourite at Ibrox. Powerful and totally committed, Darcheville has had his injury problems but remains a key player for Rangers. He played with Bordeaux prior to moving to Scotland. Darcheville is Rangers' first-choice striker.

KRIS BOYD

Signed by Alex McLeish in January 2006, Boyd has continued the prolific form he showed with Kilmarnock at Rangers. An instinctive, penalty-box poacher, he found a regular start hard to come by this season, but normally delivers when called upon.

DANIEL COUSIN

The Gabonese hitman was recruited at the start of the season from RC Lens and has played his part for the Ibrox club this season. Well suited to the lone striker role, Cousin almost joined Fulham in January before FIFA regulations halted the move. He has recently recovered from a broken jaw and scored the decisive penalty in Rangers' Scottish Cup semi-final win over St Johnstone.

STEVEN NAISMITH

The Scotland Under-21 captain made his name with Kilmarnock and, after months of speculation, finally joined Rangers in the last hours of the summer transfer window. Fast and with an eye for goal, Naismith has been used in a variety of positions in his first season at Ibrox. The striker is another injury doubt for today's match.

CHRIS BURKE

The winger made his Rangers breakthrough as a teenager and has gone on to be a regular over the last few years. Has been in and out of the side this season, but is normally used on the right side of midfield. Burke could miss today's match after picking up an injury in Rangers' Scottish Cup semi-final against St Johnstone.

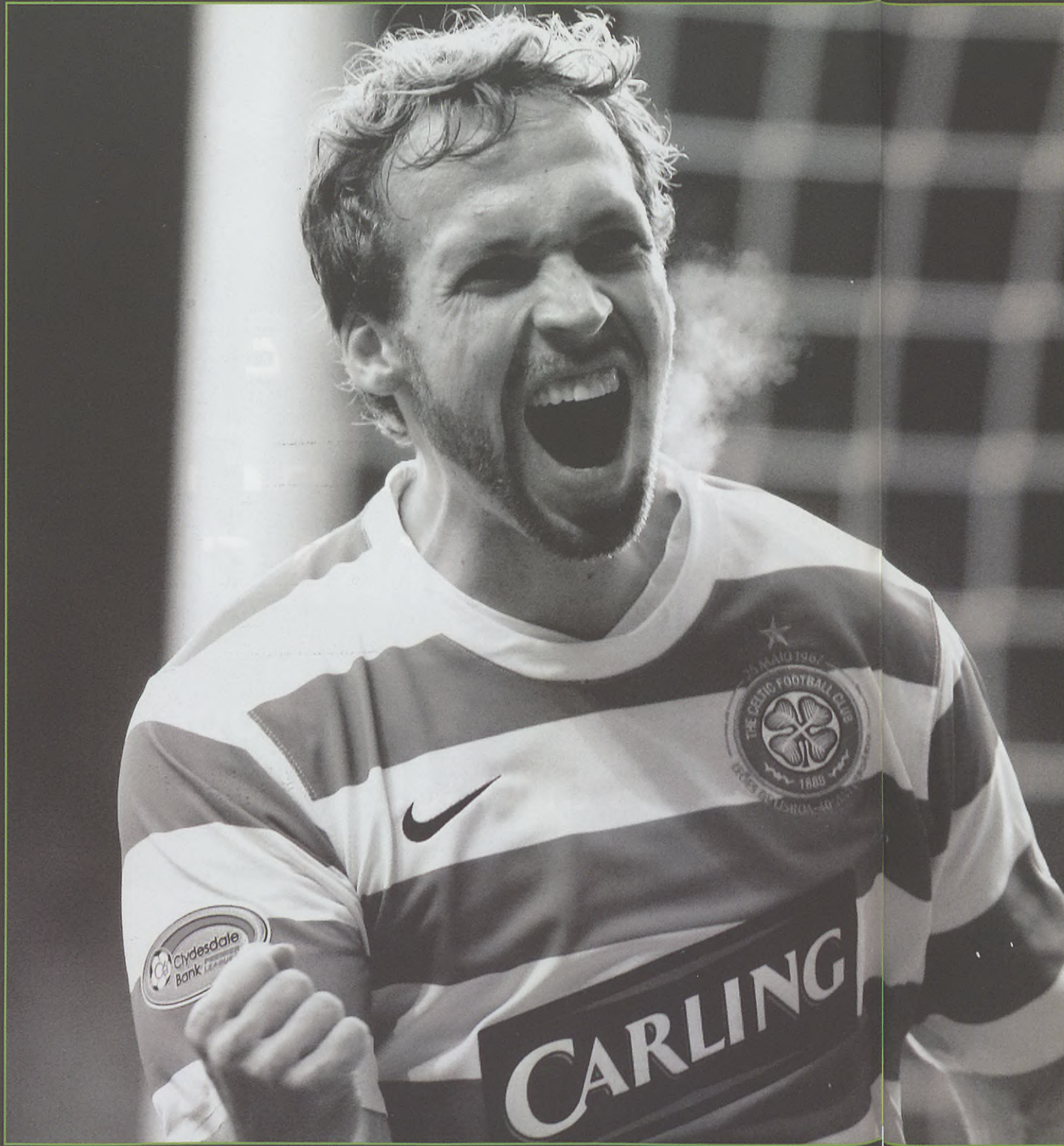

EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW: GREGOR KYLE

IN BROAD TERMS IT MEANS 'LEAP AHEAD THROUGH CELTIC' AND THAT IS WHAT ANDREAS HINKEL PLANS TO DO TODAY - BOTH ON A PERSONAL LEVEL AND AT THE TOP OF THE TABLE

WHEN the curtain eventually closes on this season, Andreas Hinkel will have spent a dramatic five months riding a rollercoaster of emotion at his new club in Glasgow.

During that time he will also have succeeded in establishing himself as something of a derby day 'veteran', with his courage and ability having been tried and tested in this tense triple-header of meetings with Rangers.

