



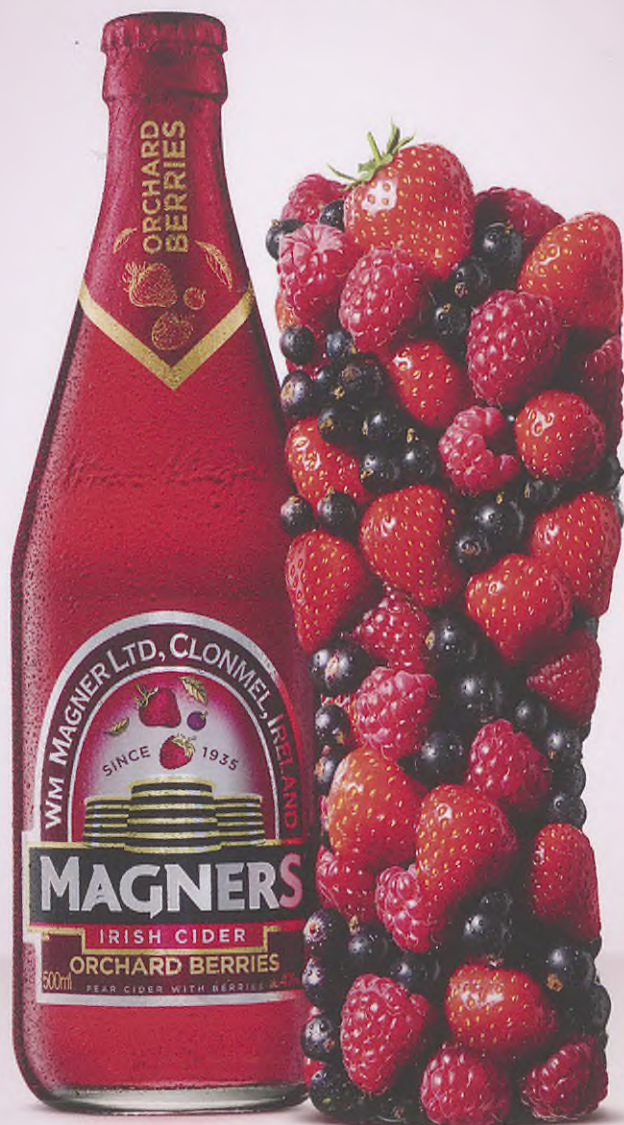

SOCIAL MISSION STATEMENT

Introduction

Celtic Football Club is legendary and as with most legends as much myth as fact surrounds its history and what the Club stands for today. The Social Mission Statement aims to simply define what the Club stands for and seeks to promote within society.

History

Celtic Football Club was founded in 1888. Its principal founder was a Marist Brother named Walfrid. The Club had two principal aims: The first aim was to raise funds to provide food for the poor of the East End of Glasgow, an area of the City that was greatly impoverished and had a high rate of infant mortality. Within the East End was a large Irish community and friction was growing between the native Glaswegians and the new influx of Irish. Brother Walfrid saw the need for social integration and his vision was a football club that Scottish and Irish, Protestants and Catholics alike could support. A new football club would be a vehicle to bring the communities together and this was the second aim. The Marist brother sought for the Club to have both a Scottish and Irish identity and hence, the Club's name "Celtic" came about, representing a bridge of cultures across the Irish Sea.

Current Positioning of Celtic Football Club

Celtic Football Club is a Scottish football club with proud Irish links. The primary business of Celtic is as a football club. It is run on a professional business basis with no political agenda. However, the Club has a wider role and the responsibility of being a major Scottish social institution promoting health, well-being and social integration.

Who is Celtic Football Club for?

Celtic Football Club is for people who want to support a football club that strives for excellence in Scotland and in Europe, is proud of its history, supportive of its local community and seeks to support the following aims: "To maximise all opportunities to disassociate the Club from sectarianism and bigotry of any kind. To promote Celtic as a Club for all people, regardless of gender, age, religion, race or ability."

Summary

Celtic is a club for everyone who believes in football as a medium for healthy pleasure, entertainment and social integration. The Club always has been and always will simply aim to be the team of the people.

ALL supporters are reminded that the Ground Regulations insist that spectators remain seated during the match.

Please remain seated throughout the match in the interests of your own safety and that of your fellow supporters.

UNACCEPTABLE CONDUCT AT CELTIC PARK AND AWAY FOOTBALL STADIA

NEW rules have been introduced by the SFA and SPFL in connection with "Unacceptable Conduct" at football stadia. The new rules form part of our Stadium Regulations. It is a condition of entry to stadia that the Stadium Regulations, including these new rules, are followed.

CELTIC FOOTBALL CLUB WILL NOT TOLERATE UNACCEPTABLE CONDUCT AT CELTIC PARK OR AT AWAY FOOTBALL STADIA

- Unacceptable conduct is conduct which is violent or disorderly
- Violent conduct includes any actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person, or intentional damage to property

- Disorderly conduct includes conduct which stirs up or sustains, or is likely or is designed to stir up or sustain, hatred or ill will against or towards individuals or groups of people because of:

- Gender
- Colour, race, nationality (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin
- Membership or presumed membership, of a religious group or of a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation
- Sexual orientation
- Transgender identity
- Disability
- Using threatening, abusive or insulting words or conduct
- Displaying writing or any other thing which is threatening, abusive or insulting

This list is not exhaustive and must be read in conjunction with the Stadium Regulations.

