

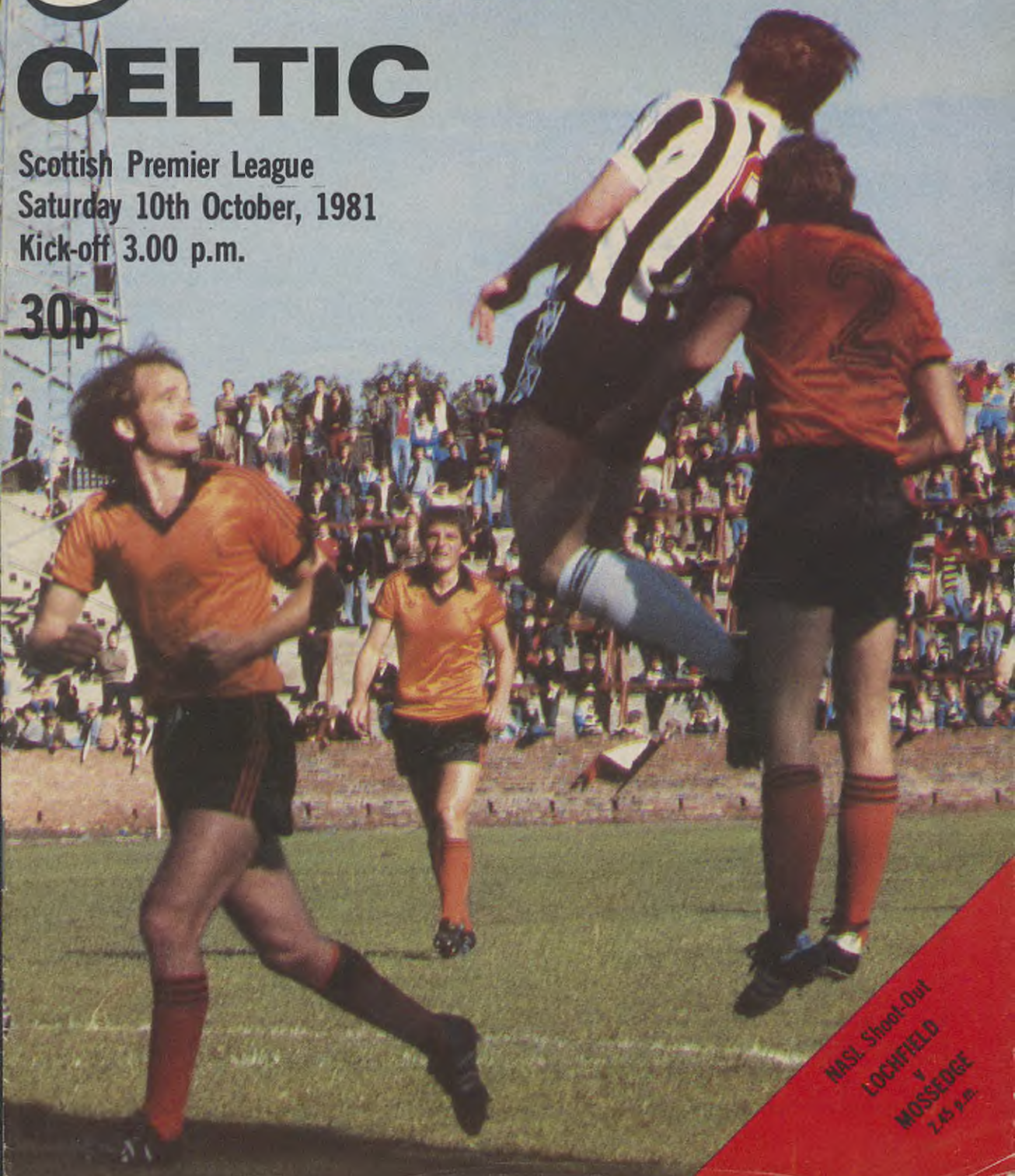

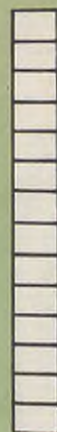

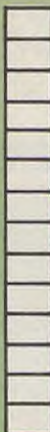

Love Street welcomes

CELTIC

CELTIC are going great guns. The only Premier League side with a 100 per cent record to date they are favourites to retain the championship.