That first experience at Ibrox proved to be a frustrating one for the 26-year-old right-back, who saw one stunning effort inspire a wonder save from Rangers goalkeeper Alan McGregor during that 1-0 defeat.

The second 'leg' proved to be far more satisfying, though, and as Hinkel explained, having won that game 2-1 and subsequently leapfrogging Rangers at the top of the table following last weekend's win over Aberdeen, the challenge now is to maintain the momentum and once again crank up the pressure on their city rivals.

"I think the derbies are the highlights of the season, particularly for the Celtic supporters and all the fans in Glasgow, because the city is split between the two clubs," Hinkel told the Matchday programme.

"I don't really know how the league has gone in the past couple of years, in terms of the actual competition, but this year it is very close. That closeness makes the derbies even more important.

"I think that everyone who is interested in football knows something about this derby. It is famous all over the world.

"I know from playing here with Stuttgart and watching the games as a Celtic player that the European games are something special. But I think that the derby atmosphere is a little better - it's louder and more emotional."

Having watched previous Glasgow derbies from afar, Hinkel is rightly pleased with how he has coped with the challenge so far.

The German internationalist did, of course, arrive with Bundesliga experience in his homeland with Stuttgart and from the Spanish La Liga with Sevilla, but he anticipated a very different test when he arrived at his new club in Scotland.

Looking back on those past performances, the defender was reluctant to focus on his individual role, but instead turned his attention on the team as a whole, commenting: "I don't like to speak about my performances, but I think I did okay.



"EVERYONE UNDERSTANDS THAT AFTER THE LEAGUE SPLIT, THE GAMES ARE HARDER AND THE SEASON BEGINS TO TAKE ITS TOLL, MENTALLY AND PHYSICALLY AND BECAUSE OF THAT, ANYTHING CAN HAPPEN."

"We won the game at home and that was very important for us, to keep alive our chances of winning the league, because if we lost that I think it would have been over.

"But after the game at Ibrox I was a little bit disappointed with the result, because I think that we played very well, especially in the first half.

"Now we have one game remaining against Rangers and this is a very important game for us and if we win it will put more pressure on Rangers.

"That's important, because I don't think this final run of games is going to be easy for anyone in the top six as there are important games there for every team.

"Everyone is looking forward to this game," added Hinkel, "because I think it's normal for every team in the world to have a bad run of games in the season.

"I think and I hope that we had our bad run a few weeks ago, games where we played well but had bad results.

"The league is not in our hands anymore, but all that we can do is win our games and if we do that we at least have a chance. But like I said, it's not in our hands anymore."

Throughout that testing run of draws and defeats, the challenge for the players and management was to keep their heads while everyone around was losing theirs and as Hinkel explained, this required a certain amount of thick skin and determination.

"It was frustrating, because if you play badly you know the reasons why you don't win," continued Hinkel.

"It was much more frustrating in our position, because we felt like we couldn't do anything. We trained well, we were playing well, but we weren't winning games. You are left

asking yourself, 'what can I do? Should I train harder? Should I train less?'

"Sometimes it's better to play badly when you are losing, because you can at least say that 'I did this, this and this wrong', you can analyse it.

"But through this run we were calm, we didn't panic and we knew that we had had been playing well, we were creating chances to score and we just had to stay focused.

"After the defeat to Motherwell a lot of people thought that the league was over, but in football anything can happen.

"Everyone understands that after the league split, the games are harder and the season begins to take its toll, mentally and physically and because of that, anything can happen. ▶

"Like I said, in football anything can happen and over the past few years there have been many strange and unbelievable results.

"Look at the UEFA Champions League final between Manchester United and Bayern Munich - Bayern were in the lead with two minutes to go but lost that final.

"Even recently there was the game between Bayern and Getafe in the UEFA Cup, where they were 3-1 behind in extra-time and came back to win, so you never know what's going to happen.

"It's just important that you stay positive and with that in mind, it was important that we beat Rangers at Celtic Park. You can see that this win has given everyone a boost."

This afternoon's result will have a considerable bearing on just how successful a season it is for Hinkel, his team-mates and the thousands of faithful supporters who pack into Celtic Park.

With no leeway in the title run-in, the players are acutely aware of the enormity of the task that lies before them, but for Hinkel this additional pressure and desire to win and compete was one of his main motivations for moving to Glasgow.

"When I look back I can say it was the right decision to move here," he said. "I am very happy to be here, I have met a lot of good people, I have learnt a lot of new things and I am enjoying a different style of football.

"It was a good decision to come here and I enjoy the style of football.

"In modern football, it is more complex and you need every single quality," added Hinkel when asked if he enjoyed the attacking responsibilities that are thrust upon the full-backs at Celtic Park.

"A striker is not just a striker in modern football, he must also defend and help create opportunities for the team.

"You need so many things and the first quality is fitness, you have to be fit and healthy. You can't just run around though, you also need to play with your head and stay calm.

"There are so many emotions in matches, especially in the derby, but you have to concentrate on your game.

"As a youth I played in so many different positions. I started as a striker, played in midfield and then went through every position in the defence between the ages of 10 and 18. I played every position except in goals!

"I am enjoying my football at Celtic and you are encouraged to go forward, but my first priority is in the defence.

"I have to stop crosses and defend well against my opponent and if I do that, I can then look to get forward and create something, which is a big plus for the team.

"But defending is the most important thing and if you can shut off one entire side of the park to the opposition, you make it very difficult for them to play."

HISTORY

ON THIS DAY IN

2003

CELTIC'S most recent game on this date was five years ago when the Hoops travelled to Ibrox for a match that has been christened 'The Beachball Game.'

This was the original and the best and the reason for the holiday hullabaloo was that, just three days earlier, the Hoops had returned from a grueling UEFA Cup semi-final when a Henrik Larsson goal 10 minutes from time against Boavista sent Celtic to Sevilla.