ANY PERSON ENGAGING IN UNACCEPTABLE CONDUCT MAY BE SUBJECT TO ANY, OR A COMBINATION OF THE FOLLOWING:

- Removal from the stadium
- Suspension from attending official matches involving Celtic Football Club
- Indefinite ban from attending official matches involving Celtic Football Club
- Report to the police and possible criminal proceedings

POLE POSITION

Legia Warsaw topped the Ekstraklasa last season for the second year running and now meet the Hoops in the UEFA Champions League

LIKE in the previous round when Celtic played an Icelandic team for only the second time in Europe, the Hoops now come up against a Polish side for only the second time.

The last time was in season 1976/77 in the UEFA Cup when the Hoops played Wisla Krakow.

This evening, ahead of Celtic's second clash at BT Murrayfield, we take a look at the background of tonight's visitors, Legia Warsaw.

IN THE BEGINNING

Legia were founded while World War One raged and came to being as the army team, or team of the Polish Legions, in the first half of March 1916 on the Eastern Front in Volhynia. In July of that year they moved permanently to Warsaw and their first game there was a

derby against Polonia Warsaw which finished 1-1. In their first 10 games they won seven and drew three, the last of those games being their first trip outside of Warsaw when they beat the then Polish champions, KS Cracovia.

However, it wasn't until May 8, 1927 that they played their first Polish league match and they beat Lodz 6-1. The honour of scoring Legia's first league goal went to Marian Lanko who went on to score a hat-trick that day.



FACTS AND FIGURES

Legia have won the Polish title 10 times and if they manage it again this season they will achieve three-in-a-row for the first time ever. The supporters may be exercising caution and not counting their chickens before they hatch, though, as they have been on the verge of that magic number three times previously but the third title has always remained outside their grasp. In two of those previous attempts they finished second in the third campaign. They have also won the Polish Cup a record 16 times, the Polish SuperCup a record four times and the Polish League Cup on one occasion.

LAST SEASON

Legia, of course, were the Polish Champions last season and, like here in Scotland, they have a league split, although the Ekstraklasa parting of the ways is rather more complicated. After 30 games, the 16-team league splits into two. Each club's points tally is then halved (rounded up the way if it's an odd number that is halved). Each side then plays seven more games, one each against the other sides in their section and the top four teams in each section at the start of the split play four games at home and three away. It's all a bit complicated considering that the top three teams fighting for European places when the split came into play were Legia Warsaw, Lech Poznan and Ruch Chorzow in that order - and the top three teams winning places in Europe after the championship round were Legia Warsaw, Lech Poznan and Ruch Chorzow in that order.

WHAT'S IN A NAME

Legia Warszawa SA, to give them their proper title, have a couple of military nicknames thanks to their army origins. They are known both as the Wojskowi which means Militarians or the Legioniści which translates as Legionnaires. There have been one or two official name changes, though. They started



life as Drużyna Sportowa Legia but changed that to Wojskowy Klub Sportowy Legia Warszawa or Military Sports Club Legia Warsaw following World War One. They stuck with that until 1949 when it was changed to WKS Warszawa or Central Military Sports Club Warsaw before finally settling on their current moniker. Their stadium is also officially known as the Marshal Jozef Pilsudski Polish Army Stadium - but it is generally known as the Pepsi Arena.

PREVIOUS VISITS

Legia Warsaw's only previous visit to Scotland in competitive action was in season 1990/91 when they met Aberdeen in the European Cup-Winners' Cup second round. The first leg went ahead at Pittodrie on October 24 and a 16,000 crowd watched a 0-0 draw. A fortnight later a 5,665 crowd in Warsaw saw the home side win 1-0 thanks to a Kzysztof Iwanicki goal just six minutes from time. Legia got as far as the semi-final and took the lead at home against Manchester

United, but a minute later, former Celt, Brian McClair equalised and that was the first goal in a 4-2 aggregate win for the Old Trafford side. United went on to win the trophy that season with a 2-1 win over Barcelona at Feyenoord's home in Rotterdam.

AND ANOTHER THING...

While Celtic and Leeds United were involved in the 'Battle of Britain' in the European Cup semi-finals of season 1969/70, it was Legia Warsaw who were involved in the other tug of war with Feyenoord. On the same night that George Connelly scored after 45 seconds in front of 46,381 at Elland Road, over in Warsaw, Legia and Feyenoord fought out a 0-0 draw as a crowd of 23,760 looked on. Both scorelines were tight but as a crowd of 136,505 saw Celtic complete the with a 2-1 scoreline over the English champions at Hampden, two goals after half-an-hour from Willem van Hanegem and Franz Hasil in Rotterdam gave the Dutch side the win they needed.



LEGIA WARSAW TONIGHT'S OPPONENTS

CELTIC left Poland last week with a mountain to climb in their UEFA Champions League third round qualifier following their 4-1 defeat to Legia Warsaw.

The Hoops took an early lead thanks to a clever run and wicked shot from Callum McGregor but

were soon pegged back by the Polish champions and eventually conceded three more times throughout the course of the game while going down to 10 men.

In tonight's programme we take a look at the players who inflicted the damage for Legia and who Celtic should be mindful of in Edinburgh.

LEGIA WARSAW
THE PLAYERS



ONES TO WATCH

MIROSLAV RADOVIC

Serbian internationalist Miroslav Radovic was the architect of Celtic's downfall last week. His vision and trickery proved a persistent thorn in the side of the Celtic defence and he scored his team's equalising goal while the travelling Hoops support were still celebrating the opener. Radovic started up front for Legia but was seen dropping back into midfield and out on to the wings on a number of occasions to help instigate play. His first goal was a powerful shot, kept low at the near post. His second effort showed his predatory side as he set up a move on the edge of the box and then had the finishing touch near the penalty spot after Efe Ambrose was nudged off the ball. Celtic will be on the front foot for tonight's match in an effort to claw back the deficit but they must be wary of Radovic if they are to stop the Polish champions from scoring.

