## JOCK STEIN says...

There is a great deal of football ability among the players of both Celtic and Aberdeen, so tonight's Drybrough Cup semifinal can hardly be other than a good match. No doubt the spectators will have turned up in large numbers and the atmosphere will encourage an exciting encounter.

Both clubs will be changed in personnel compared with the Drybrough final of last year. Both will be minus players who have been injured. Nevertheless all of us look forward to the match even though I am one of those who are not really enamoured of this kind of cup-tie football at this time of year. Personally I am looking most of all for signs of success in the future.

### COMPARISON

The clubs are, of course, appreciative of the Drybrough sponsorship but some of us think that players are not sufficiently tuned up for knock-out football before the season starts. When the League Cup is our first commitment it gives us a much more gradual build-up at the start of the season. Don't forget that though all the first division sides won on Saturday there could have been results which would not only have been unexpected but would have caused consternation. They would have been caused more through the bigger clubs being under par than through surprising ability of the lesser clubs.

I shall say no more about the offside conditions of the tournament than to repeat that it seems strange



that clubs who won their places through scoring goals are adjudged to need further assistance to do so.

Aberdeen will be like ourselves—they will proceed as if the offside condition does not exist. As holders of the trophy they visit Parkhead with prestige. Dons have given us so many fine matches in recent seasons that we do not now expect them to be other than excellent opponents.

We wish Manager Bonthron and his men a fine season.

# LAST SEVEN CELTIC-DONS MATCHES

## ABERDEEN WON FOUR, DRAWN THREE

Aberdeen have an outstandingly good record against Celtic in recent years. In view of Celtic's monopoly of the major honours it is a remarkable fact that of the last seven matches between Aberdeen and Celtic the Dons have won four and drawn the three others.

The last time Celtic beat Aberdeen in any competition was in a league game at Pittodrie in October, 1969, when the result was 3-2. The last time Celtic defeated Dons at Celtic Park was in the League Cup in September, 1969, when the result was 2-1. The results of the seven matches since October, 1969, have been (Aberdeen goals first):—

March, 1970—League (Celtic Park)—2-1.	April, 1970—Scottish Cup final (Hampden Park)—3-1.
December, 1970—League (Celtic Park)—1-0.	April, 1971—League (Pittodrie Park)—1-1.
August, 1971—Drybrough Cup final (Pittodrie Park)—2-1.	November, 1971—League (Celtic Park)—1-1.
March, 1972—League	(Pittodrie Park)—1-1.

## DRYBROUGH CUP HOLDERS

Aberdeen are holders of the Drybrough Cup which they won a year ago when they beat Celtic 2-1 in the final at Pittodrie Park. That was the first Drybrough Cup competition. The teams in the final were:—

### Dons Forwards

Aberdeen have been unfortunate in the matter of injuries during the close season and it is certain that they will not have the services tonight of at least a couple of players in their first-team pool.

Having obtained the transfer of Drew Jarvie from Airdrieonians and Barrie Mitchell from Dunfermline, Dons seem to have a very strong forward pool. When all are fit Jim Forrest, Dave Robb, Joe Harper, Mitchell, Jarvie, Arthur Graham, Bertie Miller, George Buchan, Alec Willoughby and Ian Taylor will be vying for places in the attack. We note, however, that former Rangers man Willoughby has recently been employed as a full back.

# ABERDEEN'S RECORD IN THE FIRST DIVISION CHAMPIONS OF LAST 16-CLUB LEAGUE

Aberdeen, formed in 1903, joined the second division of the Scottish League in 1904 and played for the first time in the first division in season 1905-06. Only in seasons 1917-18 and 1918-19 have they not played in the top league. Difficulty of travel in wartime caused their exclusion. They have never been relegated.

They have won the first division championship once — in 1954-55. Then they finished three points ahead of Celtic (runners-up) with 49 points compared with 46. That was the last season of a league of 16 clubs. Ever since the first division has been of 18 clubs.

