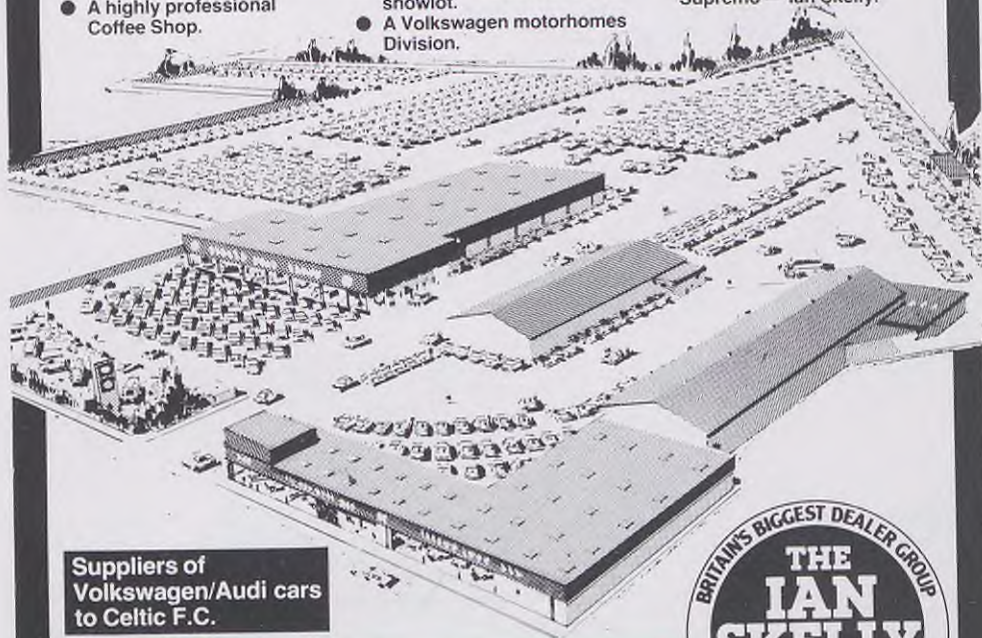

CELTIC and Hearts have contested many keen battles in League and Cup competitions, in fact Celtic's first official League match was at Tynecastle.

The men from Glasgow travelled to Tynecastle on August 23, 1890 to record a 5-0 victory and collect two League points.

Nearer the present day, there have also been some exciting matches and this afternoon we look back at two of them, both League matches.

The first was played at Celtic Park on December 25, 1947 and Celtic won 4-2. Scorers for Celtic that day were McDonald (2), Brogan and Walsh.

Almost 29 years later, the two clubs were involved in another high scoring clash. On November 20, 1976 they met at Celtic Park and goals by McDonald, Lennox, Dalglish and Glavin gave Celtic a 4-3 victory.

CELTIC ABROAD ...

THIS week we travel to Switzerland for a European Cup Winners Cup first round first leg match.

The opposition was provided by Basle, the Swiss Cup holders. Celtic were to reach the semi-final of the tournament that season and got off to a flying start beating Basle 5-1 on September 17 and 5-0 in the second leg at Celtic Park on October 9, 1963.

Celtic's ten goals were shared by Hughes (3), Divers (3), Chalmers, Murdoch, Johnstone and Lennox.