MICHAL KUCHARCZYK

Winger Michal Kucharczyk was also instrumental in his side's victory last week. The tricky playmaker drew the foul from Efe Ambrose which saw the Nigerian red-carded and prodded and probed the Celtic defence all night. His runs inside from the left flank created space for the overlaps from Tomasz Brzyski and his quick passing helped spread play. It was also Kucharczyk's back-post header across the Celtic box which set up Radovic for his second goal before he squandered a number of chances of his own. His presence and power in the air also created problems for Celtic.

IVICA VRDOLJAK

Ivica Vrdoljak, Legia's captain, will have a point to prove in the return leg this evening at BT Murrayfield. The defensive midfielder missed two penalties in the first leg, one which he blasted wide and another which Forster did well to save in the dying minutes of the match. He is the team's penalty taker but was off his mark last week and has his team-mates to thank for making up for his misses. Outside of the penalties, Vrdoljak was a rock in the heart of the Legia midfield and will be eager to prove his worth in Edinburgh after missing both spot kicks. He broke up play and helped to build attacks from deep in the Legia half. He has a range of passing abilities and will be key for the away side tonight as they are expected to sit in and defend deep.

ONES TO WATCH

» **MICHAL ZYRO**

Another danger-man from the Legia wing, Michal Zyro got his name on the score-sheet last week with a header five minutes before full time. The Polish U21 internationalist had gone down under a challenge in the box and while the ball went out for a corner, he cleverly remained unmarked in the Celtic penalty area. As the cross came in Zyro leapt into life and rose highest in the box to glance the ball past Forster in the Celtic goal. It was intelligent play from the winger, who had threatened with a number of chances earlier in the game. Like several other players for Legia, his height also proved to be a problem for Celtic and helped him control his area of the pitch. The talented midfielder will look to get on the ball when he can this evening and spark counter-attacks for his side.

JAKUB KOSECKI

Home-grown Warsaw player Jakub Kosecki rubbed salt in Celtic's wounds with the fourth goal last week. He came on as a substitute for Kucharczyk deep in the second half but went straight to work in testing the Celtic defence. His well-timed runs down the Hoops right flank gave his team-mates an option when looking for a pass and it was the same manoeuvre that led to his goal. He added width to Legia's play, which pushed Celtic hard in the final third, and took his goal well with a composed finish.

ONDREJ DUDA

Central midfielder Ondrej Duda's skill and trickery teased the Celtic defence and brought the first penalty of the game. His late runs often caused problems, and it was through this method that he forced Charlie Mulgrew into his challenge which led to the ref blowing for the spot kick. He formed a good working partnership with Zyro and Kucharczyk and applied pressure on any Celtic payer with the ball within touching distance. His runs forward and quick pressing put Celtic under pressure in possession and he will be key to breaking up play in Edinburgh.

CROWD WITH A SILVER LINING

Celtic have a tough task tonight but **Mikael Lustig** know the Hoops support can play a major part in tonight's game

Exclusive interview: Mark Henderson

MIKAEL Lustig was stunned at the terrific turnout of Celtic fans at BT Murrayfield two weeks ago and he's hoping for another spectacular show of support from the Hoops faithful tonight in the capital.

Almost 40,000 clad in green and white made the journey along the M8 to witness Ronny Deila's men earn a comprehensive 4-0 victory over KR Reykjavik and progress to the next round of the UEFA Champions League qualifiers.

In glorious summer sunshine, they generated a tremendous atmosphere at the home of Scottish rugby and the players responded with a dominant display on the pitch.

With Celtic Park remaining out of commission following its central role in the Commonwealth Games, the Scottish champions are back in Edinburgh, and know what they have to do against Legia Warsaw to guarantee European football until Christmas and put them one step away from the glamour and excitement of the Champions League group stages.

While Lustig and his team-mates would naturally prefer to play such a crucial game in Paradise, they were all impressed by the facilities, setting and atmosphere of BT Murrayfield.

And the Swedish internationalist has called on the Celtic supporters to raise the roof again in the ground to spur them on to another European adventure.

"We went to Karagandy last year and lost 2-0 but we had an amazing atmosphere in Celtic Park and

without the fans we would have struggled more to come back in the game," he told the matchday programme in an exclusive interview. "They are really important to us.

