...Key to success in the Premier League



TODAY'S match with Celtic heralds the start of Scotland's new Premier League, a new set-up which Ibrox boss Jock Wallace fervently hopes will bring spectators all the excitement and action they want from football.

"If I thought that every Premier League match would be as exciting as our game last week with Motherwell, I would be happy and so would every football fan," says Jock.

"The excitement at Fir Park happens when two teams are totally committed to attacking, scoring goals and winning.

"That is the way Rangers play. That is how we have always gone about winning matches and we are certainly not going to stop now.

"I can't say that every Premier League side will be so prepared to come at us as Motherwell did last Saturday, but if they

do it should make for some great football."

The new League set-up means that Celtic are Rangers opening League opponents—something that guarantees a fast-moving game if recent matches are anything to go by—and also restores the Old Firm's January fixture to New Year's Day.

Jock Wallace is pleased that Rangers and Celtic will meet again on January 1. "That is the traditional day for the game, and I'm glad it has reverted back to that date.

"Don't get me wrong. I appreciate the reasons for changing the date in recent years, but I was brought up to expect Derby games—not just Rangers v. Celtic—on Ne'erday and I'm glad they are back."

NEW SIGNING

RANGERS latest signing, 19-year-old midfielder player Ken Watson made his Ibrox debut for the Reserve side against Airdrie on Tuesday.