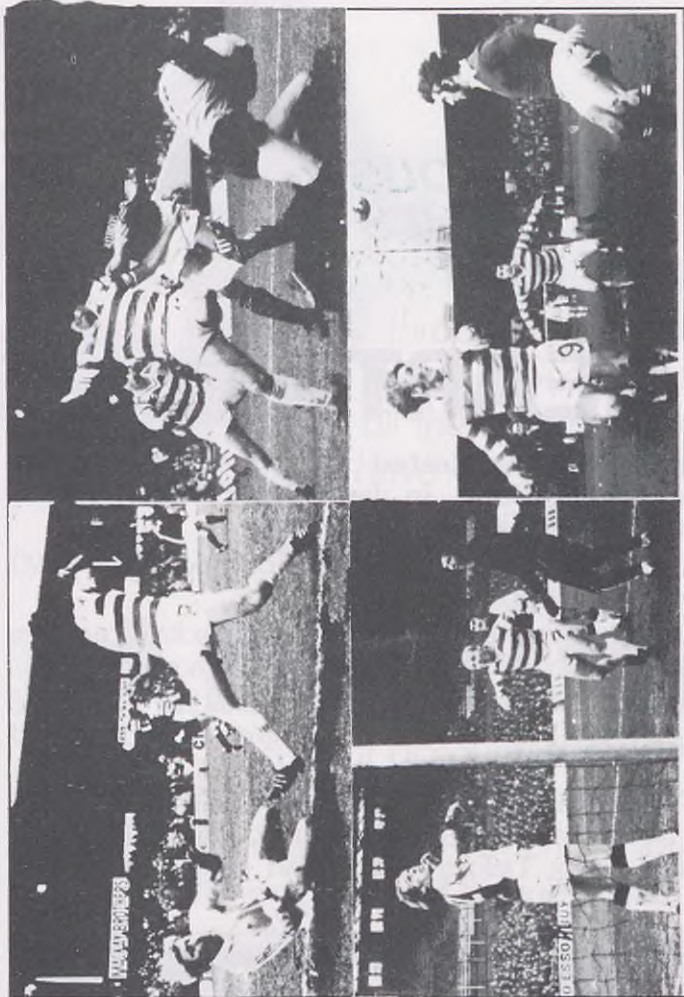

FACT FILE ON . . .

HEARTS

ALEX MacDONALD. Alex is the player-manager at Hearts, where he made 24 League appearances himself last season in midfield.

Joined the club from Rangers in 1980 and steered the club back to the Premier Division at the end of the 1982-83 season, finishing as runners-up in the First Division.

HENRY SMITH. Goalkeeper, age 28. Was signed from Leeds United in 1981 and has been the regular choice in goal for Hearts since his transfer. Last season he played in all 36 League games and in the previous season as instrumental in Hearts' promotion campaign.

BRIAN WHITTAKER. Aged 28. Another 1984 close season signing, this time from Celtic, where he made 10 League appearances last season as a full-back.

SANDY JARDINE. Age 36. Started in League football with Rangers, who signed him from Edinburgh Athletic in 1965. After a distinguished career for Rangers and Scotland he moved to Hearts in July 1982 and as well as being an able defender, he is assistant manager to Alex MacDonald.

WALTER KIDD. Age 26. Joined Hearts from Newtongrange Star in 1977 and made his League debut against Montrose in October that year. A regular choice at right-back, where he missed only five League games during 1983-84.

RODDY MacDONALD. Age 30. A former Scotland Under-23 international who started his League career with Celtic, who signed him from Brora Rangers in 1972. A centre-half, he moved on

to Hearts in 1981 and is the automatic choice in the number five shirt, missing only two League games last season.

KENNY BLACK. Age 21. Signed by Hearts in the 1984 close season from Motherwell, where he had made 17 League appearances during the 1983-84 season. Occasionally plays in midfield, where he can also be effective. He joined Motherwell from Rangers.

CRAIG LEVEIN. Age 20. Was signed from Cowdenbeath in November 1983. Having played the first 15 games of the 1983-83 season for his previous club, he went on to play the last 22 consecutive games for Hearts.

SANDY CLARK. Age 28. A formidable goalscorer, he joined Hearts this season from Rangers. Played at Ibrox for just over one season.

JOHN ROBERTSON. Age 20. An exciting young striker who signed for Hearts from Edina Hibs in 1980 and has made great progress since. Last season he missed only two League games, finished the season as the club's top scorer with 14 League goals plus five in Cup competitions and was voted "Young Player of the Year" by the Scottish PFA.

GARY MacKAY. Age 20. A product of the Salvesen Boys Club from where he was signed by Hearts in 1980. Started to establish himself in the first team during the 1981-82 season and is now a regular choice, having made 31 League appearances last season, usually at number eight.

