## MANAGER ANGE POSTECOGLOU

Angelos "Ange" Postecoglou is a Greek-Australian former football player and coach. Joined Celtic as manager on 10th June 2021. Postecoglou, who previously managed the Australia national team, is one of the most successful Australian club coaches with two premierships, four championships and a continental title. Athens born "Ange" emigrated to Australia via a boat aged 5 in 1970. He spent nearly his entire playing football career at South Melbourne, youth between 1978 and 1983, senior between 1983 and 1993 as a defender. His managerial statistics show an impressive 50.0% win ratio from a total of 448 games.

Ange Postecoglou made it two wins from two as Celtic manager after the Hoops defeated Charlton Athletic with another impressive pre-season performance. Karamoko Dembele gave Celtic a thoroughly deserved lead midway through the first half and Albion Ajeti doubled the lead just before the break. Celtic dominated the game from start to

finish but Charlton managed to claw a goal back through Conor Washington.

Reflecting on his goal, Karamoko said: "When the ball came in, I thought just to gamble in there to see if I could get the ball, and obviously it worked out well for me and I scored the goal.



## CITY'S CELTIC CONNECTIONS

It is perhaps surprising that today appears to be the first time our Clubs have met but there are some notable connections.



### DARIUSZ 'JACKI' DZIEKANOWSKI

In January 1992, manager Jimmy Lumsden signed Poland international Dziekanowski from Celtic for a then Club record fee of £250,000. Straight into the team against Southend United, he misses a glorious chance to open the scoring after one minute but goes on to endear himself with City fans with his skilful crowd-pleasing display and an equalising goal on 67 minutes. One week later City travel to Leicester City in the fourth round of the FA Cup, where Jacki would leave an indelible impression. The Bristol Evening Post headline after City's 2-1 Cup win was, 'City's Pole Star Such A Dazzler' and the BBC's John Motson commentating said, 'He may come from another country but at times it looked as if he was from a different planet.' Jacki stayed for one and half seasons during which he was in and out of the team and he left for Legia Warsaw after making 43 league appearances, scoring seven goals.

### PAUL HARTLEY

A £1.1 million signing for Celtic, Hartley was a key player in midfield as they won



their third Scottish League Championship in a row in 2007/08. City snapped him up on his release in 2009 and he had a very successful 2009/10 season with us with his commanding displays in mid-field. City wished to keep him but he desired to return to his native Scotland and he joined Aberdeen in 2010 after making 40 league appearances, scoring five goals.



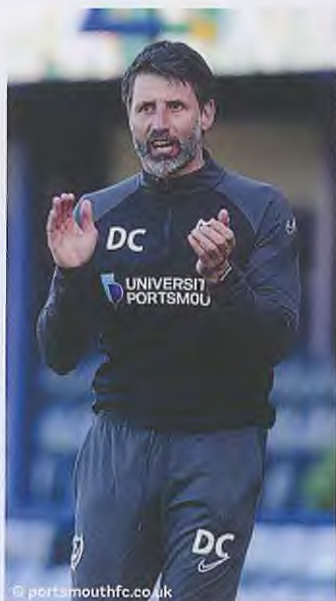
### STEPHEN PEARSON

Born in Lanark, Pearson realised his childhood dream when he signed for Celtic in 2004 becoming Young Player of the Year. Manager Derek McInnes brought him to Bristol City from Derby County on 4th November 2011. He scored a debut goal the following day in the 3-1 home win over Burnley. His stay with us was injury-hit and he left in the summer of 2004 to join Kerala Blasters. He had made 36 league appearances, scoring three goals.

## HEAD COACH DANNY COWLEY

42 year old Danny Cowley former manager of Lincoln City and Huddersfield Town signed for Pompey on the 19th of March 2021, as head coach on a contract until the end of the 2020–21 season, with his brother Nicky once again joining as his assistant. In his first game in charge at the club, Portsmouth would come from behind to beat Ipswich Town 2–1. On the 11th of May 2021, after overseeing 6 wins in 12 matches in charge, Cowley signed a new “long term” deal with the club.

Playing as a midfielder he also spent time with non-League clubs, including Barking, Romford, AFC Hornchurch and Brentwood Town, before his career was ended by injury in 2007. Shortly after that, he was offered the assistant manager’s job at Concord Rangers.

Pompey recovered from an interval deficit to win their first 'public' pre-season friendly of the summer at neighbours Havant & Waterlooville.

Ryan Tunnicliffe was on target for his new club, but fine strikes from Tommy Wright and James Roberts put the National League South hosts into the ascendency.

It was a different story in the second half, however, as one of the Blues' many trialists hit a hat-trick, while Reeco

Hackett-Fairchild was also on target.