The team or the supporters barely had time to draw breath before this derby encounter was upon them, although the punters in the Broomloan Road end had enough time to get decked out in goggles and flippers and the players had an extra breather while various inflatables were removed from the pitch.

There was a scare as early as the ninth minute when Rab Douglas took a knock and had to be replaced in goal by Javier Sanchez Broto but the Celts weathered the storm.

The Hoops went ahead when Lorenzo Amoruso clumsily barged John Hartson as the Welshman made to go past him in the box, Alan Thompson kept his cool to convert the spot kick.

Arthur Numan patted the midfielder on the back during his run-up, while Thompson revealed other cat calls from the Rangers players were designed to put him off.

The second goal was the sum of an exquisite move. Neil Lennon started it when he flicked the ball to Didier

Agathe on the right and the winger embarked on a one-two with Hartson before haring down the flank.

Agathe skipped past a challenge from Peter Lovenkrands as well as a despairing lunge from Artur Numan before cutting the ball into the box where a clever flick from Henrik Larsson met Hartson who calmly slotted past Stefan Klos.

1940

JOCK Morrison played his final game for the club on this day in 1940 as a 1-0 away defeat to Ayr United in Celtic's penultimate league game of the season ended his 11-year association with the club.

After signing in October 1929 from Croy Celtic after being recommended by the great Jimmy Quinn, the left-back made his debut in a 1-0 home win over Aberdeen in December of the following year.

He was a passenger in every sense of the word for the Scottish Cup holders' much-vaunted tour of the USA but it wasn't until midway through the decade that he could be truly termed a first-team fixture.

In all he made 200 appearances for the club, with 22 of those arriving in the early days of wartime football, but he only ever scored one goal.

That came in a 4-0 home league win over Hibernian in season 1934/35 when he scored from the spot with the other goals coming from Jimmy McGrory, Jimmy Delaney and Malky MacDonald.

Jock won two Championships and one Scottish Cup

while with Celtic as well as a couple of Charity Cup medals, the Glasgow Cup and the Empire Exhibition Cup.

1929

ON Ne'erday 1912, Larkhall Thistle's 17-year-old full-back, Willie McStay, had a trial with Tottenham Hotspur, but before the year was a fortnight old he had signed on with Celtic.

The first of the famous McStay dynasty to grace the Paradise turf, Willie spent the best part of two decades at the club.

He made his debut in a 5-1 away league win over St Mirren at the start of the 1916/17 season and that was the first of 446 appearances during which he scored 39 goals.

Willie took over from Willie Cringan as club captain in season 1923/24 and held that position until 1929 when his younger brother Jimmy took up the skipper's role.

His final game came on this day in 1929 though when Celtic finished their league season with a trip to Kilmarnock where a crowd of 5,000 saw the Bhoys win 3-2.

Jimmy McGrory, Paddy Connolly and Willie Hughes got the goals that gave Willie McStay a winning leaving present but that was one of **EIGHT** consecutive away games right at the end of the season for the Hoops thanks to a fire at Celtic Park.

He finished with an impressive four Championships and three Scottish Cups as well as picking up 13 Scotland caps and 10 Scottish League caps.

1918

CELTIC beat Clydebank 2-0 at home in the semi-final of the War Fund Cup on this day in front of a crowd of 10,000 after beating Queen's Park 2-1 at the same venue a week earlier while 12,000 looked on.

The final went ahead at Hampden Park on May 4 and a crowd of 20,000 saw Patsy Gallagher score the only goal of the game as Celtic lifted this one-off trophy.

1907

JUST like Croy Bhoys Jimmy Quinn had tipped Celtic off about local talent in the shape of Jock Morrison, Jimmy Dun Hay did likewise over two decades earlier when he spotted Jimmy Weir in his Ayrshire homeland.

The similarity doesn't end there though as Weir was also a full-back and, in typical defender's style, he only scored one goal in his Celtic career before moving on to Middlesbrough in 1910.

That goal came in his final season and, just like Morrison, it was also from the spot, this time in a 3-2 away league win at Port Glasgow with the other goals coming from Peter Johnstone and the Mighty Quinn.

It was on this day in 1907 that he made his debut though as Quinn scored in a 1-1 league draw with St Mirren watched by 7,000 here at Celtic Park.

That was the first of 96 games in the Hoops as he played his part in four of six successive Championships and the 1908 Scottish Cup final 5-1 win over St Mirren. ▶

The week before his debut, the Celts beat Hearts 3-0 in the 1907 Scottish Cup final and in 1909, Weir played in both of the 'finals' against Rangers when the cup was withheld.

In securing the 1908/09 Championship, Weir was part of the Celtic side that played 12 games in April and the last **EIGHT** games of the Championship were played in 11 days.

This was a sign of things to come when, in season 1915/16, Celtic were forced by the league to play **TWO** games in one day - they won both on the way to the title.

1899

CELTIC legend Adam McLean was born in Greenock on this day in 1899 but spent his formative years in the West End of Glasgow as a Partick Thistle fan - he would be 34-years-old though before reaching Firhill as a player.

He spent 11 years with Celtic and had spells with Sunderland and Aberdeen before returning to his roots but he will forever be remembered as Hoops great.

The outside-left made his debut in a home 1-1 league draw with Dumbarton in January 1917 just three days after joining from Juvenile football.

He was to go on and play 408 times for Celtic, scoring 138 goals in the process.

During his time at Celtic Park he won three Championships and three Scottish Cups as well as four Scottish caps and three Scottish league caps.

1895

CELTIC'S first ever game on this day came in 1895 when Clyde were welcomed on league duty by a crowd of 5,000.

Willie Ferguson and Mick Dunbar got the goals at Celtic Park in a 2-0 win for the Bhoys and they would follow that up the following week with a 2-1 win over Dundee in their final league game.

