Donald Mackay says . . .

Since the last programme we have had mixed fortunes with a very good result against St Mirren and a disappointing result against Morton. Although St Mirren had the majority of the ball we kept plugging away and finished with our best result of the season so far. It was a different story at Greenock last Saturday where the effort was still very good from the team, but a certain incident, which I will cover later, upset the rhythm of the players and we finished on the wrong side of a 2-0 result. The incident which I refer to was the sending off of Albert Kidd – an incident which should never have happened. The player has been disciplined by the Club which is normal procedure in such cases. This is something about which I feel very strongly, as players must be made

aware of their responsibilities on and off the field of play, both to Dundee Football Club and their supporters. The player himself has asked me to apologise on his behalf to the supporters who travelled to Greenock on Saturday for allowing himself to become involved in a situation which ended in his being sent off.

But back to today and a warm welcome is extended to our visitors from Parkhead. Celtic are always an exciting team to play at any time of the season, but as this is our first encounter with them this season, it makes it even more interesting. Their reputation for always playing attacking football can only be good for the game and it is a pity more clubs do not follow this example. I, personally, have many fond memories of Celtic encounters in which I have been involved in the past and I trust that today's match will be one we will all want to remember in the future.

As is normal with Celtic games, we are anticipating a large crowd today and I know I speak for everyone at Dens Park when I say we hope it will be a trouble-free afternoon regardless of the result.

The reserves continue on their winning way with a 2-0 result against Kilmarnock last Saturday and are currently top of their section in the Reserve League Cup.

OUR VISITORS

Pat Bonner, the talented young man in the Celtic goal, came to Parkhead from Keadue Rovers in Donegal three years ago and since he broke into the first team, this youngster, who stands an inch over six feet, has become one of the fastest 'keepers in the league. Another youngster who has set a lot of heather on fire in the past year is striker **Charlie Nicholas**, a produce of Celtic Boys' Club, who became a senior only two years ago, and made his impact at the top level very quickly. Another young man who came from the same stable as Charlie at about the same time is defender **Mark Reid** who has also made a quick and effective breakthrough to top class soccer.

The youngsters benefit greatly from the experience of Celtic and Scotland skipper **Danny McGrain** who went to Parkhead from Maryhill Juniors 14 years ago and has overcome more than one crisis in his star-studded career. Central defender **Roy Aitken** is another Celtic B.C. product who has been six years

at Parkhead. Alongside him is **Tom McAdam**, who became a senior with Dumbarton and was two seasons with United before moving to Celtic. **Murdo MacLeod** is a midfielder with a cannonball shot who joined Celtic direct from Dumbarton for a six-figure fee. Another six-figure-fee man is **Davie Provan** who moved from Kilmarnock three years ago and is now an exciting and entertaining winger for Celtic and Scotland.

Dom Sullivan was with Clyde when Billy McNeill took him to Aberdeen. After the manager's move to Parkhead, Dom followed.

