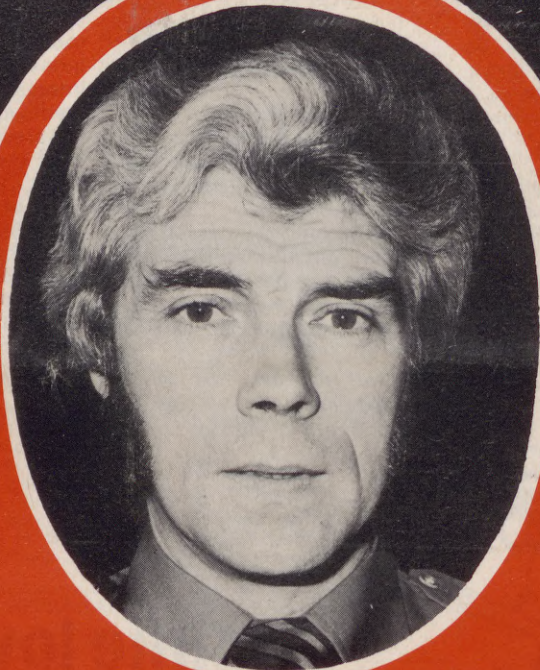

Certainly everybody is working hard behind the scenes. The boys are learning more about the big survival game every week.

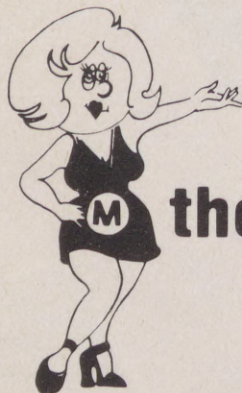
The difference between the Premier League and the First Division is great enough but the sheer sustained pressure of the top league compared with the second division,

## The 'Mystery' of Kilbowie!

**THERE'S** no truth in the rumour Clydebank are considering hiring a private detective to tell them the mystery of Kilbowie this season.

Even though manager Bill Munro and his players feel that the side play better away from home, it is a fact that five of their seven Premier League points have been won at Kilbowie.

"It's certainly an intriguing situation," says the Bankies boss, "but it is a fact that clubs always look to pick up the vast majority of their points at home. The smaller pitch suits us more than the bigger clubs. I only hope we pick up a lot more here in the future.

"Today's game against Celtic has caught me in two minds. I don't know whether to be glad or sorry that we are facing them. On the one hand it will be hard, very hard, and because we are at the bottom of the league, all our matches are hard.

"One thing I do know. The players won't need to be motivated for this game, nor for next Saturday's clash against Rangers. The big crowds will give plenty of atmosphere to Kilbowie and that will spur on the players.

"They gave the 'Old Firm' a run for their money when they played them earlier in the season and I expect them to do so again this afternoon and next Saturday as well."

### A 'NIGHTMARE' FOR HIBS...

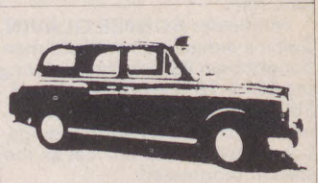

# MEET CELTIC

**CELTIC** come to Kilbowie today having regained some of the form which has been missing for most of the season. They have dropped only one point in their last five Premier League matches, and they had to come from behind in all of them to gain the necessary points.

The men who will wear Celtic's colours today will probably come from the following pool of players.

Goalkeeper **PETER LATCHFORD**. Signed for Celtic in the summer of 1975, having guested for the club earlier in the year. He had previously played all his senior football with West Bromwich Albion. His brother Bob is a forward with Everton.

Fullback **ANDY LYNCH**. Was brought from Hearts in 1973, but failed to make an immediate impact on the left wing. Towards the end of '74-75 season Jock Stein introduced him to the left back position and he went on to win a Scottish Cup medal in his new role.

Midfielder **RONNIE GLAVIN**. Celtic's industrious midfielder man, bought from Partick Thistle during the 1974-75 season for a fee of £80,000. He took some time to settle into his new surroundings, but started to find his feet as the season progressed.

Unfortunately, has dropped out of the team at the moment but might come into contention for a place on the bench this afternoon.

Midfielder **JOHANNES EDVALDSSON**. Was signed by Celtic after a spell in Danish football. The big Icelander previously played for Valur of Reykjavic and has captained the Iceland International team many times. Outwith football he is a qualified physical training teacher. Recently asked for a transfer, yet is playing brilliantly!