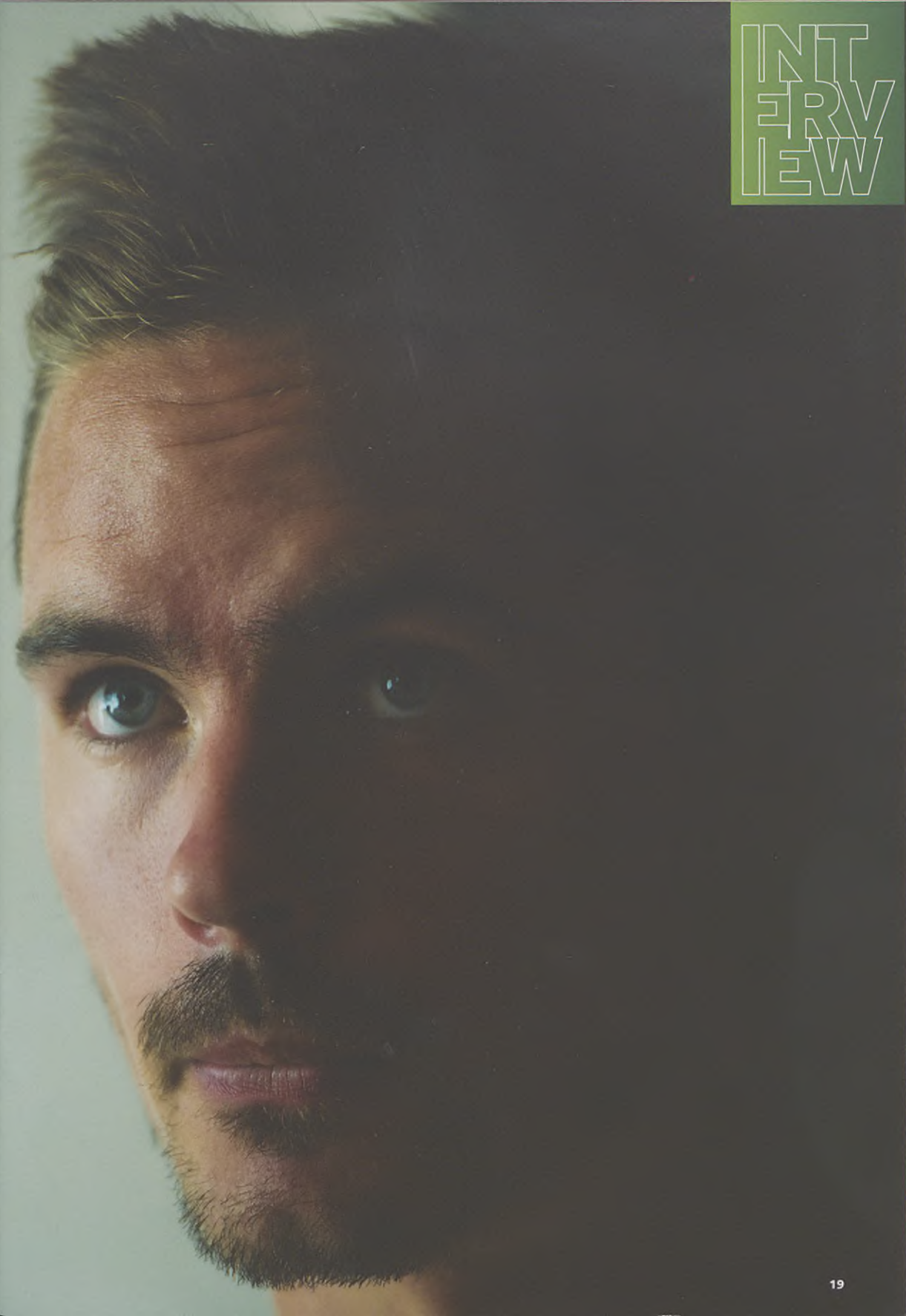
"To take a home game to another city and still have so many fans there and making that noise was unbelievable - it was unreal - and hopefully we will see that tonight as well.

"Murrayfield is not like Celtic Park and it isn't home but everyone - the players, staff and fans - need to make the best of the situation and two weeks ago the supporters were really good, although the start we had against Reykjavik, scoring three early goals, helped us and made it much easier.

"Prior to us playing there, I only knew it was a big stadium and that rugby is played there. It was a little bit strange as it doesn't feel like a football stadium as the stands were quite far away behind the goal. But the pitch was good and that's the most important thing. We played quite good football and it wasn't a problem to get the ball on the ground, while the fans made a difference as well.

"Getting to the Champions League has been our goal since coming back in June and it means everything to the guys and the whole club. It's really important. Of course, it isn't everything, but we know how enjoyable it is to play on European nights, especially at Celtic Park, so hopefully we can get through."

Having events of such significance at an early juncture in the campaign is never ideal. Match





sharpness is still in its infancy and there is the constant distraction of the summer transfer window when full focus is essential.

Factor in the arrival of a new manager and the subsequent changes in approach, style and ideas, then the difficulties are multiplied.

This is Celtic's scenario and, while there has been early progress, Lustig has pleaded for patience.

"With pre-season being so short and there are a lot of things the manager wants to say to us but he needs more time," he said.

"I played in Rosenborg and in Sweden when a new coach came in and during the first weeks there is a new voice in the room and it's different but so far so good on the training pitch.

"He's very clear about the way he wants to play. It's going to take a while but after a couple of games we are already seeing a difference."

One constant from the previous regime is the strong team spirit among the players, a crucial commodity for any side.

"It's important, and the lads here are quite an easy-going group of people so that's never going to be a problem," added the defender.

And within the dressing room, the Scandinavian influence has never been stronger, with the arrival of Norwegian Jo Inge Berget from Cardiff City last week swelling the Norse numbers to four.

He joined Lustig, Swedish-born Bahrudin Atajic and

» Stefan Johansen in the first-team squad, and among the backroom staff, Ronny Deila has appointed compatriot Haakon Lunov.

"I faced Jo a couple of times and I remember him being quite big and strong," said Lustig. "He had a bit of a tough time at Cardiff but hopefully he can get his game back and if he does that he can be really important for us.

"If you hire a Spanish coach he will probably bring in Spanish players, and if a new manager comes in and wants to buy players or bring players in on loan it's important you know what you are getting.

"For a while it was just me and Johan and then Stefan came but it's always nice to have Scandinavian people here as they are really friendly.