There was a minute's applause held before kick-off in memory of former Fratton favourite Paul Mariner, who passed away the previous day at the age of 68.

It was a strange sight to see so many fans inside a football ground again, with Pompey supporters making up a large percentage of the attendance.





## TUESDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL, POINTS SHARED

Our competitive record against Pompey is Won 22, Drawn 18, Lost 14. We last met in the FA Cup in January this calendar year when City emerged 2-1 winners. Our last league meetings were in 2011/12; both nil-nil draws. So we will look back to 2010/11 when the clubs shared the points on offer.

### PORTSMOUTH 3-1 BRISTOL CITY

Both Clubs had made a poor start to the season. As a result of this game Portsmouth were 21st in the table and Bristol City 23rd. After a goalless first half Pompey took the lead through John Utaka but two minutes later Albert Adomah supplied the ball for Jon Stead to open his account for City. Stead was in his first of three seasons with City, in which he would make 79 league appearances, scoring 20 goals. Aaron Mokoena restored Pompey's lead on the hour mark and Hayden Mullins scored their clincher in injury time.

### BRISTOL CITY 2-1 PORTSMOUTH

Future City manager Steve Cotterill brought his Pompey side to this game on a six-game winning streak with 50 points, seven off a play-offs. City were on 44 points, 10 off the relegation zone. But City were on a mini-charge of their own and this would be their fourth straight win. Albert Adomah opened the scoring, playing a clever one-two with David Clarkson before steering the ball home. There were anxious glances when City's Damion Stewart kicked the ball against his arm but penalty appeals were waved away. Greg Halford then turned Nicky Maynard's cross into his own net to give City breathing space, which they were to need as Pompey's Dave Kitson scored their consolation in added time.

A curious Club record was equalled 35 minutes into the game by Pompey's keeper Jamie Ashdown. It was for post-war league minutes played without conceding a goal. Only five minutes had been added when Adomah struck his goal to leave the record standing at 636.



## MANAGER RUSSELL MARTIN

On the 3rd of November 2019, following the departure of manager Paul Tisdale, Martin was announced as the new permanent first-team manager of League One club Milton Keynes Dons - the club he had joined as a player earlier in the year.

35 year old Martin a former defender who played for Lewes, Wycombe Wanderers, Peterborough United, Norwich City, Glasgow Rangers, Walsall and MK Dons, amassed 503 senior appearances and scoring 27 goals.

Russell Martin played for his national team Scotland on 29 occasions between 2011 and 2017.

His current win ratio as manager of MK Dons is 37.97% having managed 79 games.

## HISTORY

Milton-Keynes Dons, usually abbreviated to MK Dons was founded in 2004, following Wimbledon F.C.'s controversial relocation to Milton Keynes from south London, when it adopted its present name, badge and home colours.

Initially based at the National Hockey Stadium, the club competed as Milton Keynes Dons from the start of the 2004–05 season. After two

seasons in League One, they were relegated to League Two in 2006. The club moved to their current ground, Stadium MK, for the 2007–08 season, in which they won the League Two title and the Football League Trophy under the management of Paul Ince. After seven further seasons in League One, the club won promotion to the Championship in 2015 under the management of Karl Robinson; however, they were relegated back to League One after one season.

## CIDEREDS NEW SIGNINGS



**ROB ATKINSON** has joined Bristol City from Oxford United for an undisclosed fee, putting pen to paper on a three-year contract with the option of a further year.

The centre-back was ever-present for the U's last season and impressed supporters as he went on to be named in the PFA League One Team of the Year and Sky Bet League One Team of the Season.

The 22-year-old helped his side reach the play-offs but, despite getting on the scoresheet himself, Atkinson's side were beaten by eventual winners Blackpool over two legs.



**ANDY KING** has signed a one-year contract with City – the club he has supported since he was a boy.

The midfielder, who was a free agent and had been training with the squad in pre-season has now been awarded a 12-month contract, with an additional one-year option, as Nigel Pearson prepares his squad for the 2021/22 campaign. King and Pearson are reunited after the manager and player worked together at Leicester City and he told Robins TV: "I'm absolutely buzzing to be here, I can't wait to get started. The hard work has started already but it's been good, I've loved it."



**MATTY JAMES** has joined City on a three-year deal. The midfielder arrives in BS3 as a free agent after nine years at Leicester City.

Twenty-nine-year-old James started his career with Manchester United before joining the Foxes in July 2012. He went on to make 115 appearances for Leicester, including helping them win the Championship title in 2013/14.

He has subsequently had two loan spells at Barnsley, in 2016/17 and last season, before finishing the campaign with Coventry City. The midfielder featured 24 times for the Sky Blues in all competitions, scoring three goals and helped them to a 16th place finish in the Championship.
