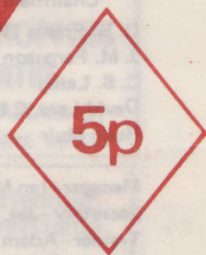

MATCH REVIEWS

THE PLAYERS had to cope yet again with a fiery ball in Tuesday's re-arranged match with Dumbarton. Early on we came close twice, when the 'keeper deflected with his foot a Reynolds shot and again when McCulloch shot past from an acute angle.

Against the run of the game, the Sons took the lead from a penalty awarded against Reynolds, but the team weathered the setback, with the forwards showing a marked readiness to shoot.

McCulloch, Whiteford and Wilson all had bad luck with good tries, yet we were going through a sticky spell.

Our midfield play was far too close and we were not, as a team, going hard enough for the ball. This was rectified after the interval in an incredible second half during which Dumbarton were pushed back into defence by nonstop assault.

Reynolds created more space after moving on the wing, and McCann worked and buzzed at his best.

Nevertheless, the luck appeared to be out for Wilson and Walker each hit a post with the 'keeper beaten. Jonquin and Lapsley kept pressing along the wings, only to be thwarted by weight of numbers.

Menzies came up in some stirring solo runs; Whiteford and Wilson persevered in their search for a way through. Something had to give. Then McCulloch's legs gave way under a tackle from behind and Jonquin sank the penalty with his usual sangfroid.