"The Norwegian and Swedish languages are almost exactly the same. Norwegian people understand Swedish people more as from a young age they watch Swedish movies and programmes.

"Particularly when you are new in the squad and you have some questions it's easier to do it in your language so it's quite normal that we hang about together."

And there should be a long-term Scandinavian presence as well, following Lustig's signing of a three-year extension to his contract in the summer.

The 27-year-old was always eager to remain at the club, and was delighted to commit to a new deal, despite the change in management.

"It meant a lot," he said. "When we started talking about it, I wanted to find a solution. But when I had my operation in December, we said we would take it up after I came back and I was really delighted to sign it.

"Of course, I liked working under Neil a lot but in football things happen. I signed the contract for the club not because of the manager so it wasn't a problem."



SWEDEN DREAMS

MIKAEL Lustig says he and his international team-mates are doubly determined to progress to the European Championship in 2016 following the disappointment of narrowly missing out on the World Cup.

Sweden finished second in their group behind Germany, who would go on to win the global showpiece in Brazil.

That forced them into taking on Portugal in a nail-biting play-off which they lost, chiefly down to the exploits of Cristiano Ronaldo.

To fall at the final hurdle was a sore blow but now Lustig and his countrymen have put that behind them and are looking forward, with their first Euro qualifier looming on the horizon.

"I still watched a lot of games at the World Cup," he said.

"We were quite close and if we had a bit more luck we could have made it.

Germany won our group and then won the World Cup and Portugal had good players as well. But of course it was hard.

"We did really well in the qualifications for the World Cup and the last Euros, finishing second both times. We got a tough draw in the play-offs against Portugal and it was difficult. But this time two teams qualify for the Euros, so I think we have a good chance.

"It's always fun to play with the national team and there are going to be a lot of important games coming up in September," he said. "We have a friendly against Estonia and then we have Austria away in the first qualifier."



YOUNG GUNS

CALLUM McGregor has been one of the standouts for Celtic during the early part of the season, with the young Celt turning in a series of impressive performances.

And Mikael Lustig reckons the midfielder and the likes of Liam Henderson will have a big part to play over the coming season and beyond.

"Callum was on loan at Notts County and did really well there and he has taken the opportunity to impress the new manager and he has done really well," he said.

"It's important our younger players like Hendo and Callum do well. Both of them have been very good so far and they have a good future at Celtic."

CELTIC SOLIDARNOSC

A look at the Hoops' connection with Poland

TONIGHT Legia Warsaw visit our temporary European home of BT Murrayfield and we welcome the Polish champions.

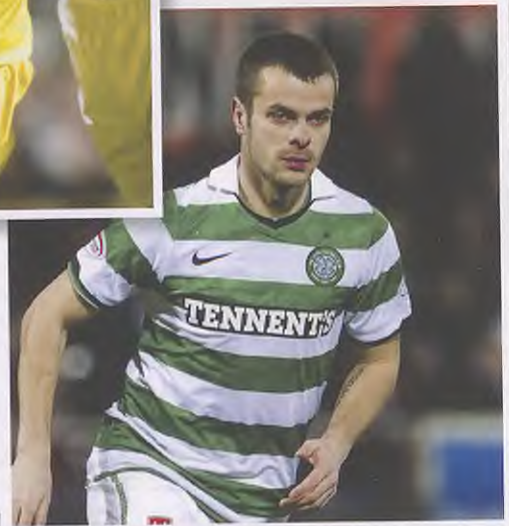
Poland is a land where Celtic have forged some strong links in recent years thanks to the performances of former Hoops keeper, Artur Boruc for club and country.

The Polish connection goes back some 67 years, though, to just after the Second World War when the club's first player from that part of the world signed on with the Hoops.

He made an emotional return to Celtic Park four decades after signing to meet Celtic's then Polish heroes, Jacki Dziekanowski and Shuggie Wdowczyk.

WHEN DID CELTIC FIRST TRAVEL THERE?

Nearly 40 years ago, Celtic were drawn against Wisla Krakow in the first round of the UEFA Cup in 1976/77 and travelled to Poland after drawing 2-2 in the home leg. This was the Celtic team of Danny McGrain and Kenny Dalglish, but Wisla showed they were no mugs



as they raced into a 2-1 lead at Celtic Park. King Kenny's last-minute equaliser gave Celtic a boost going into the return, but Polish World Cup striker Kazimierz Kmiecik turned on the style with two goals in the second half to end Celtic's hopes of a prolonged European run.

HAVE THE CELTS VISITED OFTEN?

That Krakow clash was the one and only competitive meeting between Celtic and a Polish club, but Celtic returned to Poland in the summer of 2006 for friendly matches with both Wisla Krakow and Legia Warsaw, the former clubs of Maciej Zurawski and Artur Boruc. The Hoops lost those two games, but made many friends along the way as thousands of fans, backing Celtic and the Polish teams, turned out to welcome Zurawski and Boruc back home.

ANY HOOPS STARS FROM POLAND?

There have been seven in total, with Lukasz Zaluska the only current Polish player on the books at Celtic Park. He joined in 2009 as back-up to compatriot, Artur Boruc who was known as the Holy Goalie and cemented his place as one of the best goalkeepers in the world thanks to his displays with Celtic in the UEFA Champions League. Boruc arrived at Celtic in the summer of 2005, along with fellow Pole Maciej Zurawski, who finished the Hoops' title-winning season as top scorer with John Hartson. Striker Pawel Brozek had a short spell on loan in 2012. Prior to all that, Polish double act Dariusz 'Jacki' Dziekanowski and Dariusz Wdowczyk lit up Glasgow for a few years in the 1990s. Jacki, a charismatic striker, scored four goals in one game against Partizan Belgrade, while Wdowczyk also





» became a real fans' favourite. However, the first Pole to play for Celtic was Konrad Kapler, a soldier in the Polish army who played eight games in 1947/48.