In their very last game of the season, the Celts beat Rangers 4-0 in the Charity Cup final to add to the 2-0 Glasgow Cup win over the Ibrox side earlier in the season.

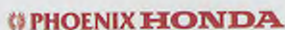

YOUNG PLAYER OF THE YEAR

A NEW and bright young star is guaranteed to step up to the podium this year and claim the Young Player of the Year award, with record-breaking three-time winner, Aiden McGeady, no longer in the running.

With the Irishman having turned 22 this season he is no longer eligible, leaving an impressive list of on-form young hopefuls to fight it out for the accolade.

Two recognised first-team players, Evander Sno and Darren O'Dea, are both in the hunt, with 19-year-old right back Paul Caddis another firm favourite, having stole the show on his debut against Kilmarnock at Rugby Park and produced a solid performance in the home game against Barcelona in the UEFA Champions League.

Willie McStay's reserve side is also well represented in the list of nominees, with Ryan Conroy, Scott Cuthbert and Michael McGlinchey having been involved with the first team in recent years, while Scott Fox, Mark Millar and Diarmuid O'Carroll having emerged as outstanding and consistent performers this season.

Also in the running are Under-19 stars, Kevin Cawley and Richie Towell, with the diminutive Cawley top scorer for John McLaughlan's youths and the 16-year-old Towell having surpassed every expectation.

SHUNSUKE NAKAMURA
v Falkirk
Falkirk Stadium (11/8/07)

Celtic's second league game of the season also saw the Hoops get off the mark in the scoring charts after the disappointment of a goal-less draw against Kilmarnock on the opening day of the season. Falkirk were the opposition and after just four minutes they took the lead through Michael Higdon. But a goal either side of half-time put the Celts in front before Shunsuke Nakamura stepped up with 10 minutes to go to make the points secure with a trademark free-kick. Jan Vennegoor of Hesselink was brought down just outside the box, with the Falkirk defender red-carded as a result, and Naka stepped up to fire home another sublime set-piece.

PAUL HARTLEY
v Spartak Moscow

Paul Hartley's only goal for Celtic so far proved to be a vital one as it helped the Hoops qualify for the group stages of the UEFA Champions League. v Inverness Caley Thistle

Shunsuke Nakamura weighed in with another spectacular strike though this one wasn't from a set-piece. Picking up a lay-off from Scott McDonald the Japanese playmaker stepped forward and unleashed a stunning 30-yard effort that was in the top corner before the Caley keeper even had time to move. It was the goal which made the points secure for Celtic, who went on to add another two goals before the end of the game.

v AC Milan

Hat-trick hero Aiden McGeady was in sparkling form as Celtic defeated Falkirk 4-0. He scored the first of his three



goals just before half-time and then the pick of the bunch came on the 68th minute when the Irishman conjured a goal up out of nothing. Picking the ball up wide on the left-hand side, McGeady dribbled across the edge of the Falkirk penalty box before curling an exquisite shot beyond the reach of the Falkirk goalkeeper and into the far corner of the net. For good measure, he made it 4-0 and completed his hat-trick with eight minutes of the match remaining in what was an impressive Man of the Match performance.

GEORGIOS SAMARAS
v Kilmarnock

A debut goal from the Greek internationalist as Celtic crushed Kilmarnock 5-1 at Rugby Park to move into the next round of the Scottish Cup. The Hoops were leading 4-1 when Georgios Samaras made his first

appearance, coming on as a substitute for two-goal hero Scott McDonald. And with five minutes of the match remaining, Samaras opened his goalscoring account for Celtic. SCOTT McDONALD

Scott McDonald was the man who scored the goal but this counter, a header at the far post just a couple of yards out, will forever be remembered for a sublime piece of skill from Aiden McGeady. The Irishman was outstanding throughout the afternoon

as Celtic crushed Aberdeen 5-1 and this goal just three minutes after half-time was a bit special. McGeady took a Nakamura pass inside the box and despite being surrounded by Aberdeen defenders, spun past them with an audacious turn before chipping the ball to the back post where McDonald was lurking to head the ball home. McDonald took the acclaim for having finished the move but it was McGeady's outrageous piece of skill which took many of the plaudits.

BARRY ROBSON
v Aberdeen
Pittodrie (10/2/08)

Barry Robson wrote himself into the Celtic history books when he became the first Hoops player to score with his first ever kick of the ball for the club. Coming on as a substitute for Shunsuke Nakamura with 16 minutes of the match remaining, Robson's first



act was to take a free-kick that Celtic had been awarded some 25 yards out. This would normally be Nakamura territory but Robson proved to be more than an able deputy, stepping up and curling a left-foot shot into the back of the Aberdeen net to make it 5-1 for Celtic and ensure his unique place in the club's long and illustrious history.

v Barcelona

A night of high drama at Celtic Park as the Hoops hosted Barcelona in the first leg of their UEFA Champions League last 16 clash. And despite the Catalan giants dominating proceedings from the start of the game, it was Celtic who took the lead after 16 minutes. Following good work between Aiden McGeady and Scott McDonald, the Australian striker laid the ball back to Lee Naylor, whose first-time cross was perfectly met by the head of Jan Vennegoor of Hesselink, who showed great anticipation in getting between the Barca defenders to bullet home the ball and give the Hoops a 1-0 lead, much to the delight of the Celtic support.

SHUNSUKE NAKAMURA

v St Mirren

Another Shunsuke Nakamura late show which gave Celtic a 1-0 victory over St Mirren at Love Street. The Japanese midfielder, who had come on as a substitute for Barry Robson, won the free-kick himself with just three minutes of the match remaining and the game still goal-less. Dusting himself down, Naka stepped forward and, from the edge of the box, curled in a perfect ball that evaded the St Mirren goalkeeper and nestled in the back of the net to give Celtic the three points. It was another moment of magic from the Japanese genius and proved once again just how valuable he is to the Celtic cause.