Defender **RODDY McDONALD**. Signed from Brora

Rangers, the Highland League side, following a recommendation from former Celt Sammy Wilson. Took over the pivot role when Billy McNeill retired in 1975 and must be one of the most improved players in the Premier League.

Midfielder **ROY AITKEN**. Was signed on an "S" form when he was a 14-year-old and was then farmed out to Celtic Boys' Club to further his playing experience. Played a number of top team games for the club in

1975-76 when still at school, but he is a full time player now.

Forward **PAUL WILSON**. Another player who arrived at Celtic Park after gaining football experience with Maryhill Juniors. Took a little longer than most to claim a regular team jersey, but in the last two seasons he has been a regular member of the first team squad.

Forward **JOHNNY DOYLE**. Joined Celtic from Ayr United for a fee of £90,000 at the end of

the 1975-76 season and has quickly established himself in the Celtic scheme of things. Plenty of skill and speed, he normally plays on the right wing, but Celtic have played him as a striker too.

Forward **JOE CRAIG**. Was signed from Partick Thistle in September 1976 for a fee in the region of £50,000. He joined Thistle from Sauchie Juniors in 1971 and played for the Scottish League against the English League last season. Joe's a tall bustling centre forward who is good in the air and shows remarkably good ball control on the ground.

Defender **JOE FILIPPI**. Signed only a few weeks ago from Ayr United for a fee of £15,000 plus Brian McLaughlin. Hasn't completely settled yet, but is improving week by week. Played very well in Celtic's 3-2 win over Aberdeen last Saturday.

Defender **FRANK MUNRO**. Currently on loan from Wolves and fulfilling a boyhood ambition to play for Celtic. Although Celtic are interested in signing him permanently, the player isn't at all sure he wants to uproot his family from their present home in the Midlands. Plays mainly as a sweeper.

Forward **TOM McADAM**. Signed earlier this season from Dundee United for a fee in the region of £60,000 and has quickly settled into the side. Got the goal against Rangers in the league a fortnight ago and had another one chalked off. Can play in midfield or attack.

Forward **ALFIE CONN**. Joined Celtic earlier this year to become one of the few players who has played for both Celtic and Rangers. Suffered a bad injury in the first league game of the season, but has now fully recovered. Stylish player, who always poses a threat when on the ball.

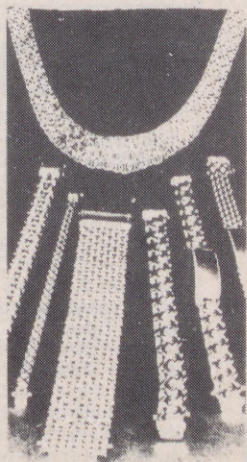
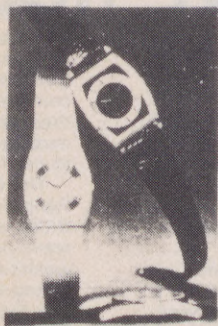

## RESERVE ROUND-UP

**THE Reserves haven't done too well in their last three matches. In their two home games against Partick Thistle and Dundee United they could only draw 0-0 on each occasion, and in a Second Eleven Cup tie against Rangers at Ibrox they went down 6-2 after extra time.**

"The two league games against Thistle and Dundee United should really have seen four points come our way," says coach Sam Henderson. "We held most of the play in both games, but just didn't cash in on our chances."

Last week against Dundee United they missed opportunities galore and, in fact, hit the

woodwork with six minutes remaining. Against Thistle the Colts missed a penalty which, if converted, would have been the signal for a goal barrage, so much were the Bankies superior to the Firhill side.

The 6-2 defeat against Rangers indicated that the Light Blues were by far the better team, but this most certainly wasn't the case. At the end of ninety minutes the score was 1-1, Gerry Ronald having scored Bankies goal midway through the second half.

At the interval of extra time the score was 2-2 and it was only in the final fifteen minutes that the home team raced ahead. They added four goals to their tally and that meant the end of

Clydebank's Cup hopes.

"I think we have lacked a little fighting quality over the past few games. I'm quite certain that if it had been Rangers or Celtic jerseys they had been wearing then sheer pride and tradition for the club would have brought them back into the game. That's one aspect of our game we will be working on,"