ARE THERE MANY CELTIC FANS IN POLAND?

The Poles love their football and the exploits of the aforementioned quartet have given Celtic a high-profile in the country. Wdowczyk and Zurawski both captained Poland during their Celtic careers, while Boruc and Jacki are two of the most colourful and talented characters in the history of Polish football. There are numerous Celtic supporters' clubs based in Poland, while there are a number of Polish websites devoted to the club. Polish Celtic fans had the opportunity to watch their countrymen in the Hoops when almost every Celtic game was beamed live into

Poland on satellite television, while many Poles follow the club's fortunes on Celtic TV, Celtic's website channel.

IS IT A PROUD FOOTBALL NATION?

Yes, with the decade between 1972 and 1982 being a real golden period for Polish football. In 1972, Poland won gold at the Olympics and followed that up by finishing third at the 1974 World Cup. Two years later, the country took silver at the Olympics, before once again finishing third at the World Cup in 1982. Poland's most famous players include Grzegorz Lato, Kazimierz Deyna, Jacek Bak, Wladyslaw Zmuda, Antoni Szymanowski and Zbigniew Boniek. In more recent years, Poland of course, hosted the 2012 European Championships along with Ukraine and they are in Group D for the 2016 qualifiers along with Scotland.

DID YOU KNOW...

The *View* reported in 2008 that there was a Celtic shrine to be found within the bowels of Legia Warsaw's stadium. Beside an array of Legia trophies, there is a special cabinet is dedicated to the Legia heroes who have subsequently worn the Hoops, with 'Boruc' and 'Dziekanowski' Celtic strips dominating the display. Below these, and various other mementos, a *Celtic View* from the 1990s chronicles the arrival of Dariusz Wdowczyk in Glasgow. Despite Celtic taking Boruc, Dziekanowski and Wdowczyk from Legia, there remained a real bond between the two clubs.

THE POLISH CONNECTION

The players who travelled from Poland to play for Celtic

WITH the Hoops welcoming Legia Warsaw on UEFA Champions League duty, we take a look at the Polish players who have appeared for Celtic...



Konrad Kapler

1947-49
8 appearances

Konrad Kapler was an outside-left who was originally spotted while playing for the Polish Army in Johnstone. Having signed for Forres Mechanics in 1946, he moved to Glasgow a

year later. And he made his Celtic debut on September 10 of that year in a Glasgow Cup tie at home to Third Lanark. Unfortunately, the Hoops lost 3-1. Kapler was brought in as cover at outside-left, and he was unable to displace Johnny Paton from that position. In the two years he spent at the club, he made a total of eight appearances before moving to Rochdale in May 1949.

Dariusz Dziekanowski

1989-92
66 appearances,
22 goals

Striker Dariusz Dziekanowski joined Celtic from Legia Warsaw in July 1989, and was an instant hit with supporters. He was a mercurial player, capable of brilliance but also just as capable of drifting out of matches. He made his debut a month after signing, playing in the 3-1 win over Hearts at Tynecastle, and he netted the first of 22 goals for the club on

August 15 in a League Cup over Dumbarton. He also scored 11 days later in a 1-1 draw against Rangers at Celtic Park. The man affectionately known as 'Jacki' saved his finest hour for the European stage, scoring **FOUR** goals in a 5-4 victory over Partizan Belgrade in September 1989 in the European Cup-Winners' Cup. Sadly, Celtic were still knocked out on the away goals rule. Dziekanowski left Celtic in 1992 for Bristol City, having made 66 appearances for the club, and his career never quite hit the heights his talents promised after that.



Dariusz Wdowczyk

1989-94
148 appearances, 5 goals

Four months after Dziekanowski's arrival at Celtic Park, he was joined by his fellow countryman, Dariusz Wdowczyk. The accomplished defender moved from Gwardia Warsaw, and made his Celtic debut against St Mirren in November 1989, in a 1-1 home

draw against St Mirren. Known to fans as 'Shuggy', Wdowczyk was a regular in the Polish national side when he joined the Hoops, and he would make 148 appearances for Celtic over five years. He only scored five goals during that time though, famously, one of those goals came in the legendary 'St Patrick's Day Massacre' victory over Rangers in the Scottish Cup on March 17, 1991, when the Hoops won 2-0. Sadly, Wdowczyk would leave Celtic Park for Reading in 1994 without a winner's medal to his name, though he remains fondly remembered by supporters to this day.



Maciej Zurawski

2005-08
73 appearances, 30 goals

The man called 'Magic' joined Celtic in 2005 from Wislaw Krakow, though his Celtic career got off to a horrendous start, making his debut in the disastrous 5-0 defeat against Artmedia Bratislava

in a UEFA Champions League qualifier. He scored his first goals for the Hoops on August 28, netting twice in a 4-0 win over Dunfermline at East End Park, and it was a ground that would hold good memories for the Polish striker, who scored **FOUR** goals in an 8-1 win over the Pars later that season, when Neil Lennon also got on the scoresheet - one of three goals the Irishman would score for Celtic. Zurawski's goals helped the Hoops win the title in 2005/06, while he also scored in the League Cup final win - also against Dunfermline in March 2006. After three years at the club, he moved to Greek side, Larissa. He later rejoined Wislaw Krakow and helped them to win the Polish title.

