Manager David White has a talk with you **PERSONALLY SPEAKING**



Desperate situations require desperate measures. This was never more obvious than in our recent Premier League game at Tannadice. I have said on previous occasions that though the new league set up has much to commend it, there is no doubt it has brought severe pressures to bear on the players and this created problems in this particular game.

I don't think anyone can accuse me of making an excuse when I say the game was far too physical to become a contest of skill. It seems to me we are now in a situation when managers are merely paying lip service to things that are required to bring people back to the game. That all the talk about entertainment and protection of ball players is just so much talk.

I remember the days when Motherwell were reckoned one of the best football playing sides in the country, if not the best, with ball players like St. John, Hunter, Reid and Quinn. On one occasion they were due to play a team in Fife, whose instructions to their players

was "Get the ball in the air—they can't play football there!" This, all too often, was the case at Tannadice.

CONVINCING DISPLAY

However, let's move on to things more positive. Going to Pittodrie since the arrival of Ally McLeod has proved to be a difficult task for most clubs. On Saturday, however, we won 1-0 at Pittodrie with a very convincing display, no matter that some reports would have you believe otherwise.

This was a very vital game for us in that I had decided to bank a little more on our experienced players and I would say this was one aspect that saw us through the game at Pittodrie. I can only hope that experience brings with it consistency.

TODAY'S GAME

Today's game against Celtic will be a severe test for the experienced players who have not played too regularly of late. Celtic, of course, this week obtained the transfer of Johnny Doyle, who, so far, has proved to be a thorn in the flesh in our games against Ayr United this season. No doubt he will be all out to do the same today for his new club.

Once again our reserves have shown their ability to reach the final stages of Cup matches by getting to the final of the 2nd XI. Cup for the third year in a row. Let's hope it will be a case of third time lucky, since it is most important for the future of young players to have experience of winning competitions, so that they can carry it with them in to the first team when that time comes.

Our visitors today are Celtic, who lead the Premier League table at present. When we met them at Dens Park in November we won 1-0 with a Bobby Robinson goal. Our team that day was—Allan, Caldwell, Johnston, Ford, Stewart, Gemmell, Strachan, Robinson, Wallace, Gordon, Purdie.

OUR OPPONENTS

PETER LATCHFORD—It was just over a year ago Celtic brought this Under-23 England international keeper to Scotland in an endeavour to solve a long standing problem. He played thirteen games in the final stages of last season, picking up a Scottish Cup medal in the process. During the close season, Celtic had no hesitation in completing his full transfer from West Bromwich Albion. Has missed only one first team game this season.

DANNY McGRAIN—A European Cup tie against Ujpest Dozsa gave Danny his big break. Although signed as a wing half from Maryhill Juniors in 1967 he was given his chance at full-back in this game. He was an outstanding success. Back has been his position ever since. He has gone on to win many Scottish Caps.

ANDY LYNCH—Two seasons ago Celtic secured the transfer of this well built player from Hearts. He made only occasional appearances in Celtic's first team. Playing at full-back in the reserve side suggested this could be his real position. Was given his first team chance in Celtic's last league game of the season—and the Scottish Cup Final. Collected a medal! Has retained the position ever since.

PAT McCLUSKEY—Another player who joined the club from Maryhill Juniors, three seasons after Danny McGrain. Although he has notched up many first team appearances, Pat is only now becoming a recognised first team regular. A strong player, a good tackler and hard to dispossess, Pat is 5 foot 9 in height and tips the scales just over the eleven stone mark.

RODDY MACDONALD — This tall strapping Highlander from Brora Rangers was signed by Celtic in 1972 as a possible successor to Billy McNeill, made one or two appearances in the first team when Billy was out of action. When the centre half retired at the end of last season, Celtic decided Roddy was indeed the man to take over. Has done so well that Willie Ormond picked him for Scotland's Under-23 pool.

JOHANNES EDVALDSSON—The experience of this man from Iceland has undoubtedly helped Roddy MacDonald to slip easily into Billy McNeill's boots. Also a centre half, Johannes is a tremendous defender, who doesn't hesitate to move up searching for goals. Keep an eye on him when corners or other set pieces come Celtic's way. Joined the club in the close season from Valur.

PAUL WILSON—It was in 1968 Paul joined the club from Maryhill Juniors. After being on the verge of a first team break through for some time he was given his chance a couple of seasons or so ago and was an immediate hit. Made 42 league and Cup appearances last season, during which he scored 21 goals.

KENNY DALGLISH — An automatic choice for Scotland. It was in 1967 he arrived at Parkhead from Cumbernauld Juniors. His tremendous energy and his ability to snap goals soon brought him first team recognition. Won his first full Scottish cap in 1972 against Holland. Scored 20 league and Cup goals last season.

DIXIE DEANS—It was four seasons ago manager Jock Stein persuaded Motherwell to transfer Dixie, or to give him his proper name John Deans, to Celtic. What a sound move that has proved to be. Dixie has continued in his role as a fine goal scorer and no defence can rest content when he is around. Thirteen is his goal tally this season to date.

RONNIE GLAVIN — It was a year ago Celtic made a successful bid to Partick Thistle for Ronnie. Made his debut against Airdrie at Parkhead and celebrated it with a goal in Celtic's 6-0 victory. Took part in 20 games last season, scoring seven goals. Has been in and out of the team this season.

BOBBY LENNOX — A Lisbon Lion, Bobby is one of the greatest servants ever to grace Celtic's colours. It was away back in 1961 he joined the club from Ardeer Recreation. Since then he has gone on to win honours galore. Extremely fast he is a top class goal scorer and no defence can be happy when he is near goal.

TOMMY CALLAGHAN—In his seven seasons at Parkhead, Fifer Tommy has proved to be a real handyman. 6 foot 1 inch in height, Tommy first attracted attention when with Lochore Welfare in Fife junior ranks. Was persuaded by Dunfermline to join full-back brother Willie at East End Park. This cultured player is more of a goal-maker than a goal scorer.

ANDY RITCHIE—First put pen to paper when he was a pupil with Bellshill Academy. When called up the youngster quickly impressed with the reserves. Has been given a first team outing once or twice this season and is obviously one for the future.

ROY AITKEN — Like Ritchie, this seventeen year old is another player whose prospects look really bright—and he's still at school! A pupil of St. Andrews School, Saltcoats he's busy studying for four highers at the moment, to add to the seven O levels he has gained. Played in the first team against Aberdeen and Hibs.

HARRY HOOD—Began his career with Clyde whom he joined in 1962 from the Brunswick Boys' Club. Almost signed by Celtic when with Clyde but was transferred instead to Sunderland. Since joining Celtic six years ago he has given excellent service. Although out of the team recently, he was recalled for their European game against Sachsenring Zwickau.

JACKY McNAMARA — Although he has been five seasons on Celtic's books, this youngster has had very few opportunities to show his talents in the first team—Kenny Dalglish has seen to that! Nevertheless, Jacky is highly regarded by all at Parkhead. A product of Cumbernauld Juniors.
