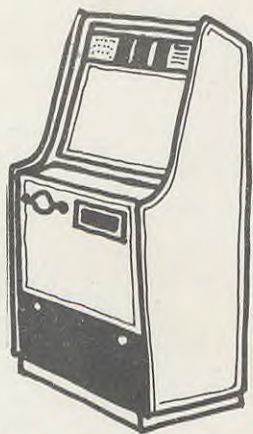

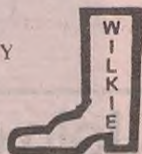

*DAVID HAY*

**BILLY McNEILL**, 6'1", 12st. Giant centre-half whose command in the middle of the Celtic defence has always been complete. Many international caps, and, of course, skipper of the side that won the European Cup. Signed from Blantyre Vics in 1957.

**GEORGE CONNELLY**, 6'1", 11st. 12 lbs. Versatile George was originally signed as a ball-playing inside-forward but has now emerged as an expert "sweeper", playing alongside Billy McNeill. A Fifer, George signed from Tulliallan in 1965.

**VIC DAVIDSON**, 5'9", 10st. 5lbs. Talented forward who has already impressed in the first team. Very slick on the ball. Came to Parkhead from Ashfield in 1967.

**TOMMY CALLAGHAN, 5'8"**, 11st. Fifer Tom was taken to East End Park when Jock Stein was manager of Dunfermline, and later Jock paid a big fee to bring him to Celtic. Once played a trial for East Fife at Forfar on the left wing, but decided to join the Pars. Cultured, long-striding player.

**BOBBY LENNOX, 5'6"**, 10st. 10lbs. One of the fastest footballers in the country, the buzz-bomb is a threat to every defence with his darting runs and shots. Hero of many European matches. Signed from Ardeer Recreation in 1961.

**KENNY DALGLISH, 5'8½"**, 10st. 10lbs. Has emerged this season as one of the best players in Scotland, scoring some tremendous goals. Young Kenny is destined for the top and has already won international honours.

**JOHN DEANS, 5'8"**, 10st. 8lbs. Bought from Motherwell for a big fee earlier this season "Dixie" has already paid his way with some valuable goals for Celtic. A strong, bustling centre who netted the winner in Celtic's 2 - 1 win over East Fife at Parkhead this season.



## BAYVIEW SIDELINES

Two players have been added to the staff recently. They are Ronnie McIvor (21) of Bonnyrigg Rose, the Lothians Junior side and Tom Boyle (18) of Fife Juvenile side Oakley Star.

McIvor, a powerful half-back, is being left with Bonnyrigg at the moment in view of their interest in the Scottish Junior Cup. He played right-half as a trialist in the reserve match with Rangers at Ibrox and was so impressive that Manager Quinn wasted no time in getting his signature.

Boyle has been provisionally signed after good reports of his play in a trial for Oakley Juniors against Leven Juniors recently.

Andy Matthew, manager of Cowdenbeath, still obviously has a soft spot for his old club, East Fife.

For Andy, whose team could well be back in the First Division next season, has kindly donated the match ball for to-day's game.

When Cowden's home game with Alloa was called off Andy was given the green light to bring his side through to Methil to watch East Fife and Falkirk.

After this came Andy's match ball gesture — a nice touch.

East Fife gained only their second penalty of the season (first and second teams) when the reserves were awarded one against Rangers at Ibrox recently. Jim Hamilton stepped up and scored from the kick.

Curiously enough the other penalty was also awarded in a reserve match against Rangers in the League Cup early in the season. This time, however, Doug Dailey took the kick and Gerry Neef saved.

It looks odds on now, though, that the first team will go through the season penalty-less.

East Fife players and officials were guests of the Troxy Cinema, Leven, recently, for a showing of the "Goal", the film of the World Cup finals in Mexico.

A lady from Cupar wrote to the club the other day complaining that the records played at the ground must have been bought in a job lot at a sale. They weren't, Missus, but the point is taken. Any fans willing to donate old "new" records?

# WHAT THE RECORDS SAY

This will be the 41st competitive match (league and cup) between Celtic and East Fife. They first met in East Fife's first season in the First Division in 1930-31, and Celtic won both times.

But East Fife's record since 1948-49 is much more impressive. In the ten seasons from then East Fife beat Celtic in the league more often than Celtic beat them.

Of the ten matches at Celtic Park Celtic won six and East Fife one; three were drawn, but of the ten at Bayview, East Fife won eight and Celtic only two.

Look at the results of the ten fixtures at Bayview in that period: (East Fife scores first):

48-49, 0-3; 49-50, 2-0; 50-51, 3-0; 51-52, 3-4; 52-53, 4-1; 53-54, 4-1; 54-55, 3-1; 55-56, 3-0; 56-57, 5-1; 57-58, 3-2.

That run of six successive home league wins over Celtic has been surpassed only once in the history of the Scottish League. In the period 1924-25 to 1930-31 inclusive Rangers beat Celtic in seven successive league matches at Ibrox. That is the longest league run ever by any club against Celtic and it says much for the Fifers that they almost equalled it.

In the Scottish Cup, however, East Fife have not enjoyed the same success. The clubs met six times, Celtic winning all six ties, including the first at Methil in the second round in 1920-21 and the final of 1927.

Of the ten league Cup games Celtic have won 22 and East Fife 11 with six drawn.

East Fife will have pleasant memories of the last League Cup match at Bayview some years back when they won 2 - 0 with goals from George Christie and Andy Waddell.

But Celtic handed out a 6 - 0 thrashing in the second leg at Celtic Park.