If you're only going to score one goal for Celtic then you may as well make it a good one and that's exactly what Lee Naylor did in this game at Easter Road. With the game level at 0-0, the defender decided to open his account for the Hoops, gathering the ball just inside the Hibernian half, surging forward and then, having got the break of the ball after trying to play in Jan Vennegoor of Hesselink, fired home a superb finish with his weaker right-foot that gave Celtic a 1-0 lead. No-one was more surprised at the goal than Naylor himself but he was happy to take the acclaim from his equally surprised but still delighted team-mates.

SHUNSUKE NAKAMURA

v Rangers

He's the set-piece expert but will Shunsuke Nakamura ever score a better goal than this one against Rangers from open play? Twenty minutes were on the clock in the derby clash against Rangers when he latched on to a pass from Gary Caldwell and, as the ball rose on the bounce, Naka hit the sweetest of shots that sent the ball twisting one way and then the other to mesmerise Allan McGregor in the Rangers goal and give Celtic a 1-0 lead. A remarkable goal from a remarkable player.

From The Great Unknown TO THE TWILIGHT ZONE

THERE WAS A DASH OF DERBY DEBUT DAZE FOR LUBO MORAVCIK, NOT TO MENTION AN UNSUSPECTING PUBLIC, WHEN HE FACED RANGERS FOR THE FIRST TIME - WE ALL KNOW BETTER NOW

THE ball bulged the rigging and there was sheer bedlam inside Celtic Park, save for one figure in green and white. Lubo Moravcik stood there motionless, taking it all in.

It was November 21, 1998, and the Slovakian magician was making his derby debut. Standing in the tunnel pre-match, alongside the Rangers players, he admits he felt more nervous than he ever had done before.

Yet, he needn't have worried. Some 11 minutes into the game and he was on his way to becoming a Celtic legend, with the first goal of a double in the 5-1 rout. Minutes after half-time, he scored again. A star was born.

"I was actually a little bit scared before my first game against Rangers," said Moravcik, as he spoke exclusively to the Matchday Programme.

"WE HAD SOME FANTASTIC PLAYERS AND THEY WERE ALL PLAYING WITH CONFIDENCE. THAT LAST GAME AT IBROX, WHEN WE WON 3-0, JUST SUMMED UP THE SEASON. IT SHOWED WHAT WE WERE CAPABLE OF!"

"When I scored the first goal, my feeling was joy. But because I'd been apprehensive before the game, I just didn't know what to do or how to celebrate.

"I couldn't believe that it had happened. It was the same with the second goal - I was stunned, and because of that I couldn't express my real pleasure.

"We went on to win 5-1 and it was one of the best games of my time at Celtic. To be honest, nobody expected us to win like that.

"Before the game, I never expected it to be so massive. There was so much coverage in the newspapers before the game and people were also criticising me, and asking why Celtic had signed me.

"With all that going on, I was really happy with the way the game went. After the first game, the rest of the derbies were easier for me and I played in some memorable games."

Moravcik, signed by Dr Jo Venglos in October 1998, was something of an unknown quantity before his first derby, but by the time Celtic prepared to face Rangers on August 27, 2000, he was one of the most influential players in the Hoops squad.

As he reflects on that sunny day in Paradise, when Celtic romped to a 6-2 win over Rangers, Moravcik thinks back to the exact moment when the balance of power in Glasgow shifted.

Prior to that season - 2000/01 - Rangers had been the dominant force in Scotland for well over a decade. That 6-2 win for Celtic helped change the course of Scottish

football history. Since then, the Hoops have won five leagues out of seven.

"It was the dawn of a new era," he said. "After the 6-2 game, everything changed. Before then, Rangers had dominated the derbies and the league for many years.

"Winning the 6-2 game signalled the start of a new story and a successful time for Celtic, which has been maintained for the last seven years.

"It was a fantastic day and we rounded off that treble-winning season in a similar way - winning 3-0 at Ibrox. I was lucky enough to score twice.

"For the players and fans, it was a fantastic season for Celtic Football Club. We won everything and we did it in style. ►

"We had some fantastic players and they were all playing with confidence. That last game at Ibrox, when we won 3-0, just summed up the season. It showed what we were capable of."

With 35 goals in 129 appearances, Moravcik - who won four domestic trophies with Celtic - proved to be a shrewd signing for the club.

Under Venglos, the Slovak was a shining light during a difficult season, while he prospered in the early days of Martin O'Neill's reign, offering something different from the established midfield trio of Neil Lennon, Stan Petrov and Paul Lambert.

There are numerous highlights from his time at Celtic. With either foot, he had the ability to score from almost any distance, while he was more than capable of trapping a football with virtually any part of his body.

Yet, think back to Moravcik's time at Celtic and your mind automatically turns to his performances against Rangers. In those derbies, he often came alive and was instrumental in some of the biggest Celtic wins of all time.

"I think it's a special game between two big clubs," he said. "Everyone in the world knows all about the rivalry between Celtic and Rangers."

"This afternoon, you could go to almost every country in the world and the game will be shown live. That shows how popular the game is and how special it can be."

"It's a special day for the whole football family and it was an honour to play in that game during my time at Celtic. To score four goals was even more special."

Today, Moravcik will settle down in his Slovakian home,

turn on the television, and sit enthralled as he watches the feast of football in from of him.

It goes without saying that he'd love to be out there playing, and what a thought that is - Moravcik in his prime, teaming up with Aiden McGeady and Shunsuke Nakamura.

However, he'll settle for a watching brief and believes Celtic have the ability to attain another famous derby victory, and ensure the title goes right to the wire.

"This is such an important game for both clubs," he said. "There is still a chance for Celtic to beat Rangers to the title and, while it's not going to be easy, I think it all hinges on this game."