They are an exciting squad given to fluent attack at speed and with sharpshooting strikers who make the most of the opportunities created. And not only the front runners get into the goals act. Their midfield players and defenders can be deadly at set pieces.

Failure to qualify in the League Cup (Saints had something to do with that) and a first round exit from Europe hasn't stopped the success march in the Premier League.

Like Saints, the Parkhead squad of manager Billy McNeill has had to meet with injury difficulties. Out of recent action has been their internationalists, full-back Danny McGrain and winger Davie Provan.

Nevertheless the club has coped well. Another of their group of youngsters, Davie

Moyes, has stepped into the McGrain role at right back and he has shown maturity beyond his years, especially in the red-hot European Cup tie against Juventus in Turin.

Indeed, it is as young a side as Celtic have fielded for a long time when one considers that goalkeeper Pat Bonner, full back Mark Reid and striker Charlie Nicholas only established themselves in the squad last season.

HIGHEST LEVEL

It was a transition that was effected while the championship was being won, though it shouldn't be assumed that manager Billy McNeill feels his work is finished in team fashioning.

He wants back into Europe to test his players at the highest level. They caught a red-hot number in Juventus and with the honesty which marked his play over many seasons with Celtic commented on his return

that Celts weren't good enough to go through.

In short, he has high standards for his players and one suspects he is impatient to get into conflict with the Continentals again to measure his side's improvement.

Of course that will have to come through the Premier League or Scottish Cup and of course there are still a number of challengers around.

Still if they can keep ahead until Danny McGrain (who had the plaster removed from his injured leg this week) and Davie Provan are back in action their championship chances will remain bright.

And in the background at Parkhead there are a number of bright young players "who are showing good progress", says manager McNeill.

On their last visit to Love Street, Celts truck home five goals in the League Cup, but that wasn't enough to stop St Mirren eventually qualifying.

PREMIER LEAGUE

AIRDRIE v DUNDEE:

Both sides need confidence-boosting wins. Dundee lost their first home game of the season to Celtic last week and Airdrie went down 4-1 at Ibrox. This match could turn on the touch of regular scorers like Sandy Clark of the home side and Dundee's Iain Ferguson.

DUNDEE UTD v PARTICK TH:

It could take United a bit of time to break down the well-organised defence of Partick Thistle, but with patience and their pace they can run out comfortable winners, despite losing 1-0 in midweek to Aberdeen at home in the first leg of their League Cup semi-final.

HIBERNIAN v MORTON:

What the papers say

ST MIRREN 2 RANGERS 2 (League Cup semi-final, first leg)

Glasgow Herald: Ian Scanlon's goal drought ended at Love Street when he kept St Mirren's League Cup hopes alive with a penalty equaliser in this torrid semi-final, first leg tie — a match which suddenly exploded with dramatic action in the second half.

Rangers were in front twice through an early Colin McAdam goal, but battling Saints stormed back each time to keep themselves in with a chance when the return is played at Ibrox.

Young Frank McAvennie gave them their first lifeline with a tremendous goal just before half-time after Jackie

Copland and Billy Thomson got in a terrible muddle to give Rangers their second goal.

Scanlon showed great coolness when he slotted in a penalty 17 minutes from time.

Daily Record: Rangers stand poised to reach the League Cup final after their first leg draw in their semi-final against St Mirren at Love Street. The away game, the most difficult hurdle, is behind them

Daily Mail: As a guide to the eventual outcome of this League Cup semi-final the first

leg at Love Street was as useful as an unmarked ruler.

