FIFTEEN YEARS ago on Saturday, March 31, 1962, Hearts beat Hibs 3-2 in an East of Scotland Shield Final at Tynecastle. It completed a hat-trick against the Hibs whom we had beaten twice in the League. Hearts struck first in the 11th minute when Danny Paton headed home a Bobby Blackwood cross. Three minutes late Hibs were even when Stevenson cracked home a Fraser pass. On the half hour Paton notched his second goal and with only seven minutes to go Danny had a hand in Hearts third counter when he brilliantly dummied a Rodger cross for Willie Wallace to score.

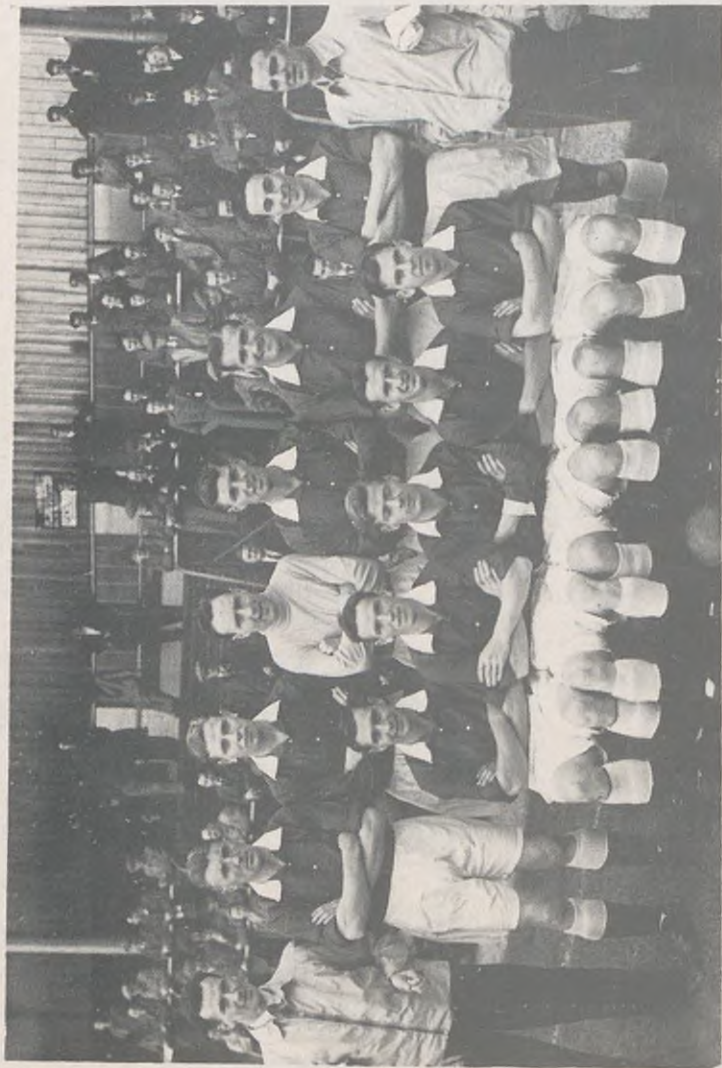