"I've not managed to see Celtic too much this season. However, I watched a lot of the UEFA Champions League games and I was impressed."

"They were drawn in a difficult group and did well to qualify for the last 16. Then, they had to play Barcelona and they couldn't have asked for a tougher game."

"Overall, though, I think Celtic had a good European campaign, and hopefully they can now finish on a high in Scotland."

"They have won the league for the last two years and if they win this game against Rangers, then they will have a great chance to do it again."

"All the Celtic players can do is try to put as much pressure on Rangers as possible. At this time, Celtic are not the favourites, but one win can change everything."

"It will be a fantastic game, with so much at stake. A few weeks ago, nobody really expected Celtic to be able to catch Rangers. If they win today, the league will become really interesting."

LAUNCH OF THE CELTIC COMMUNITY ACADEMY FOR GIRLS IN GLASGOW

UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY FOR GIRLS TO WEAR THE HOOPS

FOUNDATION PROGRAMME

FOR children aged 5 to under-9 (minimum age 5) there are Foundation clubs, where the girls train once a week at their local centre. From time to time, they'll get a chance to pit their wits and skills against other Foundation Clubs in festivals at a central venue. It's never too young to learn to play the game. Here's a chance for girls from age five onwards to practise their co-ordination skills, learn about teamwork, and interact with others of their own age. Perhaps the most important aspect is being introduced early to a regular, progressive regime of physical activity.

STAIRWAY TO SEVEN

TAKING EACH GAME AS IT COMES CAN TAKE CELTIC'S RESERVE SIDE STEP BY STEP TO ANOTHER CONSECUTIVE CHAMPIONSHIP AFTER WINNING THE PREVIOUS SIX ON THE TROT

MICHAEL McGLINCHEY admits this has already been the most bizarre reserve league campaign he's ever been involved in.

Now the midfielder wants to make sure it's memorable for all the right reasons as he targets a seventh successive championship for Celtic at this level.

Since the start of the season back in August, the young Hoops have had to contend with a staggering 14 postponements and currently have five scheduled games remaining.

Yet, that hasn't stopped Willie McStay's men from making

a late title charge - after being stuck in mid-table midway through the campaign.

Now, after eight wins on the bounce, they are just two points behind leaders St Mirren - with two games in hand.

For McGlinchey and his team-mates, the title is a distinct possibility and they are determined to make the most of a hectic end to the season by getting their hands on some silverware.

He said: "Usually at this stage of the season, all the games are finished and it's a case of training, trying to get into the first-team squad, and preparing for the Hong Kong tournament.

"This season - it's all different. We're still trying to impress the manager, but we can do that in games instead of training. I've been playing for the reserves for a few years now and we've never had this many games left at this time of the year.

"I was away on loan at Dunfermline for three months earlier this season and I think I only missed one game. That's incredible.

"We still have five matches left, but I'm buzzing because of it. The more games, the merrier, because no-one likes the season to be cut short.

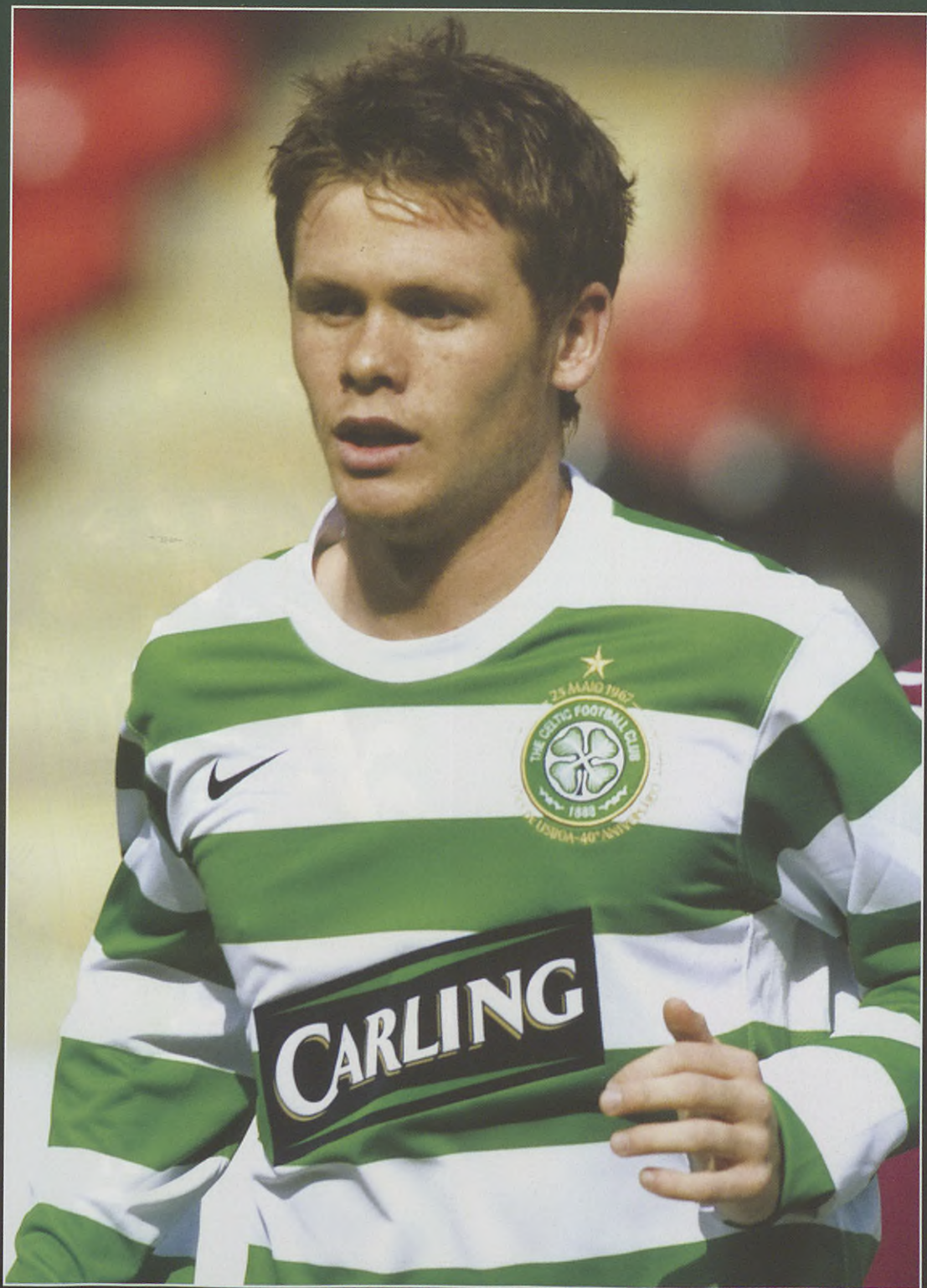
"They are coming thick and fast and it's great to be getting a run like this and getting so many games played.

