WILLIE PATERSON



Hibs' younger players had their fling in the 2-0 defeat of Motherwell with Alex McGhee completing a hat-trick of useful goals in the last three games and Willie Paterson capturing the support of the fans in his first big game.

Willie, who went to Burnley as a schoolboy before joining Hibs last year, fairly grabbed his promotion chance and earned the second-half penalty which clinched the game after being on the field for only two minutes.

He challenged for every loose ball and was not afraid to take on defenders and thoroughly deserved the cheer reserved for him at the finish.

In the absence of the suspended John Brownlie, Ally MacLeod was an excellent stand-in for spot-kick duty. He laid on the first goal, too, and his distribution was one of the major factors in the victory.

That was the seventh game of the season with Motherwell and, if Hibs took a Scottish Cup ko from them, they have reaped revenge in the League with six points out of eight and no goals conceded in the last three meetings.

It's interesting to see how Hibs have gathered their 41 points so far. They enjoyed a "full house" against St Johnstone, collected seven off Hearts and six from both Motherwell and Ayr.

The last fixture against Aberdeen is

on Saturday and Hibs have five out of six at present. Dundee shared the spoils with four apiece and three points were taken off Rangers.

So Hibs have struggled against Celtic and Dundee United, winning one point against each of these sides.

After 10 seasons of domestic dominance in which period they won the championship nine times, the Scottish Cup on seven occasions and the League Cup six times, Celtic are left with one honour to chase in the dying weeks of this season.

They lost to Rangers in the final of the League Cup and were beaten 3-2 at Motherwell in the "Scottish", so that all their efforts have been concentrated on regaining the championship.

It will be a desperately close fight to the last game, though much will hinge on the result of the "Old-Firm" game at Parkhead next Monday. This game was postponed on March 13, and it has become something of a title decider.

Two matches against Ayr United and one against Hearts at Tynecastle will complete the Celtic schedule and, in the end, the first Premier League could be decided on goal difference.

Celtic are pinning much faith in Johnny Doyle, the former Ayr United outside right, who went to Parkhead in exchange for a £90,000 cheque. He had the misfortune to be carried off on his debut at Dundee but the injury proved less serious than it looked and he'll be on the wing tonight.

Doyle has strength and guts to back up his undoubted skill and it would be money well spent for Celtic if he inspires them to hit a winning streak.

Celtic dropped out of the European Cup Winners' Cup at the quarter-final stage. Although masters in both ties against Zwickau, the East Germans won 2-1 on aggregate only to be dismissed cheaply by Anderlecht in the semi-finals.

Celtic are rather inexperienced, anyhow, to tackle the better teams on

the Continent at present and all the younger players will have benefited from this season's matches against the foreigners.

Andy Lynch and Pat McCluskey, both suspended for three days, missed Saturday's match with Aberdeen but the two defenders are available again.

Ayrshire schoolboy Roy Aitken has done exceptionally well since he took over at centre half from Roddy McDonald and he is usually shielded by Johannes Edvaldsson, who has "neglected" his defensive duties to score 10 goals since August.

Of course, the form men in this Celtic side are Danny McGrain, a brilliant, ball-playing full back, and Kenny Dalglish, whose magnificent club displays stamp him as the finest player in the country.

And there's Dixie Deans, who specialises in scoring goals against Hibs. As it happens, he has had a lean spell in the past two months and Hibs will endeavour to prolong his run.

Bobby Lennox carries on as the last member of the "Lisbon Lions" of 1967 and does not seem to have shed any speed with the passing of the years. Harry Hood, Ronnie Glavin, Jackie McNamara and Paul Wilson are all intent on helping Celtic to wind-up as champions once again.

No doubt that the introduction of Graham Fyfe and Ally Scott has worked wonders for the second team. They shared three goals at Motherwell on Saturday and both scored a week ago against Dundee.

That was the team's best display of the season. A really first-class performance by every member of the side and 5-1 was no more than they deserved.

Dundee scored first from a penalty but Hibs replied with three goals in quick succession and completed the rout in the second half. Willie Paterson scored two goals and earned a step-up to the first-team pool.

Hibs were always fighting to pull level at Fir Park but it says much for the spirit of the team that they equalised three times.

Graham Fyfe has been on the mark in each of his three games and he had a double in this one. Our best goal was a free kick from outside the box and Graham "bent" it round the wall and past ex-Celtic goalkeeper, Ally Hunter.

Tony Higgins had his first game for 11 weeks and played just over one half. His knee stood up to the test and he'll be a useful addition to the team for the two Reserve League Cup final matches against Rangers, the dates of which have not been fixed yet.

Another casualty, though, was Davie Steedman, our fair-haired defender who needed stitches in a leg gash.