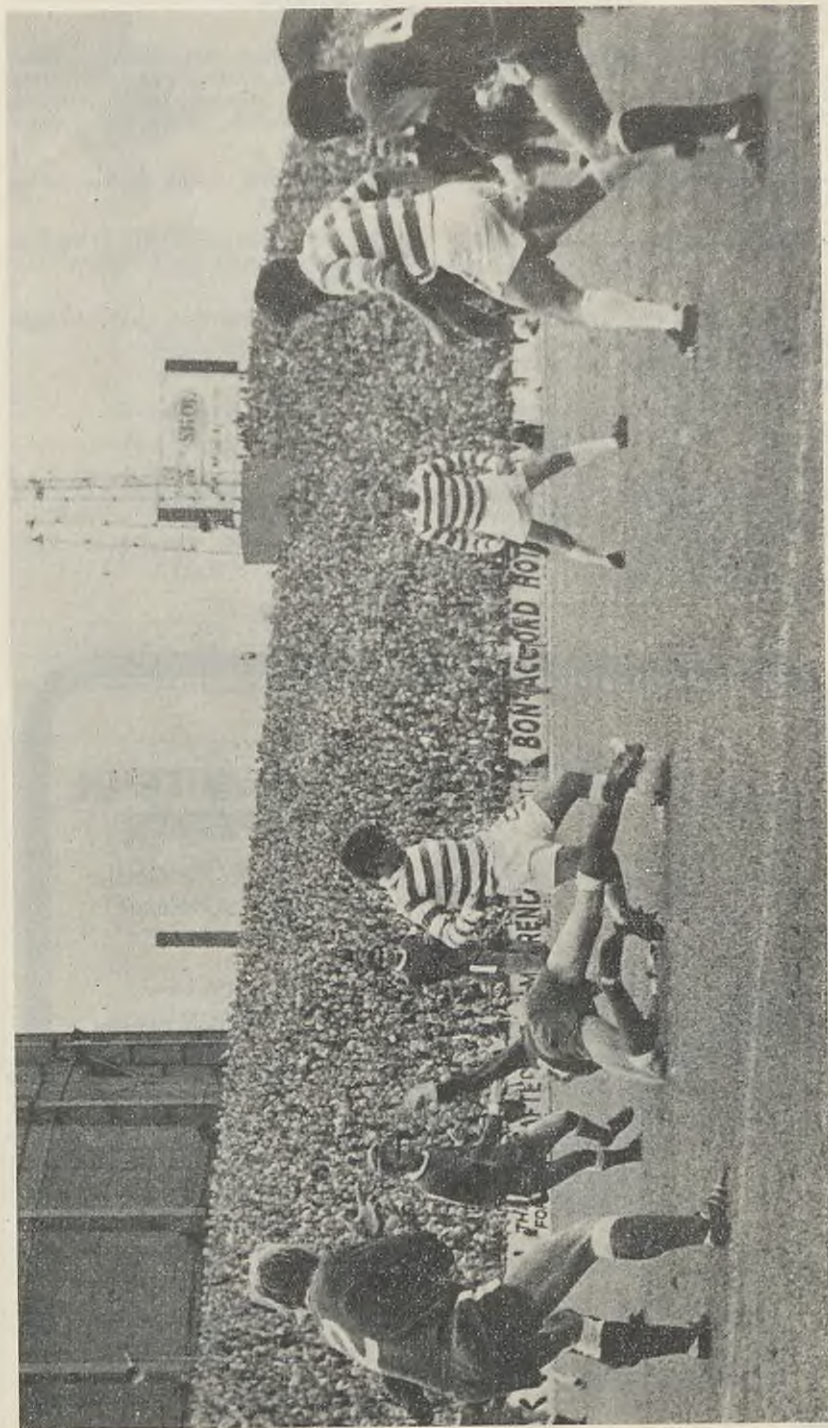