"The boys are all determined to win the league. That would make it seven-in-a-row and it would be a fantastic achievement.

"All credit to St Mirren, because they've set the pace all season, but we want to pip them at the post.

"It's not been an easy season, but we beat them twice in must-win games and we have to maintain that form for the rest of the season. We're in the driving seat now and we just need to go on from here."

The latest victory for the reserves came on Monday night when McStay's men secured a pivotal 3-0 win over the Buddies at the Excelsior Stadium. ►

Paul McGowan opened the scoring with an exquisite chip and McGlinchey fired home a killer second before the break. Chris Killen rounded off the scoring after half-time.

"It was great to get a goal," said McGlinchey. "That was my first since the game against Motherwell in November, so it was a bit of relief as well.

"It was a great move on the right and Koki Mizuno played a superb ball through to me. I controlled it and then hesitated a bit.

"I think the defender must have thought I was going to shoot first-time, because he dived in. That gave me some space and I just spotted the corner.

"I decided to go for it and the ball went straight into the bottom corner. It was a good feeling and an important goal at a crucial time.

"To be honest, it probably was a bit unfair on St Mirren. They had played really well in the first half, but there we were, sitting in the dressing-room at half-time, 2-0 up.

"Gowzer's goal was something else. When he moved forward, I thought he would try the chip and that's what he did. It was brilliant.

"Then I managed to get the second and we were in control of the game. It was harsh on St Mirren, but it just shows you what can happen when you take your chances.

"To be fair to our defence, they restricted St Mirren to a lot of long-range strikes. They didn't really get in behind us, but our finishing was the difference."

While St Mirren did give a good account of themselves in the first period, Celtic's performance levels upped after the break and McGlinchey partly attributes that to the players getting used to the difficult Excelsior pitch.

Naturally, at this stage of the season, the surface was dry and rutted. It made it hard for flair players like McGlinchey to run with the ball, but Celtic played much better in the second 45 minutes, when they started to move possession quicker.

He said: "The second-half performance was a lot better and I think that was partly because we got used to the pitch. It was really dry and bumpy, and we had to concentrate on our touch. It made you look quite silly at times.

"In the second half, we got used to it. Willie McStay had told us to be sharper and play the ball quicker. It had to be one, or two-touch, stuff and that's what we did after half-time."

With those five scheduled games remaining, Celtic's title bid remains on course. Having won six consecutive leagues at this level, the Hoops were never going to surrender their championship easily.

In recent weeks, their determination has been there for all to see, with McStay's men in the midst of an impressive run of form.

"We've won eight games in a row and that's a great run at any level," said McGlinchey. "We had to beat Rangers in a massive match and we did that.

"We then had to beat St Mirren twice and we managed that as well. Now we have five games left and it's all there for us. We know if we win all those games, we'll win the league so that has to be the aim.

"We've put ourselves in a good position and we now need to capitalise on it. It's been a strange season, but we have the chance to finish on a high."

CELTIC travel to Fir Park next weekend for their second successive away game at the Lanarkshire venue.

The Boys will be keen to re-enact something similar to that visit a couple of weeks ago when they recorded a 4-1 scoreline over Mark McGhee's side who are still very much in contention for that coveted third-place spot.

They set their stall out a week before that Fir Park game when they defeated Celtic 1-0 here in the East End of Glasgow but a week later on the bruised and battered surface of Well's pitch, it was the Hoops who came to the fore.

Thanks to a double from Jan Vennegoor of Hesselink and a strike from Scott McDonald that added to the opener from Stephen McManus, the Celts won the game 4-1.

In the previous game against the Steelmen here at Celtic Park back in October when the teams met for the first time this season, a healthy 3-0 win was clocked up by the Hoops.

And it was former Fir Park favourite, and this season's top scorer, Scott McDonald who grabbed the limelight on the day by helping himself to a hat-trick.

He, of course, added to that in the most recent meeting in Lanarkshire and he will be looking to increase on that tally next week.

S HUNSUKE Nakamura's magnificent strike in the most recent meeting between today's teams sparked an affable debate among supporters - was it the best Celtic goal against Rangers ever?

Ever since Neilly McCallum sparked the whole thing off by netting Celtic's first ever goal - the club's debut game being a 5-2 win over Rangers on May 28, 1888 - these goals and games have come under their own peculiar scrutiny.

A goal against Rangers is celebrated with 10 times as much fervour than any other, even if it is bundled over the line.

That reaction is magnified intensely when the goal really is a belter - such as Naka's a week-and-a-half ago.