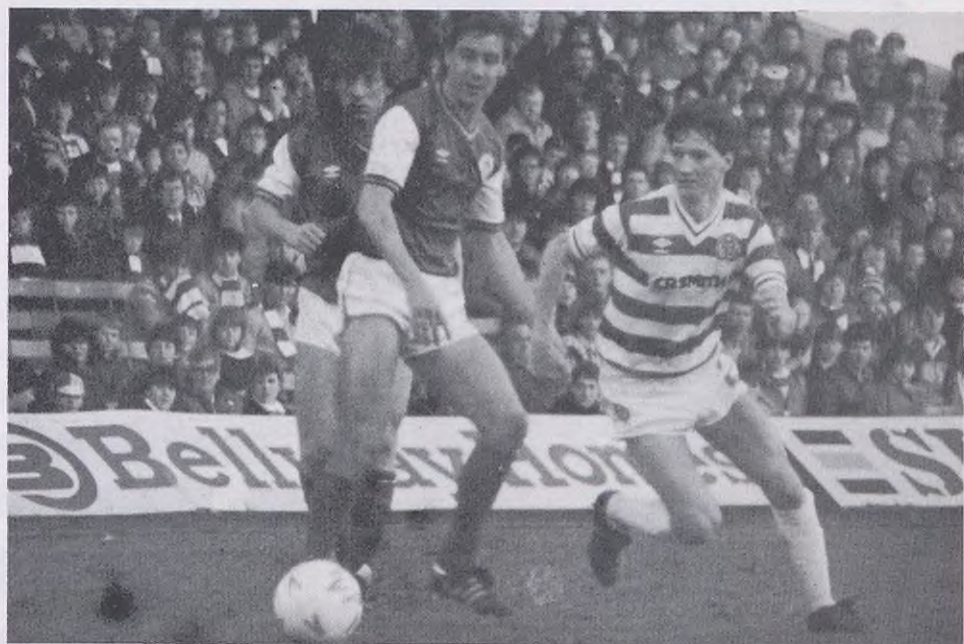

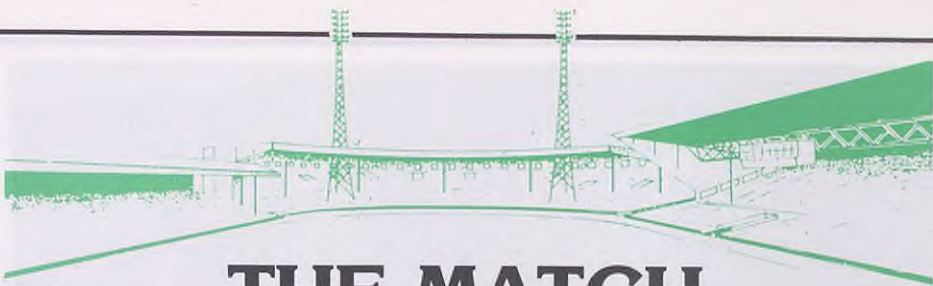

THIS TIME LAST YEAR ...

... we travelled up to Dens Park, Dundee to play in a re-arranged Premier League match only five days before the League Cup Final with Rangers.

The home side had the first chance to score but Pat Bonner did well to stop Ferguson's header. Celtic retaliated with Davie Provan, Brian McClair and Tommy Burns all coming close to scoring. Then came the opening goal seconds before the half-time whistle. McClair passed to Burns who had two efforts blocked by defenders, but his third found the back of the net.

Within five minutes of the restart Dundee equalised when Pat Bonner failed to hold a shot from Harris and Walker McCall netted the rebound. Six minutes later the home side took the lead. The scorer was Ray Stephen who ran onto a long ball from McKinlay and flicked it over Bonner. Celtic piled on the pressure but it was Dundee who scored next in the 77th minute when McCall put them 3-1 up. With eight minutes left Jim Melrose was tripped in the penalty area and Mark Reid converted the spot kick. Despite some late pressure, Celtic failed to equalise.

The Celtic side had been: Latchford, McCluskey, Brogan, Glavin, Welsh, Connelly, Johnstone, Dalglish, Deans, Callaghan, Hood. Subs: Wilson (Deans), Hood (Glavin).

In the following Wednesday's *Celtic View*, Jock Stein said: "We had more chances in the match at Broomfield than we had when we beat Airdrie 6-0 at Parkhead. In the first quarter of an hour this match could have been tied up and Bobby Lennox had chances he would have snapped up at any other time.

