

EDITORIAL

Have Hibs fans lost the taste for champagne? I ask the question because we've had very little response to our competition - outlined in the Cowdenbeath programme - to guess who will get the club's 5,000th League goal. We are offering a magnum of champagne to anyone who can correctly forecast the scorer of that milestone and the match it will occur in (if there is a tie, first correct entry opened takes the bubbly). It was Robert McCutcheon from Bonnyrigg who brought the matter to our attention as we were only 28 goals from the target at the start of this season. The Hibe welcomes **CELTIC**

Celtic visit Easter Road twice within the next four days, and both matches are vital. Tonight, a place in the last four of the Skol Cup beckons and on Saturday both clubs will be anxious to pick up full League points, for different reasons. Hibs managed only one goal in their four League meetings with the Parkhead club last season but won the most recent match between the clubs at Celtic Park last March. Manager Davie Hay won his first trophy with Celtic last May when Frank McGarvey (now St. Mirren) netted the Scottish Cup Final winner against Dundee United but the League title is still the most coveted prize and Hay will be pleased with the start Celtic have made in the Premier League as they are still undefeated and currently lie third, just a point behind leaders Rangers. They could, of course, be lying top if they had defeated Rangers on Saturday.

Celtic have so far hit eleven goals in the Skol Cup (one less than Hibs) – defeating Queen of the South 4-1 at Palmerston Park and crushing Brechin (who held Hibs to a no-scoring draw in a pre-season friendly) 7-0 in last week's third round. One of the most encouraging features of Celtic's play this season has been the return to form of Mo Johnston up front. He could well be a vital part of Jock Stein's plans for next Tuesday's World Cup qualifier against Wales.



LOOKS BACK

We continue our adaptations from a new book by John R. Mackay entitled *The Hibeas – the Story of Hibernian Football Club* which is due to be published by John Donald Publishers Ltd. of Edinburgh in early November.


The Celtic Connection 1887-91

Hibernian, as Scottish Cup holders, met Preston at Easter Road in a match billed as "Association Football Championships of the World" in 1887. Hibs won 2-1 and a measure of their achievement came a week later when Preston met Rangers in Glasgow in a match to mark the official opening of Ibrox. A report at the time: "After Preston had scored eight goals, a section of the crowd, gradually becoming more and more irritated, invaded the pitch. The game was stopped."

Celtic were formed in November 1887 and the aims of the club set out in 1888 were: "funds for the maintenance of . . . needy children" and to select "a team which will be able to do credit to the Catholics of the West of Scotland as the Hibernians have been doing in the East". Hibs inaugurated the new season at Celtic Park in August 1888 and lost 3-2. The result marked a slump in Hibs' fortunes and when Celtic visited Easter Road on October 20, the crowd held them responsible for their favourite's demise. Several Hibs players had defected to the Celtic club and when the visitors led 3-0 at half-time, the home crowd became agitated. Several hundred fans invaded the pitch three times in the second half but Celtic held on to win.

More players were to leave the club after this, and by August 1890 the decline of Hibs was just about complete due to cash problems. Hibs were told to quit Easter Road and in August 1891 the club, having failed to pay their subscription to the S.F.A., were deleted from the Association.

Player's Choice . . . GORDON RAE



Central defender Gordon Rae continues our series where Hibs stars choose the two players – one past, one present – who have impressed them most in their own particular role. Gordon, who has also played up front, has chosen both a defender and a striker.

"Franz Beckenbauer, the West German internationalist, is possibly the classiest player I can remember. His role as sweeper was innovative and teams, both at club and international level, have copied his style. Class hallmarked everything he did and he could also move upfield and score important goals. His performance in the World Cup in Mexico in 1970, first brought him to my attention. Both his courage to play with an injury in the semi-final against Italy and his quarter-final goal against England stick out in my mind. The Germans looked well out of the match against England when they trailed 0-2, but Beckenbauer's first goal turned the tide.

"The player I'd least like to play against nowadays is Liverpool's Ian Rush. He has a happy knack of scoring and he's so quick in the box. He'll always hit the target given half a chance. Rush doesn't seem to be involved too much in the build-up but he is a lethal finisher. He's such a direct player and the goal he scored for Wales in the World Cup Qualifier at Hampden last season summed up all his qualities. But he's so consistent for Liverpool, it's difficult to pick just one match that sticks in my mind."
