# THE POWERFUL CELTIC PLAYER POOL

**EVAN WILLIAMS**—*Goalkeeper*. 5 ft. 9 ins., 11 st. One of the most travelled members of the Parkhead staff having seen service with Third Lanark, Aston Villa and Wolverhampton Wanderers. He has proved another shrewd signing by Manager Jock Stein. Shows excellent anticipation and the sharpness of his reflexes makes what could be a difficult save appear comparatively easy.

**JAMES CRAIG**—*Right-back*. 5 ft. 11 ins., 11 st. 12 lbs. Was taken off with a nose injury in the match with Kokkola after only 30 minutes, but has made good progress. He has been most unlucky as he had just returned following a rib injury. The intelligent defender can be written as Britain's "brain" of the football world as he demonstrated in the recent Football Quiz, won for the second consecutive year by Celtic.

**DANNY McGRAIN**—*Right-back*. 5 ft. 9 ins., 10 st. 12 lbs. Was given his first team baptism by a confident Jock Stein who knew his young player, who was signed as a left-half in 1967, would come through with distinction at right-back. Once again he was proved correct. Young McGrain who played against Rangers in Celtic's 2-0 defeat of their rivals in the League last month, showed he had "arrived" as another member of the mighty Celtic Park pool.

**DAVID HAY**—*Back or half-back*. 5 ft. 5½ ins., 10 st. 5 lbs. Signed from the St. Mirrin Boys' Guild in 1965. the brilliant David is already a full-blooded International with many more honours to come. He will do any job delegated by his manager and do it with sagacity and talent. He could be played anywhere.

**BOBBY MURDOCH**—*Right-half*. 5 ft. 10 ins., 12 st. Remarkable to think that Bobby has been at Parkhead since 1961, going there from Cambuslang Rangers. He has been a Celtic key man in most of their greatest achievements by his generalship, power, example and ability to win a game by prodigious personal effort, although primarily a "team man".

**BILLY McNEILL**—*Centre-half*. 6 ft. 1 in., 12 st. Like Murdoch, wields an invaluable influence with his colleagues and will go down in the Celtic history books as one of the finest servants to wear the colours. Joined Celtic from Blantyre Victoria in 1957 as a centre-half, but also played at right-back and right-half. Has a long list of International honours.

**GEORGE CONNELLY**—6 ft. 1 in., 11 st. 12 lbs. Although signed from Tulliallan as an inside-forward, has shown he can perform superlatively in other berths, and is there to take over the pivotal position from Billy McNeill, when needed. Has emerged as one of the most outstanding young men this season.

**JIMMY JOHNSTONE**—*Outside-right*. 5 ft. 4 ins., 9 st. 8 lbs. Finnish fans were bitterly disappointed that illness kept him out of the European Cup second leg as they had heard his worth extolled by the Finnish Press by his wonder display against them in the first game. He has no superior in global football.

**HARRY HOOD**—*Inside-forward*. 5 ft. 9 ins., 11 st. Few are more expert in snapping a half-chance, while he ever aims to keep the front-line fluency unbroken. Was transferred to Celtic in 1969 after having had experience in English football—with Sunderland who let him return to Clyde in 1966. A wise signing.

**WILLIE WALLACE**—*Inside-right or centre*. 5 ft. 7 ins., 11 st. 3 lbs. Transferred from Hearts in 1966. Hearts secured him from Raith Rovers in 1961 as a centre-forward, but fielded him at inside, wing-forward and at outside-right. He has occupied more than one position up front with Celtic. A deadly marksman, determined and ambitious.

**LOU MACARI**—*Inside-forward*. 5 ft. 6 ins., 9 st. 2 lbs. Was signed from St. Michael's in 1966 and it was obvious another star had arrived at Parkhead. Groomed in the reserves, he was ready to take his big chance when Manager Jock Stein promoted him to the first team. A terrific taker of chances.

**BOBBY LENNOX**—*Outside or inside-left*. 5 ft. 6 ins., 10 st. 10 lbs. Was given the accolade of "player of the match" by the Finns in the European Cup second leg. Misses few chances. Discovered with Ardeer Recreation in 1961. His speed over the first ten yards can leave an opponent trailing at his heels. Has been a regular marksman in this tournament.