"Changes will be made for Saturday and providing we stay clear of illness problems I know the sort of formation that will play at Hampden next Wednesday".

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO ...

Saturday March 21, 1970

CELTIC returned from Florence to play Ayr United at Celtic Park and consolidated their top of the League position with a 3-0 win over the Somerset Park team. Full details of the game:

Celtic 3 (Lennox, Wallace 2), Ayr United 0. CELTIC: Williams; Craig and Gemmell; Connelly, McNeill and Brogan; Macari and Wallace; Hood, Callaghan and Lennox. Twelfth man: Murdoch.

It had been quite a week for Celtic — with fine victories over Fiorentina and Ayr United and the excitement of the European Cup draw against Leeds. The display in Florence had fully justified the tactics decided on and our players won this tie with a great deal more in hand than the 3-1 aggregate indicates.

IT'S A FACT

- ☆ **THIS** is the 179th League meeting between Celtic and Hearts. Of the previous 178 we have won 91, drawn 40 and lost 47 scoring 333 goals and conceding 226.
- ☆ **SINCE** the start of the Premier League we have won 17, drawn 3 and lost 2, scoring 57 goals and conceding 17.
- ☆ **HEARTS** are only two goals short of having scored 100 League goals against us at Celtic Park.
- ☆ **OUR** longest unbeaten run against Hearts at Celtic Park is 37 games between 1902/03 and 1938/39, including 14 wins in a row.
- ☆ **AT** Tynecastle Hearts' longest unbeaten run against Celtic in 11 games between 1955/56 and 1965/66.
- ☆ **HEARTS** have not won at Celtic Park since 1969/70 when they won 2-0. Since then we have won 14 of the 16 matches played here.
- ☆ **THIS** season was Hearts' 7th season competing in Europe and the first time since 1976/77.
- ☆ **OUR** 5-1 win at Tynecastle earlier in the season was our biggest win there since 1938/39 when we won by the same score.

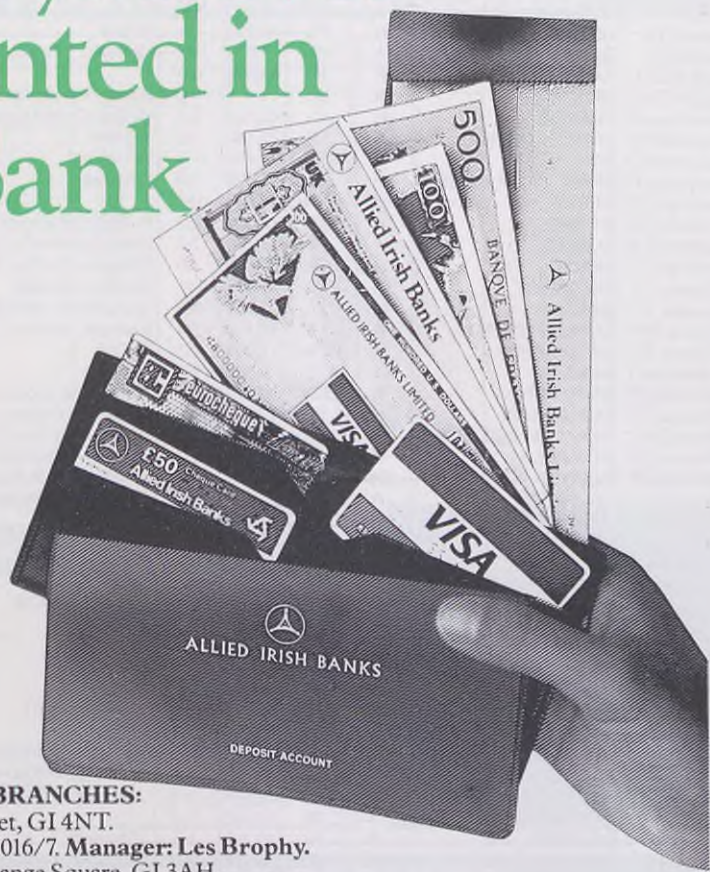