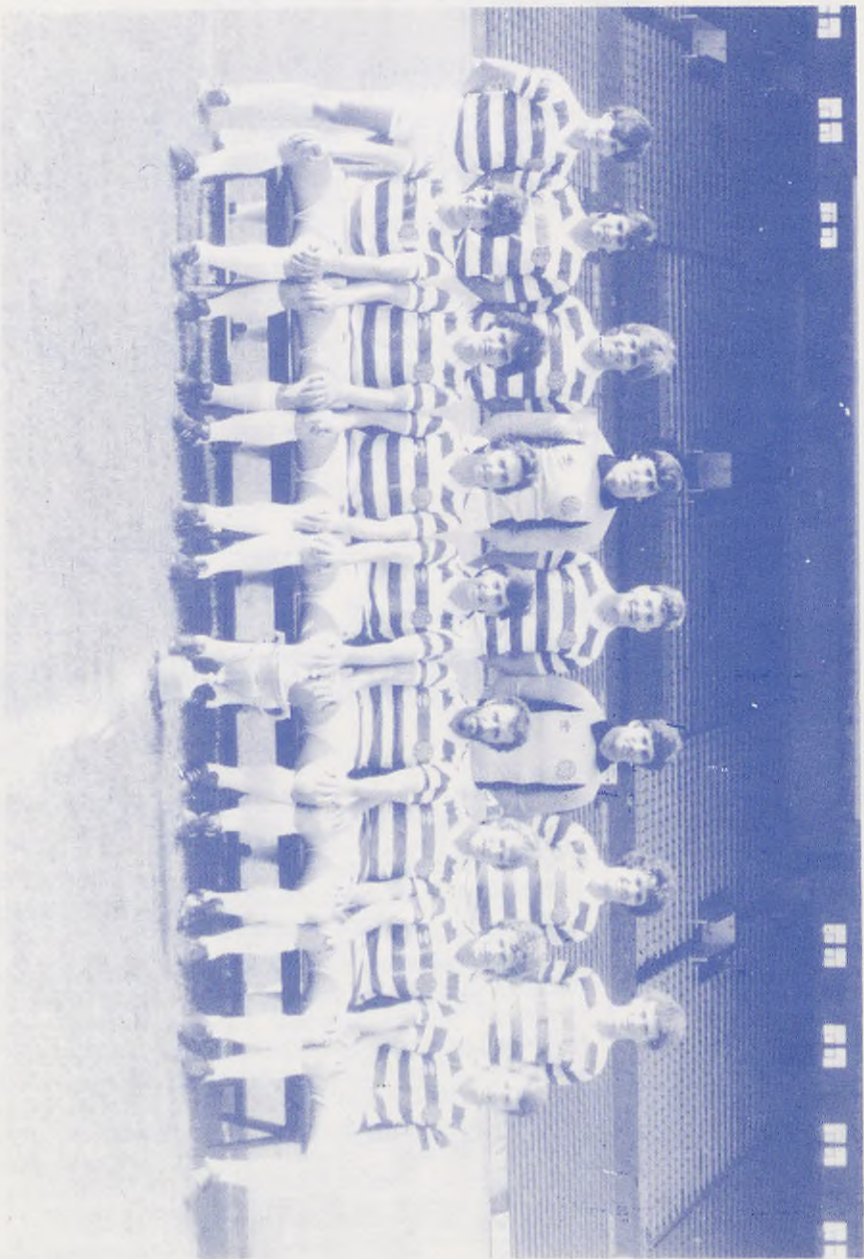
Frank McGarvey, another high-scoring striker developed by St Mirren, spent a year with Liverpool before coming back to Scotland for around a quarter of a million pounds and by contrast, **Tommy Burns** was signed from Maryhill six years ago and developed his skills at Parkhead. **George McCluskey**, who started the season with a stream of goals, is another who came from Celtic B.C. six years ago.

From The Record Book

Dundee's most outstanding success against Celtic in recent years was at Dens Park on April 19th, 1980. Celtic took an early lead through Aitken, but home goals by Iain Ferguson (2), Fleming, Sinclair and Mackie gave the Dark Blues a shock 5-1 win. Celtic had only 11 days to wait for some measure of revenge when they returned to Dens on April 30th and won 2-0 with goals from

Mike Conroy and Dom Sullivan.

The first game at Parkhead that season was won 3-0 by Celtic with MacLeod (pen.) and McAdam (2) the scorers. In the second Parkhead meeting on February 23rd, Dundee snatched a late point when Aitken scored an own goal. McCluskey and MacLeod got goals for Celtic and Dundee's first score was by Jimmy Murphy.

Last close season we were pleased to have a visit from Mr Alex Longair whilst on holiday from Canada. Alex's father William (Plum) Longair played for East End F.C. up to 1893 when that Club amalgMted with Our Boys F.C. to form the original Dundee Football Club. Mr Longair has been tracing his father's football career and in a recent letter to the Club has reminded us of the bankruptcy that forced the original Dundee Football Club to disband in early December, 1898. In the event, only one

game, against Celtic, was not played, for the clubs of the Scorrish Football League rallied round and guaranteed Dundee £25 per game. On 20th December, 1898, at a public meeting, the present company was formed.