By half-time we were left to reflect on disappointingly inept performances by the forward departments of each side. Rangers, like St Mirren, had done virtually nothing up front, but at least they were a goal ahead.

Yet we had to wait only four minutes after the interval before witnessing a marvelous goal. Young Frank McAvennie gathered the ball just inside his own half of the field, evaded four tackles on his way into the Rangers penalty area, and slid the ball under Jim Stewart's body for the equaliser.

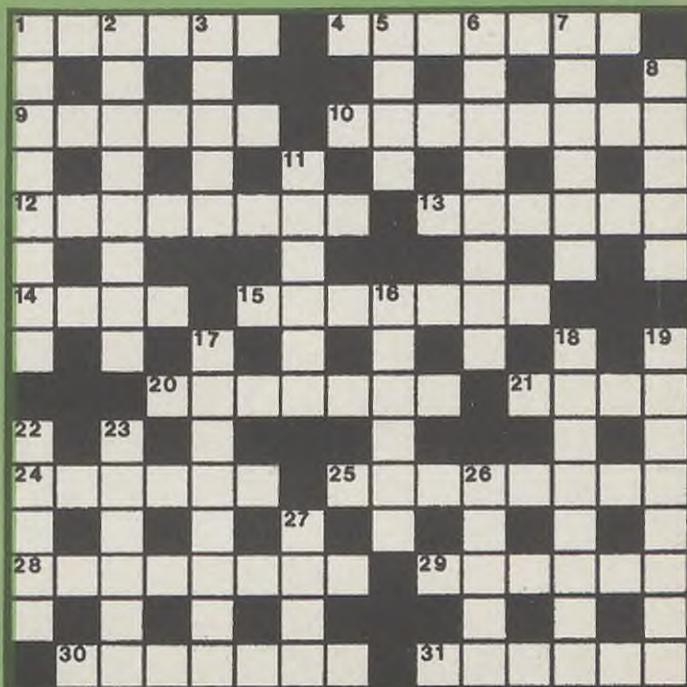

Part 9

SCOTLAND'S World Cup party reached Frankfurt on Friday June 7th to find the competition under siege.

Forty uniformed guards stood around the aircraft, while 40 more, dressed in mufti with tell-tale bulges under their left armpits stood around the terminal building.

A garish charabanc drove them some 30 miles to a grand hotel called the Erbsmuhle in a valley among the Taunus Hills. It was a secret place and the bomb squad had checked every bedroom before they arrived.

Zaire were far to the north in the Rhineland but Brazil and Yugoslavia, the other group opponents, were near at hand.

The team met Adolf, the security guard who was to



make sure that the Israeli incident of the 1972 Olympics did not happen again. Adolf was a playful man: 'Hit me there', he would ask Billy Bremner pulling his tee shirt up to expose a hard gut. Bremner would do so. Adolf would then laugh.

Ormond seemed overawed. He had been chosen as Scottish manager after Tommy Docher-

ty left for Manchester United and Willie Cunningham of Falkirk had declined the job. The events in Oslo had taken some revenge on the stomach and the nerve of a wee patriot from Musselburgh, a friend of the fishermen there, a good listener to other people's renditions of the Burns ballads. He was missing Margaret, his wife.

The squad was greeted with champagne cocktails, the camera shutters clicked and a Brazilian journalist asked: "Are they sober today?" There was a week of waiting, of patient training, of last-minute commercial bargaining, of sleepless nights and long, un-ending afternoons around the scrabble Board, the ping-pong table and the sun terrace. The Scotland squad went deathless quiet that week, upset by the publicity, aggrieved by the amount of sponsored money they were missing, unsure of their global status.

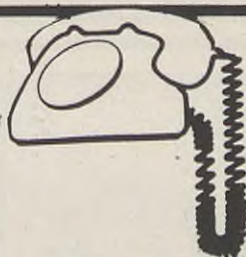