Artur Boruc

2005-2010
221 appearances

A cult hero during his five years at Celtic, the 'Holy Goalie' can rightly be regarded as one of the club's best ever goalkeepers. He made 221 appearances for the club he grew to love, making his debut in the return leg of the UEFA Champions League qualifier against Artmedia Bratislava. And not content with playing a vital part in the club's success during his time at the club, which included three league titles in a row, Boruc also managed to score a 'goal' for Celtic, netting in the penalty shoot-out against Dundee United at Hampden in the League Cup semi-final at Hampden in January 2009. The Hoops would go on to lift the trophy with a 2-0 win over Rangers in the final. Boruc was a player who loved playing for Celtic and the fans, in turn, clearly idolised their Polish goalkeeper. After five successful years at Paradise, Boruc moved to Serie A side, Fiorentina, and spent two years there before joining Southampton.





Lukasz Zaluska

2009-present
44 appearances

In 2009, Celtic's compliment of Polish goalkeepers doubled when Lukasz Zaluska joined the club from Dundee United. His Celtic debut came in September 2009, when he kept a clean sheet in a 4-0 League Cup victory over Falkirk. He would make 17 appearances in total that first season with Celtic, including a successful derby debut, when the Hoops beat Rangers 2-1. He had to battle with Artur Boruc, and more recently, with Fraser Forster for the No.1 spot, and he's currently on 44 appearances for the club. Prior to joining Celtic, he had played in the League Cup semi-final against the Hoops when Boruc scored in the penalty shoot-out. And not to be outdone by his countryman, Zaluska also scored his spot-kick for United.

Pawel Brozek

2012
3 appearances

Polish internationalist striker who joined on loan from Turkish side Trabzonspor in the January window of 2012. He started his career with Wisla Krakow and had loan spells with Lodz and Katowice before moving to Turkey. However, his spell with Celtic wasn't productive and he made only one start and two substitute appearances. He returned to Wisla Krakow and at the tail end of last season, a hat-trick against Pogon Szczecin presented him with his 100th Ekstraklasa goal.



Exclusive interview: Joe Sullivan

PAUL McStay will make a more than welcome return to Paradise when his Maestros take on Rio Ferdinand's All-Stars in the MAESTRIO match, sponsored by Flip, on Sunday, September 7.

A host of former Celts managed by the Hoops legend will take to the field against a top select pulled together by the former Manchester United and England legend at Paradise as Celtic FC Foundation kick-off their 2014/15 season with a bang.

And the Maestro is more than delighted to be asked to manage a Hoops team on such a notable occasion.

big events that have taken place to raise a lot of money so now things have taken a step further with big games and loads of fundraising events."

"I don't know what Rio's team is like or who is in his squad - but that will be interesting!"

He's focusing on his own squad, though, and with the likes of Lubo Moravcik, Chris Sutton, John Hartson, Craig Bellamy, Stiliyan Petrov and Jan Vennegoor of Hesselink

among others already signed up, he may have the usual manager's headache in selecting a team.

Stars of stage and screen such as James McAvoy and Martin Compston will also be appearing while there will also be a few names that McStay shared the hallowed turf of Paradise with back in the day - Frank McAvennie, Tom Boyd, Tosh McKinlay, Peter Grant, Simon Donnelly and Jackie McNamara among them.

He said: "I'm looking forward to seeing some old faces, I'm just looking through a few here and I'm sure one or two of them will be very old!

"There are a few 'young' ones, though, who I'm sure will do all the running.

"It's just great that such an occasion can be organised

and I'm sure there will be many Celtic fans there, Man United fans as well, to help support the event."

Another couple of names penned in on the team-sheet are those of Willie and Raymond McStay.

All three played in the benefit match for former Celt Ronnie Coyle at Starks Park in 2011, but the MAESTRIO match means we could see all three McStay brothers on the Celtic Park pitch at the same time for the first time.

However, the manager said: "I see their names there but who says they're going to be in the team?"

"First of all it will be great to get back and just say hello to them, but for our family to be a part of that occasion is just fantastic.

"There are a few names that played in Ronnie's game as well so whenever there's a call-out, they respond."

He added: "I think it will be a lot of fun but being old pros, everyone will want to win and why not?"

"But the main thing is to put on entertainment for the fans that come along and make it a really good memorable occasion.

"The couple of times I've been back it's been great just being back at Celtic Park with the atmosphere.

"Again, it will be good to be back it's under different circumstances and hopefully the Celtic crowd will be out in their numbers.

"It's a fun day and the main thing is the crowd so hopefully they'll be very supportive as they always are for these types of events whether it's local supporters' events they have or whether it's big ones that the club holds..

"They always turn out in numbers and these are a couple of great causes so I'm sure they will be there."

'PARADISE IS A SPECIAL PLACE'

ONLY a select group of players have experienced it and few have managed to overcome it. Without question the atmosphere created at Celtic Park on a European football night is one that is unique in world football.

Under the floodlights at Paradise, some of Europe's biggest clubs have faced the Bhoys, with 11 men on the pitch and thousands more in the stands. It was on chilly November night in 2006 that Rio Ferdinand got his first taste of Paradise.

The former England defender was part of a Manchester United side that faced the Hoops in the final group stage game dubbed the 'Battle of Britain.'

A few weeks earlier, United had narrowly recorded a 3-2 win at Old Trafford, giving added importance to their trip to Glasgow. What followed was an evening that Ferdinand says he will never forget.