So, in no particular order, and with no great deal of analysis behind the selection process, we take a look at 10 great goals against Rangers

1. Henrik Larsson - 6-2 - Celtic Park, August 27, 2000

Probably the greatest derby goal of all-time and one that perfectly encapsulated Rangers' humiliation and misery during this memorable demolition at Celtic Park. This was a strike that will be relived in perpetuity by Celtic supporters: the long ball forward that was laid off by Chris Sutton, Henrik Larsson picking it up some 40 yards out and dinking it between Bert Konterman's legs before lifting the most delicate of chips over the head of Stefan Klos and into the back

of the net. This 6-2 win truly heralded the start of the Martin O'Neill era and was arguably the finest of Henrik's 242 goals for the club.

2. Jimmy Johnstone - 2-2 - Ibrox, May 6, 1967

This was the greatest season in Celtic's history, the campaign in which the team won every competition they entered - including the club's first domestic treble and the European Cup. It was also the year in which the league was won at Ibrox, with Jinky securing the solitary point that was needed to claim the title with a double in this 2-2 draw. His second that day was the pick of the two goals and one that Gordon Strachan (who was watching as a Johnstone acolyte and Hibs fanatic) rated as his favourite derby goal (until now presumably). Jinky later described it as a 'lucky' effort, struck by an exhausted player who was weighed down by his rain-sodden jersey, but this looping drive was also one of the strikes of '60s and vintage Johnstone.

3. Murdo MacLeod - 4-2 - Celtic Park, May 21, 1979

A spectacular finish with practically the last kick of the ball on the night that '10 men won the league'. Celtic needed the win at home against their oldest rivals to clinch the title and had to find it a man down after Johnny Doyle was sent off. They were one goal up with minutes remaining when the 'Wee Rhino' broke toward goal. "I remember picking the ball up," recalled MacLeod, "there was a pass on wide left and a pass on

wide right, but I just kept on going. I was saying to myself, 'I am going to hit this ball as hard as I can. If I miss the target it will go into the Celtic End behind the goal and will waste some time'. But I hit the ball well and it went high and dipped down over McCoyle and hit the roof of the net." And sparked the title celebrations in earnest.

4. Paul McStay - 2-1 - Ibrox, March 20, 1988

This left-foot volley from the edge of the box at Ibrox came in the league and Scottish Cup double-winning season from a player who had that year been Celtic and Scotland's finest. In that centenary campaign 'The Maestro' was at the peak of his sublime powers in every single match and this searing drive was, in particular, the memorable highlight that went a long way toward asserting Celtic's authority in the title race. A great strike from one of the greatest of Celts.

5. Sammy Wilson - 7-1 - Hampden Park, October 19, 1957

October 1957 brought Celtic's finest moment against Rangers, a derby humiliation which to this day looms large in the history of the Scottish game. Sammy Wilson grabbed the first that day at Hampden, with John McPhail scoring three, Neilly Mochan getting a double and Willie Fernie slotting home the seventh

from the penalty spot in the 90th minute. Such was Celtic's dominance in this match that their rivals were simply left in a state of dazed bewilderment and it is worth remembering that the Hoops also hit the woodwork three times in the first 20 minutes. But arguably the pick of the bunch was the opener from Wilson, a blistering volley from 12 yards after a nod-down by McPhail.

6. Paul Lambert - 2-0 - Celtic Park, January 2, 1998

With Wim Jansen's men desperately trying to halt Rangers' march for a record-breaking 10th consecutive league title, this was the game that would make or break Celtic's challenge. Having taken the lead through Craig Burley, Celtic were facing a nervy finish, before Paul Lambert's 25-yarder sealed the win with five minutes remaining. "It was one of those ones you just hit and hope," said Lambert with a measure of modesty afterwards. "It was a lucky goal." But there was nothing lucky about Celtic's ultimate victory that season and this win was the foundation upon which it was built.

7. Chris Sutton - 1-0 - Celtic Park, May 8, 2004

With seconds remaining in this match it looked as though the dream of five wins in a season and a run of six straight victories over Rangers would not be ▶

realised. That was until Chris Sutton picked up the ball and laid it wide, into the path of Henrik Larsson, sparking one last push forward. The Swede then sent a perfectly cushioned return back to his strike-partner who lifted the cheekiest of chips over Stefan Klos to complete Rangers' misery. And the Ibrox club were not to fare any better in the first derby game of the next season, where Alan Thompson struck another spectacular 90th minute winner to extend the run of wins to a magnificent seven.

8. George Connelly - 4-0 - Hampden Park, April 26, 1969

The stage was set for this one in front of 132,870 as Billy McNeill put Celtic ahead as early as the second minute in the Scottish Cup final against a side which hadn't lost at this stage for 40 years. The fact that Bobby Lennox put Celtic two up just 60 seconds before the stand-out selection from this particular game just added to the beauty as did the fact that these two killer goals came in the last minute of the first half. Nonetheless, the fact that young George Connelly took the ball from John Greig and then rounded the keeper for the third of Celtic's 4-0 win would have this in the list even if this game were a 1-1 draw.

9. Lubo Moravcik - 5-1 - Celtic Park, November 21, 1998

He didn't just score the first two goals of what would go down as the Demolition Derby. Lubo Moravcik was the mastermind behind Celtic's biggest win over their Ibrox rivals since January 3, 1966. There had been many scintillating wins in the intervening years but never one as comprehensive as this rout. It was the first goal that collects the honours here as Simon Donnelly hared down the left before squaring low and Henrik Larsson dummied for the Slovak to fire in a left-foot shot from outside the box past Antti Niemi - the legend had arrived.

10 Shunsuke Nakamura - 2-1 - Celtic Park, April 16, 2008

Is this the best? The question, in a sense, is immaterial as they are all here to be savoured and many of us have relished this particular one many times since today's teams last met a week-and-a-half ago. The mechanics were simple, the execution unbelievable as Shunsuke Nakamura let a ball from Gary Caldwell bounce just once before unleashing a searing left-foot screamer that travelled right, then left before soaring past Alan McGregor in the Rangers goal. It was his first against the Ibrox side and Jan Vennegoor of Hesselink did likewise in the final minute to make it 2-1 for Celtic.