He said: "We played there in the UEFA Champions League and I remember standing in the line-up and the music playing and there was this buzz about the place - you could feel it.

"Then we ran out and had a little stretch and all of a sudden, just before the whistle went for the game to kick off, there was the biggest roar I've ever heard in a football stadium in my life. It was unbelievable.

"I remember a few of us looking round at each other saying, 'I like this', this is somewhere to play football.

"You get a sense after it. There were a few of us thinking that it was one of best atmospheres we've ever played in. We lost that night, but it was still a great atmosphere.

"Shunsuke Nakamura banged that free-kick in against us. I remember looking back at the goalkeeper thinking, what is he playing at, but it was just a great free-kick."

And Rio added: "I haven't won at Celtic Park. We drew the last time when we should have won. So this charity game is my chance. I'll be trying to get a good team, full of young legs."



Worldwide Celtic family

PAUL McStay and his family may now be ensconced on the other side of the world in Sydney, Australia, but that doesn't mean he can't keep up with Celtic.

He said: "I see the games on satellite over here and there are all the usual media outlets as well and, of course, the Celtic website.

"I always keep up to speed with what's going on at Celtic Park and still mix with a lot of ex-pats so Celtic is always the topic of conversation."

Rio grand...

PAUL McStay is no stranger to playing Man United, indeed, they played in his testimonial, and, likewise, Rio Ferdinand knows what it's like to play at Celtic Park against the Hoops.

However, they have never crossed swords on the pitch before but that doesn't mean there isn't a mutual admiration between them.

McStay said: "Rio is a magnificent player and you just have to glance at his career with Manchester United and England as well as before that with West Ham and Leeds to see what a respected footballer he is.

"And the fact that he is now giving something back to communities through his own foundation shows that the respect for him goes beyond football.

"He is raising money for worthy causes and this game should go a long way to helping both his foundation and, of course, Celtic FC Foundation."

The Celtic Connection

BOTH managers for the day met out in Australia last year when Manchester United were on tour Down Under.

And Paul McStay revealed it was a Celtic link that played a part in the unfolding story of MAESTRIO

He said: "It was through Davie Moyes that I met Rio, as I caught up with him for a coffee and went along to Man United's training.

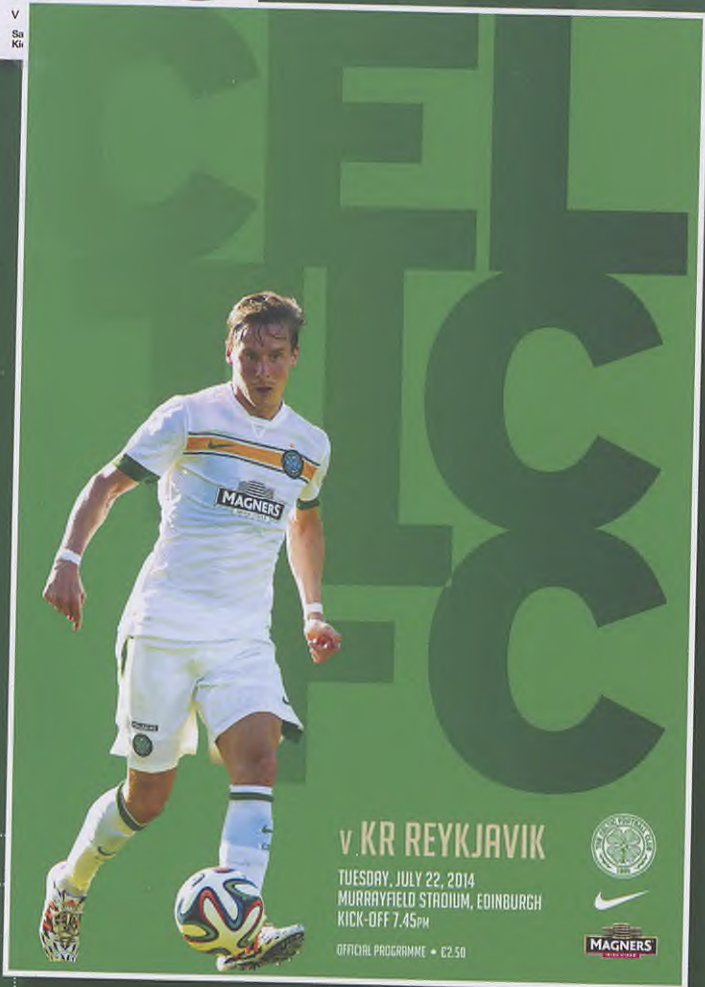

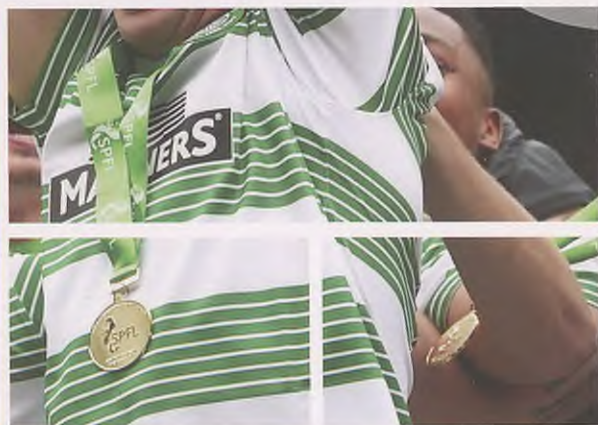
